## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 81

A RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE "GOOD FRIDAY AGREEMENT" (April 10, 1998-April 10, 2023) WHICH NEGOTIATED A DEVOLVED INDEPENDENT GOVERNMENT IN NORTHERN IRELAND AND TO EXPRESS THE SUPPORT OF THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE FOR THE CITIZENS OF NORTHERN IRELAND ON THIS AUSPICIOUS OCCASION.

- 6 WHEREAS, the Good Friday Agreement, also called Belfast
- 7 Agreement, reached on April 10, 1998, and ratified in both Ireland
- 8 and Northern Ireland by popular vote on May 22, 1998, called for
- 9 devolved independent government in Northern Ireland. The Good
- 10 Friday Agreement represented a landmark breakthrough that provided
- 11 Ireland with a political framework to address its future; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the 25th Anniversary of the Good Friday Agreement
- 13 has been reached, and while there are still outstanding issues, it
- 14 has been a considerable success. There are people alive in
- 15 Northern Ireland and on the island of Ireland today because of the
- 16 continuous bipartisan support for the Good Friday Agreement over
- 17 the last 25 years by State Legislators, successive United States
- 18 Presidents, the United States Senate, United States House of
- 19 Representatives, and elected officials working in partnership with

- 20 the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of
- 21 Ireland; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the Good Friday Agreement, on this year of the 25th
- 23 Anniversary of its ratification, is the framework for lasting
- 24 peace in Northern Ireland. The Good Friday Agreement acknowledged
- 25 the right of differing political traditions to pursue their goals
- 26 of remaining part of the United Kingdom or of Irish Unity. The
- 27 Good Friday Agreement demonstrated democratic and peaceful means
- 28 of resolving differences; and
- 29 WHEREAS, we recognize the British and Irish Governments'
- 30 ongoing support and implementation of the Good Friday Agreement.
- 31 It is the irrevocable foundation of the peace process regardless
- 32 of the United Kingdom's status regarding the European Union; and
- 33 WHEREAS, members of both political parties in the United
- 34 States came together to support the Good Friday Agreement; and
- 35 WHEREAS, on the 17th of March during the annual celebration
- 36 of the Feast of Saint Patrick, the Patron Saint of Ireland, Irish
- 37 Americans join with men, women and children of all ethnic origins
- 38 and for one day become "Irish" and celebrate Saint Patrick, and
- 39 this year we also celebrate and give thanks for the 25th
- 40 Anniversary of the Good Friday Peace Agreement; and
- WHEREAS, 2023 also marks the 175th Anniversary of the first
- 42 flying of the Irish Flag by Thomas Meagher who embodied the links
- 43 between Ireland and the United States of America. In one

44 lifetime, Thomas Meagher ran for the City Council in Waterford,

- 45 Ireland, led the rebellion for freedom from British rule in
- 46 Ireland in 1848, was sentenced to death, which was commuted to
- 47 life in prison in Australia, from where he escaped, and he became
- 48 a Brigadier General in the 69th Regiment of the famous "Fighting
- 49 Irish Brigade." Meagher was appointed Montana's territorial
- 50 Secretary of State by President Andrew Johnson, and also served as
- 51 acting territorial Governor; and
- 52 WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has an important historical
- 53 connection to the culture of Ireland and Northern Ireland. While
- 54 some Irish settlers moved to what is today Mississippi when the
- 55 British ruled West Florida, the first major Irish presence in the
- 56 state came when the Spanish took the colony back after the
- 57 American War of Independence. With Roman Catholicism the
- 58 established religion, Irish priests came to serve in the Natchez
- 59 District. For the next few decades, the predominant Irish
- 60 presence in the state was Protestant. The advent of the Great
- 61 Famine pushed more than 2,000,000 people out of Ireland between
- 62 1845 and 1855, and many came to Mississippi. In 1860 the state
- 63 boasted almost 4,000 Irish citizens. Despite the harsh
- 64 conditions, the Irish stayed in Antebellum Mississippi thanks to
- 65 community institutions usually operated by Irish and
- 66 Irish-American nuns. More prosperous Irish immigrants founded
- 67 their own societies. The most active was the Hibernian Society in
- 68 Natchez. Middle-class Irish also took an active interest in Irish

- 69 and American politics, showing a particular penchant for political
- 70 journalism; and
- 71 WHEREAS, with this historical context in mind, we take great
- 72 pride in acknowledging the connection between the political and
- 73 historical past of Ireland and the State of Mississippi, and our
- 74 support for cultural exchange between our citizens:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 76 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commemorate the 25th Anniversary of
- 77 the "Good Friday Agreement" (April 10, 1998-April 10, 2023), which
- 78 negotiated a devolved independent government in Northern Ireland
- 79 and express the support of the Mississippi Senate for the citizens
- 80 of Northern Ireland on this auspicious occasion.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be transmitted
- 82 and presented to the appropriate Representatives of the Northern
- 83 Ireland Assembly and the Senate of Ireland and the Chair of the
- 84 American Irish State Legislators Caucus, forwarded to members of
- 85 Mississippi's Congressional Delegation, and be made available to
- 86 the Capitol Press Corps.
