SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 551

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION HONORING THE LEGACY OF DECORATED  
2 WORLD WAR II CORPORAL L.C. JACKSON, 3449TH QUARTERMASTER TRUCK  
3 COMPANY, UNITED STATES ARMY, OF BROOKHAVEN, MISSISSIPPI, ON THE  
4 OCCASION OF HIS 100TH BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION.

5 WHEREAS, World War II Veteran L.C. Jackson was born on March  
6 8, 1923, in Minter City, Mississippi, and will celebrate his 100th  
7 Birthday on March 8, 2023, with family and friends; and

8 WHEREAS, at the time when the world would ask ordinary men to  
9 do extraordinary things, Mr. Jackson selflessly answered the call  
10 to duty as a member of the Greatest Generation. L.C. served  
11 during a time when the military was still segregated; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson is the fourth of seven children of  
13 George and Caroline Jackson. He attended school in Glendora,  
14 Mississippi; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson was inducted into the United States Army  
16 in 1942 at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. He received his basic  
17 training at Fort Indiantown Gap, Pennsylvania, as a truck driver.  
18 Mr. Jackson was then sent overseas to the Philippines, Okinawa and  
19 Japan. Corporal Jackson received the Asiatic-Pacific Theater



20 Campaign Ribbon, the Army of Occupation Ribbon, the Japan Victory  
21 Ribbon, two Overseas Service Bars, a Rifle Marksmanship Medal and  
22 the Good Conduct Medal. He was honorably discharged at Fort Sam  
23 Houston, Texas, on November 25, 1946, and returned to Glendora,  
24 Mississippi; and

25 WHEREAS, L.C. then moved to Chicago, Illinois, where he met  
26 Bernice and the couple had three children. Mr. Jackson was  
27 employed with Greyhound Bus for two years and 31 years with the  
28 U.S. Post Office. He moved to Brookhaven, Mississippi, and was  
29 employed for two years at Brookhaven Sanitation Department. Mr.  
30 Jackson met Maxine in 1977 and they married in 1980; and

31 WHEREAS, Mr. Jackson is a Deacon at Hopewell Baptist Church  
32 in Brookhaven, Mississippi, and he will celebrate his 100th  
33 Birthday with his children, Ruben Jackson, Caroline Jackson and  
34 Bobby Dixon; and

35 WHEREAS, Colonel Jackson is a true American hero. He was a  
36 trailblazer who dared to be in the service during a time when  
37 African Americans were excluded from certain branches of service  
38 and occupations. Those servicemen should not be forgotten, and  
39 everyone should honor their sacrifice, and for this a grateful  
40 state thanks him for a life of selfless service and a legacy of a  
41 strong and free America:

42 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF  
43 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby honor the legacy of decorated World  
44 War II Corporal L.C. Jackson, 3449th Quartermaster Truck Company,



45 United States Army, of Brookhaven, Mississippi, extend the best  
46 wishes of the Legislature on his 100th Birthday, and extend to Mr.  
47 Jackson and his family the thanks of a grateful state.

48 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to  
49 Corporal Jackson and made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
