**Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting
in lieu thereof the following:**

94 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
95 amended as follows:
96 27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the
97 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the
98 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
99 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
100 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
101 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
102 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
103 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.



104 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed by the
105 Department of Finance and Administration as follows:

106 (a) To the Department of Archives and History for the
107 purpose of providing a grant to the Scott Ford House, Inc., to
108 develop the property located at 136 East Cohea Street in the City
109 of Jackson, the home of the former slave Mary Scott Green, to tell

1430 **SECTION 11.** There is created in the State Treasury a special
1431 fund to be known as the 2022 Mississippi Ports Improvements Fund,
1432 which shall consist of funds made available by the Legislature in
1433 any manner and funds from any other source designated for deposit
1434 into the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used by the
1435 Mississippi Development Authority, upon appropriation by the
1436 Legislature, for such purposes as provided in the appropriation.
1437 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal
1438 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest
1439 earned or investment earnings on amounts in the fund shall be
1440 deposited to the credit of the fund.

1441 **SECTION 12.** There is created in the State Treasury a special
1442 fund to be known as the 2022 Mississippi Land, Water, and Timber
1443 Resources Fund, which shall consist of funds made available by the
1444 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source
1445 designated for deposit into the fund. Monies in the fund shall be
1446 used by the Mississippi Land, Water and Timber Resources Board,
1447 upon appropriation by the Legislature, for such purposes as
1448 provided in the appropriation. Unexpended amounts remaining in



1449 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
1450 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
1451 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the
1452 fund.

1453 **SECTION 13.** Section 57-1-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1454 brought forward as follows:

1455 57-1-18. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1456 following terms shall have the meanings ascribed in this section
1457 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1458 (a) "Limited population county" means a county in the
1459 State of Mississippi with a population of thirty thousand (30,000)
1460 or less according to the most recent federal decennial census at
1461 the time the county submits its application to the MDA under this
1462 section.

1463 (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1464 (c) "Project" means highways, streets and other
1465 roadways, bridges, sidewalks, utilities, airfields, airports,
1466 acquisition of equipment, acquisition of real property,
1467 development of real property, improvements to real property, and
1468 any other project approved by the MDA.

1469 (d) "Small municipality" means a municipality in the
1470 State of Mississippi with a population of ten thousand (10,000) or
1471 less according to the most recent federal decennial census at the
1472 time the municipality submits its application to the MDA under



1473 this section. The term "small municipality" also includes a
1474 municipal historical hamlet as defined in Section 17-27-5.

1475 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1476 special fund to be designated as the "Small Municipalities and
1477 Limited Population Counties Fund," which shall consist of funds
1478 appropriated or otherwise made available by the Legislature in any
1479 manner and funds from any other source designated for deposit into
1480 such fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of
1481 a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any
1482 investment earnings or interest earned on amounts in the fund
1483 shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in the fund
1484 shall be used to make grants to small municipalities and limited
1485 population counties or natural gas districts created by law and
1486 contained therein to assist in completing projects under this
1487 section.

1488 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1489 of bonds issued under Sections 1 through 16 of Chapter 538, Laws
1490 of 2002, Sections 1 through 16 of Chapter 508, Laws of 2003,
1491 Sections 55 through 70 of Chapter 1, Laws of 2004 Third
1492 Extraordinary Session, Sections 1 through 16 of Chapter 482, Laws
1493 of 2006, Section 15 of Chapter 580, Laws of 2007, Section 1 of
1494 Chapter 503, Laws of 2008, Section 42 of Chapter 557, Laws of
1495 2009, Section 38 of Chapter 533, Laws of 2010, Section 41 of
1496 Chapter 480, Laws of 2011, Section 30 of Chapter 569, Laws of
1497 2013, Section 4 of Chapter 530, Laws of 2014, Section 11 of



1498 Chapter 472, Laws of 2015, Section 19 of Chapter 511, Laws of
1499 2016, Section 5 of Chapter 452, Laws of 2018, Section 19 of
1500 Chapter 454, Laws of 2019, or Section 11 of Chapter 492, Laws of
1501 2020, may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary
1502 costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the various
1503 grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered by the
1504 MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1505 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1506 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1507 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued.
1508 Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
1509 federal tax law requirements.

1510 (3) The MDA shall establish a grant program to make grants
1511 to small municipalities and limited population counties from the
1512 Small Municipalities and Limited Population Counties Fund. Grants
1513 made under this section to a small municipality or a limited
1514 population county shall not exceed Two Hundred Fifty Thousand
1515 Dollars (\$250,000.00) during any grant period established by the
1516 MDA. A small municipality or limited population county may apply
1517 to the MDA for a grant under this section in the manner provided
1518 for in this section.

1519 (4) A small municipality or limited population county
1520 desiring assistance under this section must submit an application
1521 to the MDA. The application must include a description of the
1522 project for which assistance is requested, the cost of the project



for which assistance is requested, the amount of assistance requested and any other information required by the MDA.

(5) The MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and administer the program established under this section, and the department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the implementation of this section.

(6) The MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing all assistance provided under this section.

SECTION 14. Section 57-1-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

57-1-16. (1) As used in this section:

(a) "Extraordinary economic development opportunity" means a new or expanded business or industry which maintains a strong financial condition and minimal credit risk and creates substantial employment, particularly in areas of high unemployment. The term "extraordinary economic development opportunity" does not include any medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

(b) "Local economic development entities" means state institutions of higher learning or public or private nonprofit local economic development entities including, but not limited to, chambers of commerce, local authorities, commissions or other



entities created by local and private legislation or districts created pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

(c) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

(2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a special fund to be designated as the ACE Fund, which shall consist of money from any public or private source designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. The purpose of the fund shall be to assist in maximizing extraordinary economic development opportunities related to any new or expanded business or industry or to assist a local unit of government as authorized in subsection (5) of this section. Such funds may be used to make grants to local economic development entities to assist any new or expanding business or industry that meets the criteria provided in this section when such assistance aids the consummation of a project within the State of Mississippi, including any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical boundary of Mississippi, or to make grants to a local unit of government as authorized in subsection (5) of this section.

(b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the



1573 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1574 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1575 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1576 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1577 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1578 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1579 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1580 requirements.

1581 (3) The MDA shall establish a grant program to make grants
1582 from the ACE Fund created under this section. Local economic
1583 development entities may apply to the MDA for a grant under this
1584 section in the manner provided for in subsection (4) of this
1585 section. Local units of government may apply to the MDA for a
1586 grant under this section in the manner provided in subsection (5)
1587 of this section.

1588 (4) (a) Any business or industry desiring assistance from a
1589 local economic development entity under this section shall submit
1590 an application to the local economic development entity which
1591 shall include, at a minimum:

1592 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1593 the definition of an extraordinary economic development
1594 opportunity;

1595 (ii) A demonstration that the business or industry
1596 is at an economic disadvantage by locating the new or expanded
1597 project in the county;



1598 (iii) A description, including the cost, of the
1599 requested assistance;

1600 (iv) A description of the purpose for which the
1601 assistance is requested;

1602 (v) A two-year business plan;

1603 (vi) Financial statements or tax returns for the
1604 three (3) years immediately prior to the application;

1605 (vii) Credit reports on all persons or entities
1606 with a twenty percent (20%) or greater interest in the business or
1607 industry; and

1608 (viii) Any other information required by the MDA.

1609 (b) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1610 entered into requiring that:

1611 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1612 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1613 and

1614 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1615 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1616 MDA shall be repaid.

1617 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business or
1618 industry, the local economic development entity may apply to the
1619 MDA for assistance under this section. Such application must
1620 contain evidence that the business or industry meets the
1621 definition of an extraordinary economic development opportunity, a
1622 demonstration that the business or industry is at an economic



disadvantage by locating the new or expanded project in the county, a description, including the cost, of the requested assistance, and a statement of what efforts have been made or are being made by the business or industry for securing or qualifying for other local, state, federal or private funds for the project.

(d) The MDA shall have sole discretion in the awarding of ACE funds, provided that the business or industry and the local economic development entity have met the statutory requirements of this section. However, in making grants under this section, the MDA shall attempt to provide for an equitable distribution of such grants among each of the congressional districts of this state in order to promote economic development across the entire state.

(5) (a) The MDA may make grants to local units of government to assist the local unit of government in purchasing real property for the benefit of an existing industry that commits to maintain a minimum of one thousand three hundred (1,300) jobs for a minimum of ten (10) years after the date the grant is made. The MDA shall not make grants under this subsection to assist local units of government for the benefit of any medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

(b) Any local unit of government seeking a grant authorized under this subsection shall apply to MDA. The application shall contain such information as the MDA may require.

(c) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be entered into requiring that:



1648 (i) The minimum requirements of this subsection
1649 and such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be
1650 met; and

1651 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1652 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1653 MDA shall be repaid.

1654 (6) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1655 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1656 the implementation of this section. However, before the
1657 implementation of any such rules and regulations, they shall be
1658 submitted to a committee consisting of five (5) members of the
1659 Senate Finance Committee and five (5) members of the House of
1660 Representatives Ways and Means Committee, appointed by the
1661 respective committee chairmen.

1662 **SECTION 15.** Section 57-1-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1663 amended as follows:

1664 57-1-701. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1665 following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in
1666 this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1667 (a) "Eligible entity" means any (i) county, (ii)
1668 municipality or (iii) public or private nonprofit local economic
1669 development entity including, but not limited to, local
1670 authorities, commissions, or other entities created by local and
1671 private legislation or pursuant to Section 19-5-99.



1672 (b) "Optioned property" means industrial property that
1673 is subject to a real estate option to purchase contract entered
1674 into between an eligible entity and a real estate owner, where
1675 such option shall be for a minimum of three (3) years and the
1676 option price shall not exceed the appraised fair market value of
1677 the real estate.

1678 (c) "Eligible expenditures" means:

1679 (i) Fees for architects, engineers, environmental
1680 consultants, attorneys, and such other advisors, consultants and
1681 agents that MDA determines are necessary to complete site due
1682 diligence associated with site development improvements located on
1683 industrial property that is publicly owned or is optioned
1684 property;

1685 (ii) Contributions toward site development
1686 improvements, as approved by MDA, located on industrial property
1687 that is publicly owned;

1688 (iii) Contributions toward public infrastructure
1689 improvements directly serving industrial property that is publicly
1690 owned or is optioned property; and/or

1691 (iv) Contributions toward acquisition of publicly
1692 owned real property used for economic development purposes by an
1693 eligible entity, where the acquisition price shall not exceed the
1694 appraised fair market value of the property.

1695 (d) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.



1696 (e) "Site development improvements" means site
1697 clearing, grading, and environmental mitigation; improvements to
1698 drainage systems; easement and right-of-way acquisition; sewer
1699 systems; transportation directly affecting the site, including
1700 roads, bridges or rail; bulkheads; taxiways and parking ramps;
1701 land reclamation; water supply (storage, treatment and
1702 distribution); telecommunications systems, including fiber optic;
1703 natural gas distribution systems; aesthetic improvements; the
1704 dredging of channels and basins; or other improvements as approved
1705 by MDA.

1706 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1707 special fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Site Development
1708 Grant Fund," which shall consist of funds made available by the
1709 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source
1710 designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts
1711 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1712 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or
1713 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the
1714 credit of the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used to make
1715 grants to assist eligible entities as provided in this section.

1716 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1717 of bonds issued under Section 2 of Chapter 390, Laws of 2017,
1718 Section 5 of Chapter 412, Laws of 2018, Section 1 of Chapter 421,
1719 Laws of 2019, Section 4 of Chapter 492, Laws of 2020, or Section 8
1720 of Chapter 480, Laws of 2021 or provided by the Legislature, may



1721 be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs
1722 incurred by MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan
1723 and financial incentive programs administered by MDA. An
1724 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1725 sought shall be maintained by MDA. Reimbursement of reasonable
1726 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1727 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1728 Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy
1729 any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1730 (3) (a) MDA shall establish a program to make grants to
1731 eligible entities to match local or other funds associated with
1732 improving the marketability of publicly owned industrial property
1733 for industrial economic development purposes and other property
1734 improvements as approved by MDA. An eligible entity may apply to
1735 MDA for a grant under this program in the manner provided for in
1736 this section. An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1737 section must provide matching funds in an amount determined by
1738 MDA. Matching funds may be provided in the form of cash and/or
1739 in-kind services as determined by MDA.

1740 (b) An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1741 section must submit an application to MDA. The application must
1742 include:

1743 (i) A description of the eligible expenditures for
1744 which assistance is requested;

1745 (ii) The amount of assistance requested;



(iii) The amount and type of matching funds to be provided by the eligible entity; and

(iv) Any other information required by MDA.

(c) Upon request by MDA, an eligible entity shall provide MDA with access to all studies, reports, documents and/or plans developed as a result of or related to an eligible entity receiving assistance under this section.

(4) MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and administer the program established under this section, and the department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the implementation of this section.

(5) MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing all assistance provided under this section.

SECTION 16. Section 57-61-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

57-61-21. (1) There is hereby created a special fund in the State Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Business Investment Fund dedicated to the purpose of providing grants and/or loans to municipalities for the purpose of providing for improvements authorized by this chapter. All monies received by the board to carry out the purposes of this chapter, by legislative appropriation, issuance of bonds or otherwise, shall be deposited



1771 into the Mississippi Business Investment Fund. Expenditures
1772 authorized herein shall be paid by the State Treasurer upon
1773 warrants drawn from the Mississippi Business Investment Fund, and
1774 the State Auditor, or his successor to such duties, shall issue
1775 warrants upon requisitions signed by the Chairman or Executive
1776 Director of the Mississippi * * * Development Authority.

1777 (2) Any monies repaid to the state from loans funded through
1778 the Mississippi Business Investment Fund shall be deposited into
1779 the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking Fund, which is hereby
1780 created in the State Treasury. Funds required in excess of the
1781 amounts available in the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking
1782 Fund to retire bonds issued pursuant to this chapter shall be
1783 appropriated from the State General Fund.

1784 (3) Monies in the fund which are derived from the proceeds
1785 of general obligation bonds or provided by the Legislature may be
1786 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1787 by the MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan and
1788 financial incentive programs administered by the MDA. An
1789 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1790 sought shall be maintained by the MDA. Reimbursement of
1791 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1792 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1793 provided by the Legislature.

1794 **SECTION 17.** Section 57-61-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1795 amended as follows:



1796 57-61-25. (1) The seller is authorized to borrow, on the
1797 credit of the state upon receipt of a resolution from the
1798 Mississippi Development Authority requesting the same, monies not
1799 exceeding the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Ninety-seven Million
1800 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$397,500,000.00), not including
1801 monies borrowed to refund outstanding bonds, notes or replacement
1802 notes, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this
1803 chapter. The rate of interest on any such bonds or notes which
1804 are not subject to taxation shall not exceed the rates set forth
1805 in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, for general
1806 obligation bonds.

1807 (2) As evidence of indebtedness authorized in this chapter,
1808 general or limited obligation bonds of the state shall be issued,
1809 from time to time, to provide monies necessary to carry out the
1810 purposes of this chapter for such total amounts, in such form, in
1811 such denominations payable in such currencies (either domestic or
1812 foreign, or both) and subject to such terms and conditions of
1813 issue, redemption and maturity, rate of interest and time of
1814 payment of interest as the seller directs, except that such bonds
1815 shall mature or otherwise be retired in annual installments
1816 beginning not more than five (5) years from date thereof and
1817 extending not more than thirty (30) years from date thereof.

1818 (3) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1819 chapter shall be signed by the chairman of the seller, or by his



1820 facsimile signature, and the official seal of the seller shall be
1821 affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the seller.

1822 (4) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1823 chapter may be general or limited obligations of the state, and
1824 the full faith and credit of the State of Mississippi as to
1825 general obligation bonds, or the revenues derived from projects
1826 assisted as to limited obligation bonds, are hereby pledged for
1827 the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and
1828 notes.

1829 (5) Such bonds and notes and the income therefrom shall be
1830 exempt from all taxation in the State of Mississippi.

1831 (6) The bonds may be issued as coupon bonds or registered as
1832 to both principal and interest, as the seller may determine. If
1833 interest coupons are attached, they shall contain the facsimile
1834 signature of the chairman and secretary of the seller.

1835 (7) The seller is authorized to provide, by resolution, for
1836 the issuance of refunding bonds for the purpose of refunding any
1837 debt issued under the provisions of this chapter and then
1838 outstanding, either by voluntary exchange with the holders of the
1839 outstanding debt or to provide funds to redeem and the costs of
1840 issuance and retirement of the debt, at maturity or at any call
1841 date. The issuance of the refunding bonds, the maturities and
1842 other details thereof, the rights of the holders thereof and the
1843 duties of the issuing officials in respect to the same shall be



1844 governed by the provisions of this section, insofar as they may be
1845 applicable.

1846 (8) As to bonds issued hereunder and designated as taxable
1847 bonds by the seller, any immunity of the state to taxation by the
1848 United States government of interest on bonds or notes issued by
1849 the state is hereby waived.

1850 (9) The proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1851 April 9, 2002, and any monies provided by the Legislature may be
1852 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1853 by the Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of
1854 the various grant, loan and financial incentive programs
1855 administered by the authority. An accounting of actual costs
1856 incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by
1857 the Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of
1858 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1859 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1860 provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection
1861 shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1862 **SECTION 18.** Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1863 amended as follows:

1864 65-4-15. (1) There is hereby established a special fund in
1865 the State Treasury to be known as the "Economic Development
1866 Highway Fund" which shall consist of such monies as the
1867 Legislature shall appropriate thereto or such other monies as the
1868 Legislature may designate to be deposited therein. Any monies to



1869 the credit of such fund may be expended by the Mississippi
1870 Department of Transportation or political subdivision, as
1871 appropriate, upon approval of requisitions therefor by the
1872 Mississippi Development Authority for any expenses incurred by the
1873 Transportation Department or political subdivision in constructing
1874 and improving highways and highway segments which have been
1875 approved by the Mississippi Development Authority under the
1876 provisions of this chapter. From and after July 1, 2004, no
1877 monies to the credit of the fund may be expended for the
1878 construction and improvement of highways for high economic benefit
1879 projects that are being developed for the primary purpose of
1880 conducting retail sales unless the Mississippi Development
1881 Authority has received an application for the project prior to
1882 July 1, 2004; however, the primary purpose is not conducting
1883 retail sales if the project is a mixed-use development for which
1884 retail space is no more than twenty percent (20%) of the square
1885 footage of the development. With regard to a high economic
1886 benefit project as defined in Section 65-4-5(1)(c)(xiii) for which
1887 the Mississippi Development Authority approved and allocated
1888 monies in the fund before January 1, 2016, for constructing or
1889 improving a highway or highway segment related to the high
1890 economic benefit project, the Mississippi Development Authority
1891 may reallocate such monies from the original highway or highway
1892 segment purpose and allocate the funds for constructing or
1893 improving another highway or highway segment provided that such



1894 highway or highway segment is located within three (3) miles of
1895 the high economic benefit project for which the Mississippi
1896 Development Authority originally allocated and approved the
1897 monies. The Office of State Aid Road Construction shall be
1898 entitled to reimbursement from monies in the fund, upon approval
1899 by the Mississippi Development Authority of requisitions therefor
1900 by the State Aid Engineer, for the actual expenses incurred by the
1901 office in administering and providing engineering services to
1902 political subdivisions. Monies remaining unexpended to the credit
1903 of such special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1904 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on the
1905 investment of monies in the special fund shall be deposited to the
1906 credit of the fund.

1907 (2) Monies in the Economic Development Highway Fund which
1908 are derived from proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1909 July 1, 2003, or provided by the Legislature may be used to
1910 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
1911 Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of the
1912 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1913 by the authority. An accounting of actual costs incurred for
1914 which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the
1915 Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of reasonable
1916 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1917 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1918 Legislature. Reimbursements to the Mississippi Development



1919 Authority under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
1920 federal tax law requirements.

1921 **SECTION 19.** Section 57-1-221, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1922 amended as follows:

1923 57-1-221. (1) As used in this section:

1924 (a) "Approved business enterprise" means any project
1925 that:

1926 (i) Locates or expands in this state, including
1927 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1928 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of two hundred fifty
1929 (250) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1930 state of a minimum of Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) in
1931 Tier 1 or Tier 2 counties;

1932 (ii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1933 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1934 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one hundred fifty
1935 (150) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1936 state of a minimum of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) in
1937 areas federally designated as low-income census tracts;

1938 (iii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1939 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1940 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one thousand
1941 (1,000) new, full-time jobs;

1942 (iv) Is a manufacturer of high-end kitchen
1943 appliances having at least four hundred (400) employees working at



1944 its Mississippi facilities on January 1, 2015, and with a capital
1945 investment of at least Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) made
1946 after July 1, 2014, through four (4) years after July 1, 2015,
1947 that expands in this state, including any federal Indian
1948 reservation located within the geographical boundary of this
1949 state, and retains a minimum of four hundred (400) jobs; or

1950 (v) Locates or expands in this state, including
1951 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1952 boundary of this state, with significant regional impact as
1953 determined by MDA.

1954 (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1955 (c) "Facility related to the project" means and
1956 includes any of the following, as they may pertain to the project:

1957 (i) Facilities to provide potable and industrial
1958 water supply systems, sewage and waste disposal systems and water,
1959 natural gas and electric transmission systems to the site of the
1960 project;

1961 (ii) Building facilities and equipment necessary
1962 to operate the facility;

1963 (iii) Rail lines;

1964 (iv) Airports, airfields, air terminals and port
1965 facilities;

1966 (v) Highways, streets and other roadways; and

1967 (vi) Fire protection facilities, equipment and
1968 elevated water tanks.



1969 (d) "Project" means any industrial, commercial,
1970 research and development, warehousing, distribution,
1971 transportation, processing, mining, United States government or
1972 tourism enterprise together with all real property required for
1973 construction, maintenance and operation of the enterprise that is
1974 approved by the MDA. The term "project" does not include any
1975 medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi
1976 Medical Cannabis Act.

1977 (2) (a) There is created a special fund in the State
1978 Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Industry Incentive
1979 Financing Revolving Fund which shall consist of monies from any
1980 source designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1981 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1982 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1983 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Except as
1984 otherwise provided, monies in the fund shall be disbursed by the
1985 Mississippi Development Authority for the purposes authorized in
1986 subsection (3) of this section. The Mississippi Development
1987 Authority shall allocate and disburse Thirty Million Dollars
1988 (\$30,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Mississippi State
1989 University for the construction, furnishing and equipping of a
1990 high-performance computing data center that is home to federally
1991 designated centers of computing excellence. The disbursement of
1992 such funds shall not be subject to any requirements of this
1993 section relating to grants and loans made by the Mississippi



1994 Development Authority under this section. The Mississippi
1995 Development Authority shall allocate and disburse Three Million
1996 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Delta Health
1997 System for capital costs related to hospital systems expansion.
1998 The disbursement of such funds shall not be subject to any
1999 requirements of this section relating to grants and loans made by
2000 the Mississippi Development Authority under this section. The
2001 Mississippi Development Authority shall disburse such funds to
2002 Delta Health System not later than thirty (30) days after April
2003 22, 2021.

2004 (b) Monies in the fund that are derived from the
2005 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
2006 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
2007 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
2008 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
2009 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
2010 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
2011 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
2012 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
2013 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
2014 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
2015 requirements.

2016 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants or
2017 loans from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
2018 Fund to local governments, including, but not limited to,



counties, municipalities, industrial development authorities and economic development districts, and approved business enterprises to construct or otherwise provide facilities related to the project. Local governments are authorized to accept grants and enter into loans authorized under the program, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of a project or any property related to the project in whole or in part.

(4) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any business enterprise or local government desiring a grant or loan under this section shall submit an application to the MDA which shall include, at a minimum:

(i) Evidence that the business or industry meets the definition of an approved business enterprise;

(ii) A description, including the cost, of the requested assistance;

(iii) A description of the purpose for which the assistance is requested; and

(iv) Any other information required by the MDA.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the MDA shall require that binding commitments be entered into requiring that:

(i) The minimum requirements of this section and such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met; and



(ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the MDA shall be repaid.

(c) Upon receipt of the application from a business enterprise or local government for a grant or loan under this section, the MDA shall determine whether the enterprise meets the definition of an approved business enterprise and determine whether to provide the assistance requested in the form of a grant or a loan.

(d) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) (a) of this section, the MDA shall have sole discretion in providing grants or loans under this section. The terms of a grant or loan provided under this section and the manner of repayment of any loan shall be within the discretion of the MDA. Repayments of loans made under this section shall be deposited to the credit of the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund until the uncommitted balance in the fund reaches Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00). Once the uncommitted balance in the fund reaches Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), repayments of loans under this section shall be deposited to the credit of Fund No. 3951 in the State Treasury to pay debt service on bonds until such time as the uncommitted balance in the fund falls below Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00).

(e) The MDA shall notify the Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means



Committee of the approval of any grant or loan application thirty (30) days prior to the disbursement of any monies for the loan or grant from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund. The notification shall identify the applicant and the purposes for which the loan or grant is made.

(5) (a) Contracts, by local governments, including, but not limited to, design and construction contracts, for the acquisition, purchase, construction or installation of a project shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 31-7-13 if:

(i) The MDA finds and records such finding on its minutes, that because of availability or the particular nature of a project, it would not be in the public interest or would less effectively achieve the purposes of this section to enter into such contracts on the basis of Section 31-7-13; and

(ii) The approved business enterprise that is involved in the project concurs in such finding.

(b) When the requirements of paragraph (a) of this subsection are met:

(i) The requirements of Section 31-7-13 shall not apply to such contracts; and

(ii) The contracts may be entered into on the basis of negotiation.

(6) It is the policy of the MDA and the MDA is authorized to accommodate and support any enterprise that receives a loan under this section for a project defined in Section 17-25-23 that wishes



to have a program of diversity in contracting, and/or that wishes to do business with or cause its prime contractor to do business with Mississippi companies, including those companies that are small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act (15 USCS 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the purposes of this subsection.

(7) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for the implementation of this section.

SECTION 20. Section 57-1-601, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

57-1-601. (1) For the purposes of this section, the following words shall have the following meanings ascribed in this section, unless the context clearly otherwise requires:

(a) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

(b) "Municipality" means any municipality with a population of less than fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest federal decennial census at the time the municipality submits an application to the MDA under this section.



2117 (c) "Revitalization zone" means an area in the
2118 municipality officially designated by ordinance or resolution of
2119 the governing authorities of the municipality as a revitalization
2120 zone and approved and certified by the MDA as meeting the
2121 requirements of this section.

2122 (2) (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special
2123 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Main Street Investment
2124 Grant Fund" which shall consist of funds from any source
2125 designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
2126 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
2127 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
2128 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in
2129 the fund shall be used by the MDA for the purposes authorized in
2130 subsection (3) of this section.

2131 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
2132 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
2133 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
2134 necessary costs incurred by the MDA in providing grants under this
2135 section through the use of proceeds of such general obligation
2136 bonds. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
2137 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained for the program.
2138 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs for
2139 assistance shall not exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of
2140 bonds issued for such assistance or the monies provided by the



2141 Legislature. Reimbursements made under this subsection shall
2142 satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

2143 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants to a
2144 municipality to assist with maintaining and improving the
2145 viability of revitalization zones. The proceeds of a grant made
2146 to a municipality under this section may be used for maintaining
2147 and/or improving the viability of a revitalization zone through
2148 means deemed appropriate by the governing authorities of a
2149 municipality, including, but not limited to, making loans, grants
2150 and/or other forms of assistance to any person or public or
2151 private association or other entity for use for infrastructure
2152 projects, improvements to properties, signage and other purposes
2153 related to maintaining and/or improving the viability of the
2154 revitalization zone.

2155 (4) (a) If a municipality desires a grant under this
2156 section, the municipality shall submit an application to the MDA
2157 seeking (i) approval and certification of the proposed
2158 revitalization zone and (ii) a grant for the purposes authorized
2159 in this section. The application shall include, at a minimum:

2160 1. The name of the proposed revitalization
2161 zone, together with the words, "revitalization zone";

2162 2. A description of the revitalization zone
2163 by metes and bounds;



2164 3. A map showing the parcels of real property
2165 included in the revitalization zone and the present use of such
2166 parcels;

2167 4. A master plan for the revitalization zone
2168 that has been approved by sixty percent (60%) of the property
2169 owners within the zone at the time the municipality submits the
2170 application; and

2171 5. Any other information required by the MDA.
2172 The governing authorities of a municipality may designate the
2173 boundaries of a proposed revitalization zone by adoption of an
2174 ordinance or resolution that is spread upon its minutes and
2175 describes the boundaries of the zone.

2176 (b) The MDA shall review the application to confirm
2177 that the revitalization zone meets the requirements of this
2178 section. A revitalization zone may embrace two (2) or more
2179 separate parcels of real property, and such property may be
2180 publicly and/or privately owned. Each revitalization zone shall
2181 be of such size and form as to include all properties that, in the
2182 determination of the municipality and the MDA, constitute an
2183 integral part of the revitalization zone. If the MDA determines
2184 that the boundaries of the proposed revitalization zone exceed the
2185 area that is reasonably deemed to be integral to the
2186 revitalization zone, the MDA may reduce the boundaries of the
2187 proposed area. Upon the approval and selection of a municipal



2188 revitalization zone project, the MDA shall certify the
2189 revitalization zone.

2190 (5) The MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
2191 administer the program established under this section, and the MDA
2192 shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the
2193 Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the
2194 implementation of this section.

2195 **SECTION 21.** Section 17-23-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
2196 amended as follows:

2197 17-23-21. There is created in the State Treasury a special
2198 fund to be designated as the "Annual Fire Fund" to be administered
2199 by the Commissioner of Insurance. Monies in the fund, upon
2200 appropriation by the Legislature, may be used by the commissioner
2201 only for the purpose of his or her discretion in requesting the
2202 State Fiscal Officer, and notifying the Legislative Budget Office
2203 of such, to transfer funds from this fund to the Rural Fire Truck
2204 Fund, the Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Fund, the Municipal Fire
2205 Protection Fund and/or the County Volunteer Fire Department Fund;
2206 however, the commissioner shall request the State Fiscal Officer
2207 to transfer at least One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
2208 (\$1,500,000.00) annually to the Rural and Supplementary Rural Fire
2209 Truck Funds. Upon the request of the commissioner, the State
2210 Fiscal Officer shall transfer the requested amounts from the
2211 Annual Fire Fund to the Rural Fire Truck Fund, the Supplementary
2212 Rural Fire Truck Fund, the Municipal Fire Protection Fund and/or



2213 the County Volunteer Fire Department Fund. The total amount of
2214 all such transfers shall not exceed the amount appropriated by the
2215 Legislature from the Annual Fire Fund for the fiscal year in which
2216 the transfers are made, and those transfers shall not reduce the
2217 amount of the spending authority provided to the commissioner by
2218 that appropriation. The commissioner shall document those
2219 transfers through a reconciliation with the Department of Finance
2220 and Administration. * * * The Annual Fire Fund shall consist of
2221 monies provided to it through the provisions of Section
2222 83-34-4(6), and any monies which may be appropriated to it by the
2223 Legislature. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end
2224 of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and
2225 any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to
2226 the credit of the fund.

2227 **SECTION 22.** Section 65-1-183, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
2228 amended as follows:

2229 65-1-183. There is created in the State Treasury a special
2230 fund to be designated as the "2022 Infrastructure Match Fund,"
2231 which shall consist of funds made available by the Legislature in
2232 any manner and funds from any other source designated for deposit
2233 into such fund. The fund shall be maintained by the State
2234 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
2235 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
2236 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
2237 State General Fund, and any investment earnings or interest earned

2243 Highway Administration appropriations and from the supplemental
2244 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) appropriations. The
2245 Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer funds from
2246 the 2022 Infrastructure Match Fund to the department's agency
2247 support fund subject to the following provisions: The total
2248 amount of all such transfers shall not exceed the amount
2249 appropriated by the Legislature from the 2022 Infrastructure Match
2250 Fund for the fiscal year in which the transfers are made, and
2251 those transfers shall not reduce the amount of the spending
2252 authority provided to the department by that appropriation. The
2253 department shall document those transfers through a reconciliation
2254 with the Department of Finance and Administration.

2255 **SECTION 23.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
