## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 553

- 1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MOURNING THE PASSING AND EXTENDING 2 THE DEEP AND HEARTFELT SYMPATHY OF THE MISSISSIPPI LEGISLATURE TO THE SURVIVING FAMILY OF ALBEN N. (AL) HOPKINS, SR., MAJOR GENERAL, MSARNG (RET.) AND COMMENDING HIS SERVICE AS MISSISSIPPI GAMING 3

- 5 COMMISSION CHAIR, VETERAN GULFPORT ATTORNEY AND CIVIC LEADER.
- 6 WHEREAS, it is with sadness that we note the passing of the
- 7 Chairman of the Mississippi Gaming Commission Alben N. (Al)
- 8 Hopkins, Sr., Major General, MSARNG (Ret.) who passed away on
- 9 February 12, 2023. He was born in Ripley, Mississippi, on
- 10 February 14, 1941, and was in his third term on the Mississippi
- Gaming Commission after being reconfirmed in 2022 by the 11
- 12 Mississippi Senate; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Hopkins chaired the commission during a time of
- 14 significant change for the gambling industry, with many states
- 15 easing rules on when and where gambling can take place and
- 16 legalizing sports betting; and
- 17 WHEREAS, a former Assistant Adjutant General of the
- Mississippi National Guard, Hopkins retired from the military with 18
- the rank of Major General. He founded his own law firm, Hopkins, 19

- 20 Barvié & Hopkins, in 1977 in Gulfport and served for 13 years as
- 21 Chief Judge of the Court of Military Appeals; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Al Hopkins attended Delta State University on a
- 23 basketball scholarship where he was a student leader and also
- 24 played on the baseball team under Bo Ferris, whom he always
- 25 admired. Alben was a member of the "M" Club among numerous other
- 26 organizations which included the Debate Team, Omicron Delta Kappa,
- 27 Pi Gamma Nu, Pi Kappa Delta Honor Societies, and the Kappa Alpha
- 28 Order Fraternity. He was chosen as Mr. Delta State and later
- 29 Alumnus of the Year. Alben established a scholarship at Delta
- 30 State University for qualifying high school students from Walnut,
- 31 Mississippi, and Tippah County to allow them an opportunity to get
- 32 a higher education. He was a 1963 graduate of Delta State
- 33 University, receiving bachelor's degrees in History and English.
- 34 In 1965, he received his juris doctorate from the University of
- 35 Mississippi School of Law. He later received a bachelor's degree
- 36 in Biblical Studies from William Carey University; and
- 37 WHEREAS, General Hopkins was a Major General in the
- 38 Mississippi National Guard who retired effective March 5, 1996.
- 39 General Hopkins entered military service in 1965 as an enlisted
- 40 man in the 31st Infantry Division. In 1970, he received a direct
- 41 commission to Captain. He was a graduate of the Judges Advocate
- 42 General's Career Course and General Staff School of the United
- 43 States Army, University of Virginia School of Law,
- 44 Charlottesville, Virginia. He served as Staff Judge Advocate for

- 45 Mississippi Emergency Operations Headquarters; Command and Control
- 46 Headquarters; Det. I STARC and Special Staff Judge Advocate to the
- 47 Adjutant General of the State of Mississippi. General Hopkins
- 48 served the last four years of his service as the Assistant
- 49 Adjutant General of the State of Mississippi. He was promoted to
- 50 Brigadier General with federal recognition effective March 11,
- 51 1993. In the position of Assistant Adjutant General (1992-1996),
- 52 General Hopkins served in many additional capacities; and
- 53 WHEREAS, Hopkins was a well-known member of many
- 54 organizations on the Gulf Coast, including Girl Scouts of Gulf
- 55 Pines Council, the Spanish Trail Council of the Boy Scouts of
- 56 America, the Gulf Coast Chamber of Commerce and the Harrison
- 57 County Tourism Commission, of which he was a Past President; and
