SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 19

1 A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE RECOGNITION OF THE MISSISSIPPI 2 SENATE TO TUPELO MULTIMEDIA ARTIST KE FRANCIS AS THE RECIPIENT OF 3 THE 2023 GOVERNOR'S ARTS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN VISUAL ARTS. 4 WHEREAS, the Governor's Arts Awards Program has announced its 2023 recipients, which include internationally known Tupelo 5 Multimedia Artist Ke Francis as the 2023 Governor's Arts Award recipient for Excellence in Visual Arts; and 7 WHEREAS, established in 1988, Governor's Arts Awards are 8 9 given to individuals and organizations to recognize outstanding work in the artistic disciplines, as well as arts-based community 10 11 development and arts patronage in Mississippi. The awards are presented in partnership with the Governor's Office and signify 12 13 the important relationship between government and the arts; and 14 WHEREAS, Ke Francis of Tupelo is 40 years into a successful 15 and prolific career as a multimedia artist, writer and publisher; 16 and WHEREAS, Mr. Francis has exhibited his art nationally and 17

internationally and is known as much for his striking visual works

- 19 as he is for his book imprint and his collaborations with leading
- 20 figures in the art world, including William Christenberry, Robert
- 21 Rauschenberg and Robert Stackhouse; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Francis was raised in Tupelo and returned there
- 23 after college and opened Francis Studios. He and his wife started
- 24 Hoopsnake Press in 1970. From 1969 through 1996, he worked as an
- 25 independent sculptor and printmaker. During this period, he
- 26 exhibited his work nationally and internationally and was
- 27 represented by Arthur Roger Gallery in New Orleans, Morgan Gallery
- 28 in Kansas City, Fendrick Gallery in Washington, D.C., and Bill
- 29 Lowe Galleries in Atlanta and Los Angeles. In 1980, Francis began
- 30 working on the "Reconstruction" series, which depicts the
- 31 destruction wrought by tornadoes and the rebuilding that goes on
- 32 afterward; and
- 33 WHEREAS, his idiosyncratic style-part Cubist, part
- 34 "primitive" and his particular vocabulary of images, including the
- 35 circular saw, combine to create quirky yet heroic paeans to the
- 36 human spirit. Francis has had more than 50 one- and two-person
- 37 exhibits, including a solo exhibit of 61 works at Terrace Gallery
- 38 in Orlando, Florida. His books, paintings, prints, photographs
- 39 and sculptures are in over 30 major public and private
- 40 international collections including the Getty Museum and the
- 41 National Gallery; and
- 42 WHEREAS, Francis served as a writer and regional editor for
- 43 Untitled in Memphis and Atlanta Art Papers. His poetry and short

- 44 stories have been published by numerous journals across the
- 45 nation; and
- 46 WHEREAS, Francis also helps operate *Hoopsnake Press* which
- 47 includes typecasting equipment, large etching and relief printing
- 48 presses, and two letterpresses to handle the design, illustration,
- 49 and printing of books. He runs the press in Tupelo with his wife,
- 50 Mary, and daughter, Kerry; and
- 51 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we pay tribute and
- 52 express appreciation for the talent of a Mississippi multimedia
- 53 artistic leader who has made Mississippi a better place and
- 54 exemplifies the artistic and literary traditions of our great
- 55 state:
- 56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 57 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby extend the recognition of the
- 58 Mississippi Senate to Tupelo multimedia artist Ke Francis as the
- 59 recipient of the 2023 Governor's Arts Award for Excellence in
- 60 Visual Arts and extend our congratulations to a multimedia
- 61 artistic leader on this auspicious occasion.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 63 Ke Francis as part of the Governor's Arts Awards presentation and
- 64 made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
