- 4 WHEREAS, behind a defense that forced 31 turnovers and the
- 5 play of Brandon Hall and Jalen Smith, the McEvans High School
- 6 "Warriors" raced past McAdams 67-48 to claim the MHSAA Boys Class
- 7 1A State Basketball Championship on March 2, 2023, at the
- 8 Mississippi Coliseum; and
- 9 WHEREAS, it was McEvans (24-6) fifth State Title in school
- 10 history and first since 2015, when the school was known as Shaw
- 11 High School; and
- 12 WHEREAS, "The full-court press is something we haven't been
- 13 using at all postseason and it was something that caught them off
- 14 guard," said McEvans Coach Eric Henry. "Forcing turnovers that
- 15 led to easy baskets is something we've done all year"; and
- 16 WHEREAS, McAdams jumped out to a 9-3 lead to begin the game
- 17 and eventually held a 16-6 lead at the end of the quarter. After
- 18 that, it was all "Warriors." McEvans went on a 18-2 run in the

- 19 second quarter to take a 24-18 lead and held a 24-21 halftime
- 20 lead. A 10-2 run to begin the second half stretched the
- 21 "Warriors'" lead out to 34-23 and a 8-0 run to end the third
- 22 quarter gave McEvans a 42-27 lead headed to the fourth. The final
- 23 period was more even than the last two, but the "Warriors'" lead
- 24 never dwindled below nine points. Brandon Hall and Jalen Smith
- 25 each had 18 points to lead McEvans, while Edward Smith added 11
- 26 points for the "Warriors"; and
- 27 WHEREAS, "This State Championship means a lot to us and to
- 28 the community," Coach Henry stated. "I started with these kids
- 29 when they were in 10th grade and we lost last year in the
- 30 semifinals and we were going to do what we needed to do to get
- 31 back here and we did"; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 "Warriors'" Boys Basketball
- 33 Championship Team Roster is: Omarion Blake, Jalen Smith, Brenton
- 34 Hall, Jordan McDaniel, Brandon Hall, Elijah Johnson, Bryan Dotson,
