## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 542

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE SIGNIFICANT PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE OF DR. ROY J. DUHE OF MADISON,
- 3 MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN COLON CANCER INITIATIVES AT
- 4 THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI MEDICAL CENTER (UMMC).
- 5 WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is the third most common cancer in
- 6 the United States and the second leading cause of death from
- 7 cancers that affect both men and women. Colorectal cancer affects
- 8 people in all racial and ethnic groups and is most common in
- 9 people age 50 and older; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Roy J. Duhe of Madison, Mississippi, who has a PhD
- 11 in Biochemistry, retired from UMMC as a Professor of Pharmacology
- 12 and Radiation Oncology and has been instrumental in colon cancer
- 13 initiatives in Mississippi that include:
- Mississippi Colon Cancer Roundtable (MSCCRT). In
- 15 association with the American Cancer Society, this program
- 16 organizes interested parties in the state to promote colon cancer
- 17 initiatives and promote quality care in Mississippi for colon
- 18 cancer; and

- The state license plate for colon cancer, which was the
- 20 first in the nation and helped fund work on colon cancer research;
- 21 and
- Started and worked tirelessly for the state initiative of
- 23 "70 by 2020" for colon cancer screening; and
- 24 WHEREAS, before his state initiative, the percentage of colon
- 25 cancer screening for eligible Mississippian's was 52%; however,
- 26 the national campaign was "80 by 2018." Recognizing the national
- 27 goal was unrealistic for Mississippi, Dr. Duhe initiated "70 by
- 28 20." Since that initiative and through hard work by Dr. Duhe and
- 29 his staff, the percentage in Mississippi is now over 70%. The
- 30 rise in numbers has a profound effect on Mississippians and their
- 31 health; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month is observed in
- 33 March to highlight the importance of screening for colorectal
- 34 cancer, as well as to promote healthy lifestyle habits that can
- 35 decrease a person's risk of developing the three distinct cancer
- 36 types referred to collectively as colon cancer; and
- 37 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize a dedicated
- 38 local Mississippi scientist whose research and patient screening
- 39 have had a strong, positive impact on the health of
- 40 Mississippians:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 42 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 43 we do hereby recognize and commend the significant public health

- 44 service of Dr. Roy J. Duhe of Madison, Mississippi, who was
- 45 instrumental in colon cancer initiatives at the University of
- 46 Mississippi Medical Center, and thank Dr. Duhe and his family for
- 47 their dedication.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the State Board of Health
- 49 continue to disseminate public information regarding the danger of
- 50 colon cancer and the importance of screening.
- 51 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 52 Dr. Duhe and his family, forwarded to the Dean of UMMC and made
- 53 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
