SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 518

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE
2 STARKVILLE HIGH SCHOOL "YELLOWJACKETS" FOOTBALL TEAM AND HEAD
3 COACH CHRIS JONES FOR WINNING THE MHSAA CLASS 6A STATE FOOTBALL
4 CHAMPIONSHIP.

5 WHEREAS, on December 3, 2022, the Starkville High School
6 "Yellowjackets" football team lead by Quarterback Trey Petty
7 defeated Brandon 48-32 in Hattiesburg to win the MHSAA Class 6A
8 State Championship. This game secured for Starkville its first
9 State Title since 2015; and

10 WHEREAS, there was little the Brandon Bulldogs could do to
11 slow down the Yellowjackets Quarterback Trey Petty, a superstar
12 junior. It didn't help Brandon (12-2) that Petty's top receiver
13 Braylon Burnside, a four-star Class of 2023 prospect, played one
14 of his best games; and

15 WHEREAS, the Yellowjackets victory started midway through the
16 first quarter when Petty led a nine-play, 47-yard drive to give
17 Starkville (12-3) a 7-0 lead. The drive was capped by Petty's
18 1-yard rush. Midway through the second quarter, the Yellowjackets



19 went 82 yards on 12 plays with a 22-yard touchdown connection from
20 Petty to Burnside providing the final blow; and

21 WHEREAS, down 14-0, Brandon elected to take an aggressive
22 approach. Bulldogs Coach Sam Williams decided to go for a
23 fourth-and-12 near midfield. The play failed, and Starkville took
24 advantage of a short field for a crucial touchdown, another
25 one-yard rush from Petty, to go up 21-0 with 19 seconds left in
26 the half. Petty and Burnside wasted little time after halftime to
27 extend the lead. Starkville scored off a turnover on a touchdown
28 pass to Jaylon York to make the score 35-10 late in the third
29 quarter and put the game away; and

30 WHEREAS, the game was dedicated to Phillip Laster, Jr., a
31 17-year-old Brandon player who collapsed at practice on August 1,
32 and the Brandon helmets featured the initials "PL" representing
33 something more important than games won or lost; and
