3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
7	maintenance of the Secretary of State for the fiscal year
8	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
9	\$ 12,062,675.00.
LO	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L1	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
L2	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available

21	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
22	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
23	Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
24	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
25	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
26	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
27	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
28	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
29	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
30	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
31	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
32	Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the

- be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 61
- 62 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office
- 63 of the Secretary of State that are authorized by the Mississippi
- 64 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or
- 65 regulations that implement state or federal law.
- SECTION 5. No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be 66
- 67 used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any
- 68 clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy, or other person who may be

- 69 related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by 70 the rules of the civil law, to the official employing or having the right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of 71 72 any such payment, then the official or person approving and making 73 or receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to 74 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State 75 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received, to 76 be recovered at suit of the Attorney General; provided that when 77 the relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the 78 relationship was established is dead, this provision shall not 79 apply.
- SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
  act, the Secretary of State may use funds appropriated for the
  purposes of defraying litigation expenses associated with the
  enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act, the Regulation of
  Charitable Solicitations Act, and the administration of the Public
  Trust.
- 86 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
  87 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
  88 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
  89 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
  90 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
  91 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
  92 performance measures provided below:

- 118 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 119 act, no more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is provided for paying principal and interest on bond issues for 120 121 county voting systems.
- 122 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 123 act, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,750,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 124 125 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit 126 of the Land Records Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of making 127 distributions to local governments for taxes owed during the 128 fiscal year.
- 129 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 130 act, Four Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 131 (\$4,250,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 132 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit 133 of the Elections Support Fund, for the purpose of acquiring, 134 upgrading, maintaining, or repairing voting equipment, systems, and supplies, hiring temporary technical support, conducting 135 136 elections using such voting equipment or systems and training 137 election officials during the fiscal year.
- 138 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 139 act, Eleven Million Four Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Two Hundred 140 Forty-seven Dollars (\$11,455,247.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 141 to the credit of the Public Trust Tidelands Fund, and is 142

145 It is the intention of the Legislature that SECTION 12. whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 146 147 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 148 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 149 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 150 151 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 152 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2023.

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
