## House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3016

## TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
10	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
11	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
12	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
13	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024\$ 4,709,810.00
14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
17	Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
18	funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the
19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024
21	\$ 27,813,178.00
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of
23	this act, the following positions are authorized:

Time-Limited: 68 27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 28 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 29 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds 30 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 31 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi 32 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 33 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 34 35 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 36 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 37 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the 38 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 39 40 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 41 42 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

43 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

44 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

45 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 46

47 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.

Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written

49 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 53

125	SECTION 7	. None of the funds appropriated in Section 4 of

126 this act shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the

- 127 State Treasury for disaster relief except as provided for in
- 128 Section 33-15-307, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 129 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 130 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon
- 131 the request of a local public emergency management organization in
- 132 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to
- 133 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when
- 134 the local emergency management organization determines that such
- 135 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the
- 136 community.
- 137 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 138 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall
- 139 provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors,
- 140 mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in
- 141 disaster management.
- 142 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 143 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
- 144 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 145 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 146 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 147 **SECTION 11.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 148 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 149 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 150 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 151 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

174	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the		
175	Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency		
176	shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred		
177	Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund		
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- 178 treasury fund and major object budget category to another special
- 179 or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category
- 180 accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency
- 181 Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more
- 182 efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the
- 183 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the
- 184 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written
- 185 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
- 186 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
- 187 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the
- 188 transfer.
- 189 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 190 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a
- 191 notification and summary of all state support funding on all
- 192 disasters that require general funds or state support special
- 193 funds to the Legislative Budget Office.
- 194 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that from
- 195 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a
- 196 minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance
- 197 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as
- 198 well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters.
- 199 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area
- 200 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their
- 201 assigned districts.
- 202 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 203 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the

purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are

made without competitive bids.

SECTION 16. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

SECTION 17. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his

- 229 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
- 230 officers in the manner provided by law.
- 231 **SECTION 18.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 232 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 233 June 29, 2023.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
