## **House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2203**

## TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 34 SECTION 1. (1)The Mississippi Department of Finance and 35 Administration, acting on behalf of the Mississippi Department of Mental Health, is hereby authorized to survey, partition, transfer 36 37 and convey all of the rights, title and interest in the three thousand two hundred seven (3,207) acres of certain real property 38 39 located in Rankin County, Mississippi, acquired by the State of 40 Mississippi in 1894 and more particularly described in the land 41 records of the Office of Rankin County Chancery Clerk in Book 46 Page 38 and Book 46 Page 39, to (a) the state agencies and 42 43 institutions currently situated and operating programs on said 44 property; (b) the Mississippi Veterans Affairs Board for the 45 establishment of a Veterans Nursing Home in Rankin County; and (c) 46 the Mississippi State Department of Health for the establishment 47 of a Counter-Measure Warehouse in Rankin County, as specifically provided in this section. 48 In order to implement said transfers, upon completing a 49

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51 authorized to define and assign individual parcels of property for
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- 52 stage agencies/institutions who currently have and operate
- 53 programs at buildings on this property with deeds to be titled
- 54 "State of Mississippi for the Benefit and Use of ."
- The existing state agencies/institutions to be assigned
- 56 parcels of property include the following:
- 57 (a) The Mississippi Department of Mental Health (State
- 58 Hospital and Hudspeth facility);
- 59 (b) The State Fire Academy;
- 60 (c) The Mississippi Department of Environmental
- 61 Quality;
- 62 (d) The Mississippi Department of Transportation;
- 63 (e) The Mississippi Forestry Commission;
- 64 (f) The Mississippi Department of Public Safety,
- 65 including the Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training
- 66 Academy (MLEOTA), Highway Patrol Substation, Department
- 67 Headquarters, and the Mississippi Crime Lab;
- 68 (g) The Mississippi Department of Education;
- (h) The Mississippi Emergency Management Agency;
- 70 (i) The Department of Finance and Administration Office
- 71 of Surplus Property;
- 72 (j) The Mississippi Department of Corrections
- 73 correctional facility;
- 74 (k) The Mississippi State University Veterinary
- 75 Laboratory; and

- 76 (1)The Poultry Research and Diagnostic Laboratory in 77 the Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine.
- 78 Upon completing a field survey, the Department of 79 Finance and Administration is authorized to define and assign the 80 proposed site on said property for the new Veterans Nursing Home
- located in Rankin County to the northwest of Mississippi State
- 82 Hospital east of State Highway 475 and west of the lake, to the
- Mississippi Veterans Affairs Board for the establishment, 83
- 84 operation, maintenance and control of the said Veterans Nursing
- 85 Home.

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- Upon completing a field survey, the Department of 86
- 87 Finance and Administration is authorized to define and assign the
- 88 proposed site on said property for a Counter-Measure Warehouse
- 89 located southwest of the Office of Surplus Property, to the
- 90 Mississippi State Department of Health, for the establishment,
- 91 operation, maintenance and control of said warehouse.
- 92 Upon completing the field survey, the Department of
- Finance and Administration is authorized to define the sewer 93
- 94 easements and facilitate the installation of flow meters into the
- 95 sewer lines to be assigned to the Mississippi Department of Mental
- 96 Health and the said Department of Mental Health is authorized to
- 97 assess each agency or institution an amount proportionate to its
- 98 use of sewer costs that the department pays to the West Rankin
- 99 Utility District, on a continuing basis as determined by the flow
- 100 meters installed within each agency's assigned sewer line.

- 101 The balance of any unassigned property on said parcel 102 shall be under the maintenance and control of the Mississippi 103 Department of Finance and Administration until such time as it may 104 be required for use to construct buildings or facilities as may be 105 authorized by law, at which time the Department of Finance and 106 Administration shall be authorized to define and assign parcels 107 for such purpose. The Department of Mental Health shall have the 108 right to execute leases on all remaining unassigned property 109 solely for timber planting and harvesting purposes, and for which the department shall receive the proceeds from the sell of any 110 111 timber harvested from the unassigned property, the funds from 112 which shall be deposited to the State Treasury specifically for
- 114 (7) The State of Mississippi shall retain all mineral rights 115 in the parcels of property assigned to state agencies and 116 institutions under this section.
- SECTION 2. Section 35-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 119 35-1-19. There is hereby authorized to be established by the 120 State Veterans Affairs Board, the Mississippi State Veterans Home 121 on a site to be determined by the State Veterans Affairs Board, 122 with the approval of the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real 123 Property Management of the Governor's Office of General Services, 124 when funds are made available for such purpose by any agency of 125 the federal government or other sources. The object and purpose 126 of the establishment of the Mississippi State Veterans Home shall

- be to provide domiciliary care and other related services for eligible veterans of the State of Mississippi.
- 129 One or more additional veterans homes or domiciliaries are
- 130 hereby authorized to be established by the State Veterans Affairs
- 131 Board on sites in northern, central or southern Mississippi, to be
- 132 determined by the State Veterans Affairs Board, with the approval
- 133 of the Department of Finance and Administration, when funds are
- 134 made available for such purpose by any agency of the federal
- 135 government or other sources. The Veterans Affairs Board shall
- 136 give the three (3) regions, northern, southern and central
- 137 priority as to where the veterans home shall be located, with the
- 138 northern region having first priority, the southern region having
- 139 the next level priority and the central region being third in
- 140 order of priority. The Veterans Affairs Board shall establish and
- 141 operate the veterans home in Rankin County under the provisions of
- 142 this act. The object and purpose of the establishment of such
- 143 additional homes or domiciliaries shall be to provide domiciliary
- 144 care and other related services for eligible veterans of the State
- 145 of Mississippi. The State Veterans Affairs Board shall not be
- 146 required to obtain certificates of need to carry out the intent
- 147 and purpose of this section.
- SECTION 3. Section 35-1-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 149 amended as follows:
- 150 35-1-21. (1) Upon the establishment of the Mississippi
- 151 State Veterans Home, and any additional homes as may be
- 152 established, including the State Veterans Home in Rankin County

153 under the provisions of this act, the Mississippi State Veterans

154 Affairs Board is hereby designated as the governing authority of

155 any such facilities. The operation and maintenance of all

156 veterans homes shall meet the standards of the United States

157 Department of Veterans Affairs with regard to the operation of

158 state veterans homes.

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The State Veterans Affairs Board may contract with (2) nongovernmental entities or the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to operate and provide services to state veterans homes. The board may contract with the vendor whose proposal is most advantageous to the state and veterans, taking into consideration cost factors, program suitability factors, management plan, delivery of care and service to residents, excellence of program design, key personnel, corporate or company resources, financial condition of the vendor, corporate experience and past performance, and any other requirements deemed necessary by the board and expressed in its solicitation for proposals. Contract(s) awarded under this section may be for periods exceeding one (1) year. The board is not required to select the vendor offering the lowest cost proposal, but shall select the vendor who, in the board's discretion, offers the proposal most advantageous to the State of Mississippi and veterans. contract is awarded, the reason(s) for the awarding of the

contract shall be entered on the minutes of the board.

provisions of this paragraph shall supersede any rule or

regulation of the Public Procurement Review Board to the contrary.

- 179 (3) The State Veterans Affairs Board may, as permitted by
  180 federal laws or regulations, purchase from the United States
  181 Department of Veterans Affairs, from contracts established by the
  182 United States Department of Veterans Affairs, or through other
  183 sharing agreements between the board and the United States
  184 Department of Veterans Affairs, services, commodities, supplies
- and equipment for use in operation of, and provision of care to residents of, the state veterans homes when such purchases or
- 187 agreements are advantageous to the veterans and the state.
- The State Veterans Affairs Board may operate and 188 (4)189 maintain the state veterans homes without entering into any 190 contract for management purposes with any nongovernmental entity 191 or the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to operate the 192 In such instances, the State Veterans Affairs Board shall 193 be solely responsible for the operation and maintenance of the 194 state veterans homes and shall hire the administrators and all 195 other personnel for the veterans homes. The mission of the State 196 Veterans Affairs Board in managing the state veterans homes shall 197 be to provide domiciliary care and other related services for 198 eligible veterans in the most cost efficient manner.
- (5) The State Department of Health shall perform an initial certification survey of the State Veterans Home in Collins,

  Mississippi, on or about July 1, 2000. The purpose of this

  initial survey is to provide a baseline for measuring the quality

  of care during the period for which this section applies. In

  addition to the initial certification survey, the State Department

- 205 of Health shall, as appropriate and in its discretion, conduct
- 206 periodic follow-up certification surveys, during the period for
- 207 which this section applies, of the State Veterans Home in Collins,
- 208 Mississippi.
- SECTION 4. Section 35-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 210 amended as follows:
- 211 35-1-23. The Mississippi State Veterans Home and additional
- 212 homes authorized by Section 35-1-7 and Sections 35-1-19 to
- 213 35-1-29, including the State Veterans Home in Rankin County under
- 214 the provisions of this act, are authorized to accept funds from
- 215 any source whatever, including the federal government or any
- 216 department or agency thereof. All such funds received by the
- 217 veterans home including funds from the United States or any
- 218 federal agency or program for the support of persons housed or
- 219 buried on the grounds of the Mississippi State Veterans Home and
- 220 additional homes shall be used by the State Veterans Affairs Board
- 221 to pay maintenance, operational and administrative expenses and to
- 222 further the object and purpose of the Mississippi State Veterans
- 223 Home and additional homes.
- 224 **SECTION 5.** Section 35-1-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 225 amended as follows:
- 226 35-1-25. It shall be the duty of the Mississippi State
- 227 Veterans Affairs Board to determine the need and, within available
- 228 funds for such purpose, to provide adequate staffing to operate
- 229 the Mississippi State Veterans Home and such additional homes as
- 230 may be constructed, including the State Veterans Home in Rankin

- 231 County under the provisions of this act. The board is authorized,
- 232 within available funds for such purpose, to purchase such
- 233 equipment as necessary to facilitate the establishment and
- 234 operation of the veterans homes.
- 235 Section 35-1-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 236 amended as follows:
- 237 35-1-27. The Mississippi Veterans Affairs Board shall
- determine and set conditions and standards for admission and 238
- 239 dismissal of all persons to and from the Mississippi State
- 240 Veterans Home and such additional homes as may be constructed,
- 241 including the State Veterans Home in Rankin County under the
- 242 provisions of this act. In addition, the board shall promulgate
- 243 such rules and regulations as it deems necessary for the
- 244 government of the Mississippi State Veterans Home and such
- 245 additional homes as may be constructed. Such rules and regulations
- 246 shall include the establishment of rates for patient care within
- 247 the patient's ability to pay. All funds paid to the board by the
- 248 veteran residents of state veterans homes to fund their monthly
- 249 expenses at the state veterans homes shall be considered to be
- 250 special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for the benefit of the
- 251 residents of the state veterans homes.
- 252 SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 253 and after July 1, 2023.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION ACTING ON BEHALF OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 3 MENTAL HEALTH TO SURVEY, PARTITION, TRANSFER AND CONVEY ALL OF THE RIGHTS, TITLE AND INTEREST IN THE 3,207 ACRES OF CERTAIN REAL 5 PROPERTY LOCATED IN RANKIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, ACQUIRED BY THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI IN 1894 TO THE STATE AGENCIES CURRENTLY SITUATED AND OPERATING ON SAID PROPERTY; TO IDENTIFY THE EXISTING STATE AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS TO BE ASSIGNED PARCELS OF THE SAID PROPERTY; TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND 10 ADMINISTRATION TO DEFINE AND ASSIGN PARCELS OF SAID PROPERTY TO 11 THE MISSISSIPPI STATE VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT 12 AND OPERATION OF A NEW VETERANS NURSING HOME IN RANKIN COUNTY; TO 13 AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO DEFINE 14 AND ASSIGN PARCELS OF SAID PROPERTY TO THE MISSISSIPPI STATE 15 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF A NEW 16 COUNTER-MEASURE WAREHOUSE IN RANKIN COUNTY; TO AUTHORIZE THE 17 DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO DEFINE SEWER EASEMENTS 18 ON SAID PROPERTY TO BE ASSIGNED TO THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 19 MENTAL HEALTH FOR CONTINUED OPERATION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE BALANCE 20 OF ANY UNASSIGNED PROPERTY SHALL BE UNDER THE MANAGEMENT AND 2.1 CONTROL OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND 22 ADMINISTRATION UNTIL SUCH TIME AS SAID PROPERTY IS REQUIRED FOR 23 FUTURE BUILDINGS OR FACILITIES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO 24 AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH TO ASSESS 25 EACH STATE AGENCY UTILIZING SAID PROPERTY AN AMOUNT PROPORTIONATE 26 TO THE USE OF WATER/SEWER COSTS PAID TO THE WEST RANKIN COUNTY UTILITY DISTRICT; TO AMEND SECTIONS 35-1-19, 35-1-21, 35-1-23, 27 35-1-25 AND 35-1-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE 28 29 MISSISSIPPI VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD TO ESTABLISH, OPERATE, 30 MAINTAIN, RECEIVE FUNDS FOR, EMPLOYEE PERSONNEL AND SET ADMISSION 31 STANDARDS FOR THE NEW VETERANS NURSING HOME IN RANKIN COUNTY; AND 32 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
