# Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

94 SECTION 1. Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 95 amended as follows:

27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the 96 97 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the 98 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State 99 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from 100 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in 101 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the 102 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings 103 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end 2224 of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and 2225 any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to 2226 the credit of the fund.

2227 SECTION 22. Section 65-1-183, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 2228 amended as follows:
