SENATE BILL NO. 3052

1 AN ACT MAKING A REAPPROPRIATION TO CERTAIN AGENCIES TO
2 REAUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF CORONAVIRUS STATE FISCAL RECOVERY
3 FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR
4 2024.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 **SECTION 1.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
7 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
8 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
9 Office of Workforce Development, with the Department of Employment
10 Security serving as the fiscal agent, as authorized in House Bill
11 No. 1517, 2022 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July
12 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 58,693,659.00.

13 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
14 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
15 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
16 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
17 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
18 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1517, 2022 Regular
19 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.



20 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
21 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
22 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
23 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, as authorized in Senate
24 Bill No. 3018, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of defraying
25 eligible expenses in connection with the Coronavirus Disease 2019
26 (COVID-19) as allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue
27 Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by
28 the United States Department of the Treasury in conformity
29 therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
30 June 30, 2024.....\$ 2,582,029.00.

31 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
32 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
33 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
34 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
35 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
36 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3018, 2022 Regular
37 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

38 **SECTION 3.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
39 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
40 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
41 Department of Environmental Quality, as authorized in Senate Bill
42 No. 3056, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of administering
43 the Mississippi Municipality and County Water Infrastructure
44 (MCWI) Grant Program established in Senate Bill No. 2822, 2022



45 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and
46 ending June 30, 2024..... \$ 445,000,000.00.

47 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
48 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
49 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
50 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
51 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
52 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3056, 2022 Regular
53 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

54 **SECTION 4.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
55 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
56 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
57 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized in House
58 Bill No. 1518, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing
59 funds to destination marketing organizations to assist in paying
60 costs of certain marketing activities, providing assistance to
61 nonprofit museums, and providing funds to Mississippi Main Street
62 Association, as provided in House Bill No. 453, 2022 Regular
63 Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
64 June 30, 2024..... \$ 13,705,225.00.

65 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
66 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
67 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
68 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
69 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made



70 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1518, 2022 Regular
71 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

72 **SECTION 5.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
73 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Mississippi
74 Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (MAICU) Grant
75 Program Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of
76 Finance and Administration, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 3064,
77 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding the MAICU Grant
78 Program established in Senate Bill No. 2700, 2022 Regular Session,
79 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
80 June 30, 2024..... \$ 10,000,000.00.

81 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
82 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
83 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
84 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
85 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
86 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3064, 2022 Regular
87 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

88 **SECTION 6.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
89 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
90 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
91 Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized in Senate
92 Bill No. 3064, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding
93 the Independent Schools Infrastructure Grant Program established



94 in Senate Bill No. 2780, 2022 Regular Session, for the fiscal year
95 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
96 June 30, 2024.....\$ 10,000,000.00.

97 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
98 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
99 section as of June 30, 2023, shall not exceed the unexpended
100 balance of the funds remaining from the amount authorized for the
101 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
102 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3064, 2022 Regular
103 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

104 **SECTION 7.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
105 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
106 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
107 Department of Finance and Administration Bureau of Building,
108 Grounds, and Real Property Management, as authorized in Senate
109 Bill No. 3062, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of completing
110 capital projects at state-owned buildings or grounds that are
111 allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of
112 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by the United
113 States Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the
114 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
115 June 30, 2024..... \$ 216,813,639.00.

116 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
117 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
118 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds



119 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
120 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
121 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3062, 2022 Regular

131 the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year
132 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
133 June 30, 2024.....\$ 2,500,000.00.

134 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
135 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
136 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
137 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
138 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
139 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1614, 2022 Regular
140 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

146 Hospital Expanded Capacity Program established in Senate Bill No.
147 2820, 2022 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
148 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 12,000,000.00.

149 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
150 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
151 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
152 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
153 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
154 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3060, 2022 Regular
155 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

156 **SECTION 10.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
157 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus

166 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
167 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
168 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the



169 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
170 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3060, 2022 Regular
171 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

172 **SECTION 11.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
173 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus

181 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
182 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
183 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
184 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
185 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
186 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1538, 2022 Regular
187 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

188 **SECTION 12.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
189 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus

191 Department of Child Protection Services, as authorized in House
192 Bill No. 1611, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of defraying
193 eligible operational expenses as allowable under Section 9901 of



194 the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or
195 regulation issued by the United States Department of the Treasury
196 in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
197 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 57,600,000.00.

198 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
199 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
200 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
201 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
202 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
203 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1611, 2022 Regular
204 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

205 **SECTION 13.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
206 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
207 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
208 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, as
209 authorized in House Bill No. 1521, 2022 Regular Session, for the
210 purpose of providing funding for the Nursing and Respiratory
211 Therapy Education Incentive Program created in House Bill No.
212 1005, 2022 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
213 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 6,000,000.00.

214 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
215 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
216 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
217 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
218 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made



219 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1521, 2022 Regular
220 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

221 **SECTION 14.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
222 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
223 State Fiscal Recovery Lost Revenue Fund not otherwise
224 appropriated, to the University of Mississippi Medical Center, as
225 authorized in Senate Bill No. 3010, 2022 Regular Session, for the
226 purpose of constructing a new nursing school at the University of
227 Mississippi Medical Center as allowable under Section 9901 of the
228 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or
229 regulation issued by the United States Department of the Treasury
230 in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
231 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 55,000,000.00.

232 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
233 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
234 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
235 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
236 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
237 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3010, 2022 Regular
238 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

239 **SECTION 15.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
240 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus

242 Department of Mental Health, as authorized in Senate Bill No.
243 2865, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of assisting with



244 behavioral and mental health needs exacerbated by the Coronavirus
245 Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, responding to other public
246 health impacts, and other operational expenses as allowed under
247 Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any
248 guidance or regulation issued by the United States Department of
249 the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year
250 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
251 June 30, 2024.....\$ 80,600,000.00.

252 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
253 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
254 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
255 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
256 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
257 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 2865, 2022 Regular
258 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

259 **SECTION 16.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
260 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
261 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
262 Department of Mental Health, as authorized in Senate Bill No.
263 2865, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing funding
264 to the Department of Mental Health, which shall be utilized at
265 Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) or for the benefit of
266 CMHCs to allow for investments in software, databases,
267 telemedicine capabilities, and other information technology
268 resources that support behavioral and mental health needs



269 exacerbated by the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic,
270 responding to other public health impacts, and other operational
271 expenses as allowed under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan
272 Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by the
273 United States Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith,
274 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
275 June 30, 2024.....\$ 18,250,000.00.

276 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
277 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this

288 projects at state-owned buildings or grounds, crime prevention due
289 to the increase in crime, and operational expenditures necessary
290 to respond to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic as allowable
291 under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA)
292 or any guidance or regulation issued by the United States



293 Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal
294 year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
295 June 30, 2024.....\$ 15,535,000.00.

296 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
297 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
298 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
299 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
300 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
301 for the purposes authorized in Senate Bill No. 3014, 2022 Regular
302 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

303 **SECTION 18.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
304 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus

307 House Bill No. 1542, 2022 Regular Session, and amended in Senate
308 Bill No. 2664, 2023 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing
309 funds for the Mississippi Law Enforcement and Fire Fighters
310 Premium Pay Program as created in House Bill No. 1427, 2022
311 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and
312 ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 5,500,000.00.

313 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
314 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
315 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
316 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
317 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made



318 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1542, 2022 Regular
319 Session, as amended by Senate Bill No. 2664, 2023 Regular Session,
320 and is subject to the same conditions therein.

321 **SECTION 19.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
322 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
323 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
324 District Attorney's and staff, as authorized in House Bill No.
325 1625, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding additional
326 salaries and office expenses of temporary legal assistants and
327 support personnel as authorized by Section 25-31-5(2)(g),
328 Mississippi Code of 1972, necessary to respond to the effects of
329 the COVID-19 pandemic as allowable under Section 9901 of the
330 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or
331 regulation issued by the United States Department of the Treasury
332 in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
333 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 662,486.00.

334 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
335 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
336 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
337 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
338 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
339 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1625, 2022 Regular
340 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

341 **SECTION 20.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
342 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus



343 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
344 Office of the State Public Defender, as authorized in House Bill
345 No. 1627, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding
346 additional salaries and office expenses for public defenders
347 assigned to special temporary courts that supplement those
348 authorized under Section 9-7-25, Mississippi Code of 1972,
349 necessary to respond to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic as
350 allowable under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of
351 2021 (ARPA) or any guidance or regulation issued by the United
352 States Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the
353 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
354 June 30, 2024.....\$ 172,621.00.

355 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
356 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
357 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
358 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
359 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
360 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1627, 2022 Regular
361 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

362 **SECTION 21.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
363 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
364 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
365 Supreme Court - Trial Judges, as authorized in House Bill No.
366 1628, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of providing temporary
367 Special Judges to help alleviate the backlog of adoption cases in



368 Child Protection Services, and operational expenditures necessary
369 to respond to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic as allowable
370 under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA)
371 or any guidance or regulation issued by the United States
372 Department of the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal
373 year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
374 June 30, 2024.....\$ 1,500,000.00.

375 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
376 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
377 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
378 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
379 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
380 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1628, 2022 Regular
381 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

382 **SECTION 22.** The following sum, or so much of it as may be
383 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus
384 State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the
385 Supreme Court - Trial Judges, as authorized in House Bill No.
386 1628, 2022 Regular Session, for the purpose of funding additional
387 special temporary courts that supplement those authorized under
388 Section 9-7-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, necessary to respond to
389 the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic as allowable under Section
390 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) or any
391 guidance or regulation issued by the United States Department of



392 the Treasury in conformity therewith, for the fiscal year
393 beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
394 June 30, 2024.....\$ 1,727,683.00.

395 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
396 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
397 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
398 remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the
399 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation is made
400 for the purposes authorized in House Bill No. 1628, 2022 Regular
401 Session, and is subject to the same conditions therein.

402 **SECTION 23.** None of the funds reappropriated in this act
403 shall be used to pay employee premium payments, with the exception
404 of the funds reappropriated in Section 18.

405 **SECTION 24.** (1) As used in this section, the term "agency"
406 shall mean the entities in which funds were reappropriated in
407 Sections 1 through 22 of this act.

408 (2) The agency shall not disburse any funds provided under
409 this section to any recipient without first: (a) making an
410 individualized determination that the reimbursement sought is, in
411 the agency's independent judgment, for necessary expenditures
412 eligible under Section 602 of the federal Social Security Act as
413 added by Section 9901 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
414 2021 (ARPA) and its implementing guidelines, guidance, rules,
415 regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended or
416 supplemented from time to time, by the United States Department of



417 the Treasury; and (b) determining that the recipient has not
418 received and will not receive reimbursement for the expense in
419 question from any source of funds, including insurance proceeds,
420 other than those funds provided under Section 602 of the federal
421 Social Security Act as added by Section 9901 of ARPA. In
422 addition, the agency shall ensure that all funds provided under
423 this section are disbursed in compliance with the Single Audit Act
424 (31 USC Sections 7501-7507) and the related provisions of the
425 Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR Section 200.303 regarding internal
426 controls, Sections 200.330 through 200.332 regarding sub-recipient
427 monitoring and management, and subpart F regarding audit
428 requirements.

429 (3) As a condition of receiving and expending the funds
430 provided to the agency under this section, the agency shall
431 certify to the Department of Finance and Administration that each
432 expenditure of the funds provided to the agency under this section
433 complies with the guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or
434 other criteria, as may be amended from time to time, of the United
435 States Department of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from
436 the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by ARPA.

437 (4) If the Office of Inspector General of the United States
438 Department of the Treasury, or the Office of Inspector General of
439 any other federal agency having oversight over the use of monies
440 from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by
441 ARPA (a) determines that the agency or recipient has expended or



442 otherwise used any of the funds provided to the agency under this
443 section for any purpose that is not in compliance with the
444 guidelines, guidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as
445 may be amended from time to time, of the United States Department
446 of the Treasury regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus
447 State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the ARPA, and (b) the
448 State of Mississippi is required to repay the federal government
449 for any of those funds that the Office of the Inspector General
450 determined were expended or otherwise used improperly by the
451 agency or recipient, then the agency or recipient that expended or
452 otherwise used those funds improperly shall be required to pay the
453 amount of those funds to the State of Mississippi for repayment to
454 the federal government.

455 **SECTION 25.** The money appropriated by this act shall be paid
456 by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to
457 the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act,
458 upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State
459 Fiscal Officer shall issue his or her warrants upon requisitions
460 signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner
461 provided by law.

462 **SECTION 26.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
463 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after
464 June 30, 2023.
