## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1020

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 46 **SECTION 1.** (1) There shall be three (3) temporary special
- 47 circuit judges for the Seventh Circuit Court District with no
- 48 limitation whatsoever upon the powers and duties of the said
- 49 judges other than as cast upon them by the Constitution and laws
- 50 of this state.
- 51 (2) There shall be two (2) temporary special circuit judges
- 52 for the Seventh Circuit Court District with the limitation upon
- 53 the powers and duties of the judges authorized under this
- 54 subsection that the judges shall hear only criminal matters, as
- 55 well as those limitations cast upon them by the Constitution and
- 56 laws of this state.
- 57 (3) No later than fifteen (15) days after the passage of
- 58 this act, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall appoint the
- 59 judges authorized under this section. The Chief Justice of the
- 60 Supreme Court may elect to reappoint circuit judges currently
- 61 serving on a temporary basis in the Seventh Circuit Court
- 62 District.

- 63 (4) This section shall stand repealed on December 1, 2026.
- 64 **SECTION 2.** The public defender of the Seventh Circuit Court
- 65 District may appoint three (3) full-time assistant public
- 66 defenders in addition to those appointed under Section 25-32-3.
- 67 Said full-time assistant public defenders shall receive
- 68 compensation in an amount equal to full-time assistant public
- 69 defenders in the Seventh Circuit Court District subject to
- 70 available funds specifically appropriated therefor by the
- 71 Legislature.
- 72 **SECTION**  $\underline{3}$ . Section 19-23-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 73 amended as follows:
- 74 19-23-21. (1) The county attorney of any county bordering
- 75 on the Gulf of Mexico and having two (2) judicial districts may
- 76 appoint an assistant county attorney from the judicial district in
- 77 which the county attorney does not reside, to serve for a term
- 78 commensurate with the county attorney; the assistant county
- 79 attorney shall receive the same salary, mileage expense account
- 80 and secretarial assistance as provided by law for the county
- 81 attorney and shall have the same duties and powers as the county
- 82 attorney, subject to the direction of the county attorney.
- 83 (2) (a) The county attorney of any county housing the seat
- 84 of state government, wherein U.S. Highways 80 and 49 intersect,
- 85 and having two (2) judicial districts, may appoint two (2)
- 86 temporary assistant county attorneys; the temporary assistant
- 87 county attorneys shall receive the same salary, mileage expense
- 88 account and secretarial assistance as provided by law for the

- 89 county attorney to be paid from funds specifically appropriated
- 90 therefor by the Legislature; the temporary assistant county
- 91 attorneys shall have the same duties and powers as the county
- 92 attorney, subject to the direction of the county attorney.
- 93 (b) This subsection shall stand repealed on December 1,
- 94 2026.
- 95 **SECTION**  $\underline{\mathbf{4}}$ . Section 9-7-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 96 amended as follows:
- 97 9-7-25. (1) There shall be four (4) circuit judges for the
- 98 Seventh Circuit Court District. One (1) judge shall be elected
- 99 from each subdistrict as provided by Section 9-7-23(2)(a) through
- 100 (d).
- 101 (2) While there shall be no limitation whatsoever upon the
- 102 powers and duties of the said judges other than as cast upon them
- 103 by the Constitution and laws of this state, the court in the First
- 104 Judicial District of Hinds County, in the discretion of the senior
- 105 circuit judge, may be divided into civil and criminal divisions as
- 106 a matter of convenience, by the entry of an order upon the minutes
- 107 of the court.
- 108 (3) By October 1, 2023, the clerk of the Seventh Circuit
- 109 Court District in conjunction with the Administrative Office of
- 110 Courts shall provide case disposition and caseload data in the
- 111 district from January 1, 2017, to September 15, 2023, to the
- 112 Chairs of the Senate Judiciary, Division A and the House Judiciary
- 113 A Committees and the Chairs of the Senate and House Appropriations
- 114 Committees for the purpose of assisting the Legislature in its

- 115 <u>consideration to authorize one (1) circuit judge for the Seventh</u>
- 116 <u>Circuit Court District in addition to the judges authorized in</u>
- 117 <u>subsection</u> (1) of this section. Any judge to be authorized under
- 118 this subsection shall be elected from the subdistrict as provided
- 119 by Section 9-7-23(2)(e).
- 120 **SECTION 5.** Section 9-7-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 121 amended as follows:
- 122 9-7-23. (1) The Seventh Circuit Court District shall be
- 123 Hinds County.
- 124 (2) The Seventh Circuit Court District shall be divided into
- 125 four (4) subdistricts in Hinds County as follows:
- 126 (a) Subdistrict 7-1 shall consist of the following
- 127 precincts in Hinds County: 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 32, 33, 34,
- 128 35, 36, 44, 45, 46, 47, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 92, 93, 96
- 129 and 97.
- 130 (b) Subdistrict 7-2 shall consist of the following
- 131 precincts in Hinds County: 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 23, 27,
- 132 28, 29, 30, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85,
- 133 Brownsville, Cynthia, Pocahontas and Tinnin.
- 134 (c) Subdistrict 7-3 shall consist of the following
- 135 precincts in Hinds County: 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 24, 25, 26, 31,
- 136 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 66,
- 137 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 86, 89, and Jackson State.
- 138 (d) Subdistrict 7-4 shall consist of the following
- 139 precincts in Hinds County: 87, 88, 90, 91, 94, 95, Bolton, Byram
- 140 1, Byram 2, Cayuga, Chapel Hill, Clinton 1, Clinton 2, Clinton 3,

- 141 Clinton 4, Clinton 5, Clinton 6, Dry Grove, Edwards, Learned, Old
- 142 Byram, Pinehaven, Raymond 1, Raymond 2, Spring Ridge, St. Thomas,
- 143 Terry, Utica 1 and Utica 2.
- 144 (e) Subdistrict 7-5 shall consist of the precincts in
- 145 Hinds County to be determined by the Legislature before January 1,
- 146 2026.
- 147 **SECTION 6.** (1) Subject to the availability of funds
- 148 specifically appropriated therefor, the Department of Public
- 149 Safety shall:
- 150 (a) Issue all patrol law enforcement officers within
- 151 the Office of Capitol Police body-worn cameras which shall be worn
- 152 on the uniforms of the patrol officers; and
- 153 (b) Equip all patrol vehicles used by law enforcement
- 154 officers within the Office of Capitol Police with vehicle cameras.
- 155 (2) Body-worn cameras and vehicle cameras required under
- 156 this section shall be kept in good working condition and shall be
- 157 operational while an officer or vehicle is on patrol.
- 158 (3) As used in this section the following words have the
- 159 meaning herein ascribed unless the context clearly requires
- 160 otherwise:
- 161 (a) "Body-worn camera" means a device that is worn by a
- 162 law enforcement officer which has the capability of electronically
- 163 recording audio and video of the activities of the officer.
- 164 (b) "Vehicle camera" means a device that is equipped to
- 165 a law enforcement vehicle which has the capability of

- electronically recording audio and video of the activities of the vehicle's surroundings.
- SECTION  $\underline{\underline{7}}$ . Section 45-1-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 169 amended as follows:
- 170 45-1-19. (1) The Department of Public Safety, through the
- 171 Office of Capitol Police, shall have jurisdiction relative to the
- 172 enforcement of all laws of the State of Mississippi on the
- 173 properties, from curb to curb, including adjoining streets,
- 174 sidewalks and leased parking lots within the Capitol Complex, set
- 175 forth in Section 29-5-2, the Governor's Mansion, the Court of
- 176 Appeals Building, the Mississippi Department of Transportation
- 177 Building and the Public Employees' Retirement System Building, and
- 178 any property purchased, constructed or otherwise acquired by the
- 179 State of Mississippi for conducting state business and not
- 180 specifically under the supervision and care by any other state
- 181 entity, but which is reasonably assumed the Department of Public
- 182 Safety would be responsible for such. The Department of Public
- 183 Safety shall, through any person or persons appointed by the
- 184 commissioner, make arrests for any violation of any law of the
- 185 State of Mississippi on the grounds of or within those properties.
- 186 The Department of Public Safety shall, in addition, enforce the
- 187 provisions of this section and Sections 29-5-57 through 29-5-67,
- 188 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81 through 29-5-95, and
- 189 prescribe such rules and regulations as are necessary therefor.
- 190 The powers and duties related to the administration of Sections
- 29-5-57 through 29-5-67, 29-5-73 through 29-5-75, and 29-5-81

- through 29-5-95 shall remain with the Department of Finance and Administration.
- 194 Subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of 195 State Institutions of Higher Learning, the Board of Trustees and 196 the Department of Public Safety shall be authorized to enter into 197 a contract for the Department of Public Safety to supply the 198 security personnel with jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the 199 State of Mississippi on the property of the Board of Trustees 200 located at the corner of Ridgewood Road and Lakeland Drive in the 201 City of Jackson.
- 202 (3) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of 203 Agriculture are authorized to enter into a contract for the 204 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all 205 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the Department 206 of Agriculture located at 121 North Jefferson Street and the new 207 Farmers Market Building located at the corner of High and 208 Jefferson Streets in the City of Jackson, Hinds County, 209 Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 210 Department of Public Safety will not post any security personnel 211 at such buildings, but will provide regular vehicle patrols and
- 213 (4) The Department of Public Safety and the Mississippi Fair
  214 Commission are authorized to enter into a contract for the
  215 Department of Public Safety to have jurisdiction and enforce all
  216 laws of the State of Mississippi on the property of the
  217 Mississippi Fair Commission known as the "Mississippi State"
- 217 Mississippi Fair Commission known as the "Mississippi State

responses to security system alarms.

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- 218 Fairgrounds Complex" and any and all of its outlying buildings and
- 219 property. The Department of Public Safety and the Mississippi
- 220 Fair Commission are authorized to enter into a contract for the
- 221 Department of Public Safety to supply the security personnel to
- 222 the Mississippi Fair Commission with jurisdiction to enforce all
- 223 laws of the State of Mississippi on this property and any and all
- 224 buildings on this property.
- 225 (5) The Department of Public Safety and the Department of
- 226 Revenue are authorized to enter into a contract for the Department
- 227 of Public Safety to supply the security personnel with
- 228 jurisdiction to enforce all laws of the State of Mississippi at
- 229 the Alcoholic Beverage Control facility and the Department of
- 230 Revenue main office.
- 231 (6) The Department of Public Safety shall have jurisdiction
- 232 relative to the enforcement of all laws of the State of
- 233 Mississippi within the boundaries of the Capitol Complex
- 234 Improvement District created in Section 29-5-203 and within the
- 235 boundaries of the City of Jackson, Mississippi. The Department of
- 236 Public Safety shall, through any person or persons appointed by
- 237 the Department of Public Safety, make arrests for any violation of
- 238 any law of the State of Mississippi which occurs within the
- 239 boundaries of the district and the City of Jackson. The
- 240 jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety granted under this
- 241 subsection (6) shall be concurrent with the jurisdiction of the
- 242 City of Jackson, Mississippi, and that of Hinds County,
- 243 Mississippi. At any time and/or during any event necessitating

244 the coordination of and/or utilization at multiple jurisdictions

245 <u>within the Capitol Complex Improvement District</u>, as determined by

246 the Chief of Capitol Police or the Commissioner, the Department of

247 Public Safety shall be the lead agency when the event occurs on

248 property as defined herein that is owned or leased by the state as

249 provided in subsection (1) of this section. Written authorization

250 of the Chief of the Capitol Police or the Commissioner shall be

251 required prior to the approval of any event which is to take place

252 on any street or sidewalk immediately adjacent to any building or

253 property owned or occupied by any official, agency, board,

254 commission, office or other entity of the State of Mississippi, or

255 which can reasonably be expected to block, impede or otherwise

256 hinder ingress thereto and/or egress therefrom. The jurisdiction

257 and authority of the Department of Public Safety under this

258 subsection (6) shall be in addition to any other jurisdiction and

259 authority provided to the department under this section or any

260 other law.

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261 (7) The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter

262 into a contract with any county for the county to take custody of

the misdemeanor offenders arrested under the authority granted

264 under this section.

265 (8) All accrued personal leave earned pursuant to Section

266 25-3-93, accrued major medical leave earned pursuant to Section

267 25-3-95, accrued state compensatory leave earned pursuant to

268 Section 25-3-92, and compensatory leave earned pursuant to the

269 Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) shall transfer from the Department

- 270 of Finance and Administration to the Department of Public Safety
- 271 for all employees transferred under this section.
- 272 **SECTION (8).** (1) The Commissioner of the Department of
- 273 Public Safety, the City of Jackson and the Sheriff of Hinds County
- 274 may enter into a Memorandum of Understanding detailing the
- 275 expectations of the parties concerning the enforcement of all laws
- 276 of the State of Mississippi within the boundaries of the City of
- 277 Jackson, Mississippi.
- 278 (2) A copy of any said executed memorandum shall be provided
- 279 to the Department of Finance and Administration, and the Chairs of
- 280 the Senate and House Appropriations Committees.
- 281 (3) The execution of or failure to execute such a memorandum
- 282 shall not affect any grant of jurisdiction under Section 45-1-19.
- 283 **SECTION 9.** Candidates for the judgeship authorized in
- 284 Section 9-7-25(2) shall qualify as provided by Section 23-15-977
- 285 and shall run for office and be elected as provided in Sections
- 286 23-15-974 through 23-15-985 (Nonpartisan Judicial Election Act).
- 287 The term of the office of the circuit court judgeship authorized
- in Section 9-7-25(2) shall begin on January 1, 2027, and their
- 289 terms shall continue for four (4) years as is otherwise provided
- 290 by law.
- 291 **SECTION 10.** Except for Section 8 of this act, this act shall
- 292 take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023, and shall
- 293 <u>stand repealed on June 30, 2023</u>. Section 8 of this act shall take
- 294 effect and be in force from and after October 1, 2023, and shall
- 295 <u>stand repealed on September 30, 2023</u>.
