- 242 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

- 244 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 245 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 246 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 247 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 248 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 249 June 29, 2023.
