## House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2523

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8 **SECTION 1.** Section 69-33-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 amended as follows:

10 69-33-1. For the purpose of this chapter, the following 11 words shall have the following meanings unless the context shall 12 prescribe otherwise:

(a) "Owner" means the person, firm or corporation
owning the land on which pecan trees are growing or the person,
firm or corporation having legal possession of such land.

16 (b) "Harvesting season" means that portion of each 17 calendar year beginning on \* \* \* <u>September</u> 1 and ending \* \* \* 18 January 31.

19 SECTION 2. Section 69-33-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 20 amended as follows:

21 69-33-3. When pecan trees are grown on private property and 22 the branches of such trees extend over a public road, street or 23 highway right-of-way, any pecans falling from any such pecan trees 24 onto such public right-of-way shall be deemed the property of the S. B. 2523 PAGE 1 25 owner of such pecan trees until the end of the harvesting season, 26 and it shall be unlawful for any person, without the permission of 27 the owner of such trees, to remove such pecans from any such public right-of-way during the harvesting season. It shall be 28 29 unlawful for any person, without the permission of the owner of 30 such trees, to pick or otherwise remove any pecans from the limbs or branches of pecan trees or to cause pecans to fall from such 31 Any person found to be in violation of this section shall 32 trees. 33 be quilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined an 34 amount not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or be

35 <u>imprisoned for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days in jail, or</u> 36 <u>both such fine and imprisonment.</u>

37 SECTION 3. Section 69-33-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
38 brought forward as follows:

39 69-33-5. Any pecans remaining on a public road, street or 40 highway right-of-way during that portion of each calendar year 41 except the harvesting season shall be deemed to be abandoned by 42 the owner of such pecans, and it shall not be unlawful for any 43 person to remove such pecans from such public right-of-way, except 44 during the harvesting season.

45 **SECTION 4.** Section 69-33-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 46 brought forward as follows:

47 69-33-7. The provisions of this chapter shall not be
48 construed to prohibit employees of the State Highway Department or
49 the employees of a county or municipality from engaging in normal
50 activities of maintenance on the rights-of-way of public roads,

51 streets or highways. Nor shall the provisions of this chapter be 52 construed to grant the owner of any pecan trees the right to 53 harvest pecans from the rights-of-way of any interstate or other 54 limited access highway.

55 SECTION 5. Section 69-33-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 56 amended as follows:

57 69-33-9. (1) Any person who , without the owner's 58 permission, enters upon the private property of an owner of lands 59 upon which pecan trees are growing for the purpose of removing pecans from the premises thereof, whether from the grounds or 60 61 within any facility thereon where the pecans are stored, for his or her own financial benefit which causes financial detriment and 62 63 other damages or hardships to the owner of the pecan trees, shall be found quilty of violating the provisions of this chapter shall 64 65 be guilty of **\* \* \*** larceny and subject to the penalties of petit 66 larceny as prescribed in Section 97-17-43, or grand larceny, as 67 prescribed in Section 97-17-41.

68 (2) In addition to any such fine or imprisonment that may be 69 imposed for violating the provisions of this chapter, the court 70 shall order restitution to be made to the owner of the severed 71 pecans in United States currency at the current replacement value 72 of the damage or loss. Whether the felonious crime is prosecuted as petit larceny or grand larceny shall be determined by the 73 74 amount of the pecan's fair market value at the time the theft of 75 the pecans occurred.

S. B. 2523 PAGE 3 76 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from 77 and after July 1, 2023.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 69-33-1, 639-33-3 AND 69-33-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE CRIMINAL AND CIVIL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF THE PECAN HARVESTING LAW; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 69-33-5 AND 69-33-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR THE PURPOSE OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
