SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 501

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMENDING THE 2 LIFE AND PUBLIC SERVICE OF FORMER CHIEF OF THE MISSISSIPPI HIGHWAY 3 PATROL AND COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND FORMER SERGEANT AT 4 ARMS OF THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE DAVID RICHARD HUGGINS AND EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE ON HIS PASSING. 5 6 WHEREAS, the Legislature and the State of Mississippi lost a 7 wonderful friend, colleague, gentleman and effective law 8 enforcement officer with the passing of former Chief of the 9 Mississippi Highway Patrol, Commissioner of Public Safety and 10 former Sergeant at Arms of the Mississippi Senate, David Richard Huggins, who passed away on August 10, 2022, at age 74. David was 11 12 an outstanding law enforcement officer and leader in the 13 administration of operations in the executive and legislative 14 branches of Mississippi government and was instrumental in the 15 political careers of numerous public servants; and

16 WHEREAS, David Huggins was born in Corinth, Mississippi, and 17 attended Biggersville High School. He then went on to attend 18 Northeast Mississippi Junior College and later attended, through 19 the University of Southern Mississippi, Forensics at Scotland Yard 20 located in London, England; and

21 WHEREAS, David started his career in the 1960s with the 22 Alcorn County Sheriff's Department before becoming a State 23 Trooper. On June 9, 1969, David graduated from The Mississippi 24 Highway Patrol Academy Class #27 and was assigned to Tunica, 25 Mississippi; and

26 WHEREAS, David married Judy Monroe on June 28, 1969, and they 27 were married for 53 years; and

28 WHEREAS, David and Judy also lived in Senatobia, Jackson, 29 Corinth and Brandon. From 1988 through 1992 David served as the 30 Chief of the Mississippi Highway Patrol. From 2000 through 2004 31 David served as the Commissioner of the Department of Public 32 Safety under Governor Ronnie Musgrove; and

33 WHEREAS, after his service as Commissioner of the Mississippi 34 Department of Public Safety, David was Sergeant at Arms for the 35 Mississippi Senate from 2004 to 2008. He then became Chief 36 Investigator for the State Auditor's Office in 2008; and

WHEREAS, David loved all types of recreation, whether it was camping, water skiing or planning his grandkids' birthday parties on the back deck. David also loved the Highway Patrol and embraced the politics involved. On March 28, 2010, Governor Haley Barbour signed H.B. 1159, to be known as the "David R. Huggins Act." This bill ensured Mississippi Highway Patrol Troopers were compensated for all the hours they worked; and
