SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 563

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DESIGNATING MARCH 5-11, 2023, AS 2 "NATIONAL SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK WEEK IN MISSISSIPPI" AND EXPRESSING 3 THE IMPORTANCE OF SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK PROGRAMS.

4 WHEREAS, school social work is a specialized area of practice within the broad field of the social work profession. School 5 social workers bring unique knowledge and skills to the school 6 system and the student services team. School Social Workers are 7 trained mental health professionals who can assist with mental 8 9 health concerns, behavioral concerns, positive behavioral support, academic, and classroom support, consultation with teachers, 10 11 parents, and administrators as well as provide individual and group counseling/therapy. School social workers are hired by 12 13 school districts to enhance the district's ability to meet its 14 academic mission, especially where home, school and community 15 collaboration is the key to achieving student success.
