SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 73

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE BOONEVILLE 2 HIGH SCHOOL "LADY BLUE DEVILS" GIRLS BASKETBALL TEAM FOR WINNING 3 BACK-TO-BACK MHSAA 3A STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AND HEAD COACH MICHAEL 4 SMITH AS THE ONLY MISSISSIPPI HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL COACH TO WIN 5 CONSECUTIVE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS IN BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS BASKETBALL. WHEREAS, behind the play of 2023 Miss Basketball Saniyah Cook 6 7 and a dominant second quarter, the Booneville High School "Lady 8 Blue Devils" Girls Basketball Team raced past Forest 58-31 on 9 March 4, 2023, to claim the MHSAA Girls Class 3A State 10 Championship for the second consecutive season at the Mississippi 11 Coliseum; and 12 WHEREAS, it was Booneville's (30-3) fourth State title in 13 school history; and 14 WHEREAS, "I thought we had a really good game plan going in 15 and we knew they were going to press us," Booneville Coach Michael 16 Smith said. "But they could press us in two or three spots, but 17 not all five. We wanted to make sure Saniyah only had one or two 18 players guarding her, and that was the pressure release. That 19 took them out of what they were wanting to do." Coach Michael

20 Smith is the only high school coach in Mississippi history to win 21 consecutive State Championships in both girls and boys basketball; 22 and

23 WHEREAS, the "Lady Blue Devils" jumped out to a 9-0 lead to 24 begin the game, but Forest went on a 6-2 run to end the opening 25 quarter to cut the Booneville lead to 11-6 at the end of the first quarter. But just when the packed "Big House" crowd thought 26 27 Forest had settled down, the "Lady Blue Devils" went into another 28 gear. Forest scored the first basket of the second quarter 10 29 seconds into the period to cut the Booneville lead to 11-8. 30 Booneville proceeded to score the final 19 points of the quarter, 31 highlighted by back-to-back three-pointers from Ava Kathryn Smith, 32 to take a commanding 30-8 lead. In the second half, every time 33 Forest tried to cut into the Booneville lead, the "Lady Blue Devils" had an answer. Their lead never dwindled below 20 points, 34 35 and Cook sealed the game with four consecutive free throws in the 36 fourth quarter to give them an insurmountable 51-26 lead; and

37 WHEREAS, Saniyah Cook had a game-high 20 points to earn MVP 38 honors for Booneville, while Ava Kathryn Smith added 19 points for 39 the "Lady Blue Devils"; and
