SENATE BILL NO. 3049

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 4 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Secretary of State for the fiscal year 7 8 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024..... 9\$ 12,062,675.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available 12 13 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Secretary of State for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending 14 June 30, 2024.....\$ 17,420,640.00. 15 16 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the following positions are authorized: 17 18 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

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20 Time-Limited:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 21 22 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 23 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds 24 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi 25 26 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 27 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 28 29 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 30 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 31 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 32 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 33 34 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 35 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 36 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

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Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

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No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

60 SECTION 4. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall 61 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 62 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Office 63 of the Secretary of State that are authorized by the Mississippi 64 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or 65 regulations that implement state or federal law.

66 **SECTION 5.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be 67 used, either directly or indirectly, for the purpose of paying any 68 clerk, stenographer, assistant, deputy, or other person who may be

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69 related by blood or marriage within the third degree, computed by 70 the rules of the civil law, to the official employing or having the right of employment or selection thereof; and in the event of 71 72 any such payment, then the official or person approving and making 73 or receiving such payment shall be jointly and severally liable to 74 return to the State of Mississippi and to pay into the State 75 Treasury three (3) times any such amount so paid or received, to 76 be recovered at suit of the Attorney General; provided that when 77 the relationship is by affinity and the person through whom the 78 relationship was established is dead, this provision shall not 79 apply.

80 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 81 act, the Secretary of State may use funds appropriated for the 82 purposes of defraying litigation expenses associated with the 83 enforcement of the Mississippi Securities Act, the Regulation of 84 Charitable Solicitations Act, and the administration of the Public 85 Trust.

SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

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118 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 119 act, no more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is 120 provided for paying principal and interest on bond issues for 121 county voting systems.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this act, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,750,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Land Records Maintenance Fund, for the purpose of making distributions to local governments for taxes owed during the fiscal year.

129 SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 130 act, Four Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 131 (\$4,250,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 132 appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit 133 of the Elections Support Fund, for the purpose of acquiring, 134 upgrading, maintaining, or repairing voting equipment, systems, and supplies, hiring temporary technical support, conducting 135 136 elections using such voting equipment or systems and training 137 election officials during the fiscal year.

138 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 139 act, Eleven Million Four Hundred Fifty-five Thousand Two Hundred 140 Forty-seven Dollars (\$11,455,247.00), or so much thereof as may be 141 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury 142 to the credit of the Public Trust Tidelands Fund, and is

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145 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 146 147 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 148 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 149 150 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 151 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 152 made without competitive bids.

153 **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 154 155 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 156 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 157 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 158 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 159 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after 160 161 June 30, 2023.
