17 determination. He graduated with a 4.61 GPA and third in his 2018

18 Vicksburg High School class of 221 seniors. Some of Nicholas'

19 high school athletic accomplishments include: First Team

- 20 All-State, First Team All-District, All-District Most Valuable
- 21 Linebacker, and back-to-back All-County Defensive Player of the
- 22 Year. Participating in community awareness activities through
- 23 Vicksburg High School and Chick-fil-A Leadership Academy fostered
- 24 his dedication to helping others in need, especially children and
- 25 the homeless; and
- 26 WHEREAS, he chose to attend Jones Junior College. After one
- 27 academic semester and football season, he transferred from Jones
- 28 with a 4.0 GPA in addition to First All-State and All-Conference
- 29 at the junior college level, and Junior College All-American
- 30 awards. Nicholas matriculated to Tulane University in the 2019
- 31 spring semester. Life at this prestigious university was amazing,
- 32 adventurous and awarding for him. Through sheer diligence and
- 33 determination, he overcame hardships, enjoyed achievements,
- 34 reached goals and became a heartfelt part of the
- 35 Tulane family. Through Tulane and his teammates, Nicholas was
- 36 active in feeding and assisting the homeless. He made the honor
- 37 roll every semester at Tulane, made the 2019-2020 All-Conference
- 38 Academic Team, had a 4.00 GPA for the December 2020 fall semester,
- 39 and earned All-Conference Honor Roll vs Temple; and
- 40 WHEREAS, Nicholas' athletic awards include the 2020 Stephen
- 41 Martin Scholar Award; PPF Football Third Team All-Conference; Phil
- 42 Steele Third Team All-Conference; number-two Ranked Linebacker for
- 43 the 2020 season; and ranked number forty-nine out of the top one
- 44 hundred players in college football. Since 2020, he has received

- 45 a number of accolades, including Louisiana Player of the Week
- 46 Honor; AAC Defensive Player of the Week two times; AAC Conference
- 47 Championship Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Game; AAC
- 48 Honor Roll; AAC Academic All-American; Academic All-District Team;
- 49 All-Conference Honors three times; PFN Third Team All-American;
- 50 and Cotton Bowl Scholar-Athlete Award Recipient. In May of 2022,
- 51 he graduated Cum Laude (3.5 GPA) from Tulane University; and
- 52 WHEREAS, Nicholas' work with campus leadership and community
- 53 service include:
- 54 Student Athlete Diversity and Inclusion, Chairman:
- Advocating for the growth in relations between African
- 56 American student-athletes and nonathletic students at Tulane
- 57 University;
- Educating groups on financial literacy, history of
- 59 positive African American individuals who attended Tulane, social
- 60 justice and equality issues, current news and resources to improve
- 61 collegiate student experience;
- Providing a safe space for African American and other
- 63 minority students and student athletes to come and fellowship with

- Team Community Service, Volunteer/Coordinator:

- Providing and distributing meals for the homeless in the
- 67 City of New Orleans on a constant basis;
- Planting trees and executing trash cleanups in the Lower
