SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 61

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE NORTHWEST  
2 MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE "RANGERS" SOFTBALL TEAM AND HEAD  
3 COACH CHELSEA BRAMLETT FOR WINNING THEIR FIRST REGION 23 TITLE AND  
4 THEIR FIRST MACCC "ACADEMIC TEAM OF THE YEAR" AWARD.

5 WHEREAS, Northwest Softball had a historic year, capturing  
6 the program's first bid into the NJCAA Division II Championship  
7 Tournament. The "Rangers" were far from satisfied heading into  
8 the Region 23 Tournament Championship match with LSU Eunice, and  
9 made history once more, rallying from a 2-0 deficit to pull out a  
10 9-2 win against the "Bengals," claiming the program's first-ever  
11 Region 23 Title; and

12 WHEREAS, Five Northwest teams were recognized as MACCC  
13 Academic Teams of the Year; leading the way with the highest  
14 overall GPA for all sports was the "Rangers" softball team, which  
15 recorded a 3.73 grade point average. It is the first "Academic  
16 Team of the Year" award for softball under Bramlett's three-year  
17 tenure; and



18           WHEREAS, for the last two seasons, the Northwest softball  
19 record books have been rewritten across-the-board thanks to  
20 arguably the most dominant sophomore class in program history.  
21 Coach Chelsea Bramlett's group has accounted for 59 victories over  
22 the past two seasons, including two appearances into the NJCAA  
23 Region 23 Tournament. Northwest also concluded the 2022 season  
24 with a 39-15 overall record, the most victories recorded in a  
25 single season; and

26           WHEREAS, the "Rangers" finished the year as Region 23  
27 champions and as one of the Final Four Teams left in the NJCAA  
28 Division II Softball Championship Tournament, an event that  
29 started with 16 teams; and

30           WHEREAS, after breaking the program's single-season and  
31 career-stolen base records this season, Northwest sophomore  
32 speedster Laila Armstrong can add another honor to her collection.  
33 Armstrong has been chosen as this year's NJCAA Division II  
34 recipient of the "New Balance-NFCA Golden Shoe Award," the  
35 National Fastpitch Coaches Association announced on Friday  
36 afternoon. The award is given to the nation's best base stealer  
37 from an NFCA member institution; and

38           WHEREAS, infielder Caylee Comer, catcher Molly Harris and  
39 outfielder Saige Koczka earned All-Tournament recognition, as  
40 announced by the NJCAA. Out of 16 teams in the tournament field,  
41 the trio were among just 13 players selected for the postseason  
42 honor; and



43           WHEREAS, Head Coach Chelsea Bramlett was recognized as the  
44 NJCAA Gulf A District (Region 23) "Coach of the Year." Bramlett  
45 was presented with the award during the NJCAA Division II Softball  
46 Championship Banquet at Talladega Superspeedway. It is the first  
47 Coach of the Year Award for Bramlett, who is in her third season  
48 leading the "Rangers". Bramlett has guided the softball program  
49 to new heights during her brief tenure at Northwest. In just  
50 three seasons, she has compiled a 63-37 overall record, good for a  
51 .630 winning percentage. She has also guided the "Rangers" to its  
52 deepest postseason run ever, which included the first NJCAA Region  
53 23 Championship; and

54           WHEREAS, the team consisted of Haleigh Buchanan of Tunica,  
55 Mississippi; Laila Armstrong of Olive Branch, Mississippi; Kylee  
56 Brown of Bethel Springs, Tennessee; Meredith Owen of Covington,  
57 Tennessee; Anna Nickens of Senatobia, Mississippi; Reese  
58 Vanlandingham of Guntown, Mississippi; Bailey Russell of  
59 Batesville, Mississippi; Gracie Mettetal of Sardis, Mississippi;  
60 Molly Harris of Senatobia, Mississippi; Maddie Brower of Olive  
61 Branch, Mississippi; Saige Koczka of Southaven, Mississippi;  
62 Jaclyn Carter of Hernando, Mississippi; Meagan Allen of Lepanto,

75 student athletes who have brought honor to their college, their  
76 community and to the State of Mississippi:

78 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the  
79 Northwest Mississippi Community College "Rangers" Softball Team

81 Title and their first MACCC "Academic Team of the Year" Award, and  
82 extend the best wishes of the Mississippi Senate to the team,  
83 coaches, families and sponsors for future athletic and academic  
84 success.
