

Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1089

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

42 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
43 amended as follows:

44 27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the
45 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the
46 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
47 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
48 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
49 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
50 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
51 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.

52 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed by the
53 Department of Finance and Administration as follows:

54 (a) To the Department of Archives and History for the
55 purpose of providing a grant to the Scott Ford House, Inc., to
56 develop the property located at 136 East Cohea Street in the City
57 of Jackson, the home of the former slave Mary Scott Green, to tell
58 her story and that of other Mississippi midwives, and to develop

60 Jackson as a house museum to tell the family story of the midwife

1159 **SECTION 3.** Section 57-1-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1160 amended as follows:

1161 57-1-16. (1) As used in this section:

1162 (a) "Extraordinary economic development opportunity"
1163 means a new or expanded business or industry which maintains a
1164 strong financial condition and minimal credit risk and creates
1165 substantial employment, particularly in areas of high
1166 unemployment. The term "extraordinary economic development
1167 opportunity" does not include any medical cannabis establishment
1168 as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

1169 (b) "Local economic development entities" means state
1170 institutions of higher learning or public or private nonprofit
1171 local economic development entities including, but not limited to,
1172 chambers of commerce, local authorities, commissions or other
1173 entities created by local and private legislation or districts
1174 created pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1175 (c) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1176 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1177 special fund to be designated as the ACE Fund, which shall consist
1178 of money from any public or private source designated for deposit

1179 into such fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the
1180 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund,
1181 and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited
1182 to the credit of the fund. The purpose of the fund shall be to
1183 assist in maximizing extraordinary economic development
1184 opportunities related to any new or expanded business or industry
1185 or to assist a local unit of government as authorized in
1186 subsection (5) of this section. Such funds may be used to make
1187 grants to local economic development entities to assist any new or
1188 expanding business or industry that meets the criteria provided in
1189 this section when such assistance aids the consummation of a
1190 project within the State of Mississippi, including any federal
1191 Indian reservation located within the geographical boundary of
1192 Mississippi, or to make grants to a local unit of government as
1193 authorized in subsection (5) of this section.

1194 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1195 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1196 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1197 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1198 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1199 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1200 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1201 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1202 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1203 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under

1204 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1205 requirements.

1206 (3) The MDA shall establish a grant program to make grants
1207 from the ACE Fund created under this section. Local economic
1208 development entities may apply to the MDA for a grant under this
1209 section in the manner provided for in subsection (4) of this
1210 section. Local units of government may apply to the MDA for a
1211 grant under this section in the manner provided in subsection (5)
1212 of this section.

1213 (4) (a) Any business or industry desiring assistance from a
1214 local economic development entity under this section shall submit
1215 an application to the local economic development entity which
1216 shall include, at a minimum:

1217 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1218 the definition of an extraordinary economic development
1219 opportunity;

1220 (ii) A demonstration that the business or industry
1221 is at an economic disadvantage by locating the new or expanded
1222 project in the county;

1223 (iii) A description, including the cost, of the
1224 requested assistance;

1225 (iv) A description of the purpose for which the
1226 assistance is requested;

1227 (v) A two-year business plan;

1228 (vi) Financial statements or tax returns for the
1229 three (3) years immediately prior to the application;

1230 (vii) Credit reports on all persons or entities
1231 with a twenty percent (20%) or greater interest in the business or
1232 industry; and

1233 (viii) Any other information required by the MDA.

1234 (b) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1235 entered into requiring that:

1236 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1237 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1238 and

1239 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1240 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1241 MDA shall be repaid.

1242 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business or
1243 industry, the local economic development entity may apply to the
1244 MDA for assistance under this section. Such application must
1245 contain evidence that the business or industry meets the
1246 definition of an extraordinary economic development opportunity, a
1247 demonstration that the business or industry is at an economic
1248 disadvantage by locating the new or expanded project in the
1249 county, a description, including the cost, of the requested
1250 assistance, and a statement of what efforts have been made or are
1251 being made by the business or industry for securing or qualifying
1252 for other local, state, federal or private funds for the project.

1253 (d) The MDA shall have sole discretion in the awarding
1254 of ACE funds, provided that the business or industry and the local
1255 economic development entity have met the statutory requirements of

1256 this section. However, in making grants under this section, the
1257 MDA shall attempt to provide for an equitable distribution of such
1258 grants among each of the congressional districts of this state in
1259 order to promote economic development across the entire state.

1260 (5) (a) The MDA may make grants to local units of
1261 government to assist the local unit of government in purchasing
1262 real property for the benefit of an existing industry that commits
1263 to maintain a minimum of one thousand three hundred (1,300) jobs
1264 for a minimum of ten (10) years after the date the grant is made.
1265 The MDA shall not make grants under this subsection to assist
1266 local units of government for the benefit of any medical cannabis
1267 establishment as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

1268 (b) Any local unit of government seeking a grant
1269 authorized under this subsection shall apply to MDA. The
1270 application shall contain such information as the MDA may require.

1271 (c) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1272 entered into requiring that:

1273 (i) The minimum requirements of this subsection
1274 and such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be
1275 met; and

1276 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1277 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1278 MDA shall be repaid.

1279 (6) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1280 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1281 the implementation of this section. However, before the

1282 implementation of any such rules and regulations, they shall be
1283 submitted to a committee consisting of five (5) members of the
1284 Senate Finance Committee and five (5) members of the House of
1285 Representatives Ways and Means Committee, appointed by the
1286 respective committee chairmen.

1287 **SECTION 4.** Section 57-1-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1288 amended as follows:

1289 57-1-701. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1290 following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in
1291 this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1292 (a) "Eligible entity" means any (i) county, (ii)
1293 municipality or (iii) public or private nonprofit local economic
1294 development entity including, but not limited to, local
1295 authorities, commissions, or other entities created by local and
1296 private legislation or pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1297 (b) "Optioned property" means industrial property that
1298 is subject to a real estate option to purchase contract entered
1299 into between an eligible entity and a real estate owner, where
1300 such option shall be for a minimum of three (3) years and the
1301 option price shall not exceed the appraised fair market value of
1302 the real estate.

1303 (c) "Eligible expenditures" means:

1304 (i) Fees for architects, engineers, environmental
1305 consultants, attorneys, and such other advisors, consultants and
1306 agents that MDA determines are necessary to complete site due
1307 diligence associated with site development improvements located on

1308 industrial property that is publicly owned or is optioned
1309 property;

1310 (ii) Contributions toward site development
1311 improvements, as approved by MDA, located on industrial property
1312 that is publicly owned;

1313 (iii) Contributions toward public infrastructure
1314 improvements directly serving industrial property that is publicly
1315 owned or is optioned property; and/or

1316 (iv) Contributions toward acquisition of publicly
1317 owned real property used for economic development purposes by an
1318 eligible entity, where the acquisition price shall not exceed the
1319 appraised fair market value of the property.

1320 (d) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1321 (e) "Site development improvements" means site
1322 clearing, grading, and environmental mitigation; improvements to
1323 drainage systems; easement and right-of-way acquisition; sewer
1324 systems; transportation directly affecting the site, including
1325 roads, bridges or rail; bulkheads; taxiways and parking ramps;
1326 land reclamation; water supply (storage, treatment and
1327 distribution); telecommunications systems, including fiber optic;
1328 natural gas distribution systems; aesthetic improvements; the
1329 dredging of channels and basins; or other improvements as approved
1330 by MDA.

1331 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1332 special fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Site Development
1333 Grant Fund," which shall consist of funds made available by the

1334 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source
1335 designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts
1336 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1337 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or
1338 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the
1339 credit of the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used to make
1340 grants to assist eligible entities as provided in this section.

1341 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1342 of bonds issued under Section 2 of Chapter 390, Laws of 2017,
1343 Section 5 of Chapter 412, Laws of 2018, Section 1 of Chapter 421,
1344 Laws of 2019, Section 4 of Chapter 492, Laws of 2020, or Section 8
1345 of Chapter 480, Laws of 2021 or provided by the Legislature, may
1346 be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs
1347 incurred by MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan
1348 and financial incentive programs administered by MDA. An
1349 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1350 sought shall be maintained by MDA. Reimbursement of reasonable
1351 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1352 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1353 Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy
1354 any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1355 (3) (a) MDA shall establish a program to make grants to
1356 eligible entities to match local or other funds associated with
1357 improving the marketability of publicly owned industrial property
1358 for industrial economic development purposes and other property
1359 improvements as approved by MDA. An eligible entity may apply to

1360 MDA for a grant under this program in the manner provided for in
1361 this section. An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1362 section must provide matching funds in an amount determined by
1363 MDA. Matching funds may be provided in the form of cash and/or
1364 in-kind services as determined by MDA.

1365 (b) An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1366 section must submit an application to MDA. The application must
1367 include:

1368 (i) A description of the eligible expenditures for
1369 which assistance is requested;

1370 (ii) The amount of assistance requested;

1371 (iii) The amount and type of matching funds to be
1372 provided by the eligible entity; and

1373 (iv) Any other information required by MDA.

1374 (c) Upon request by MDA, an eligible entity shall
1375 provide MDA with access to all studies, reports, documents and/or
1376 plans developed as a result of or related to an eligible entity
1377 receiving assistance under this section.

1378 (4) MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
1379 administer the program established under this section, and the
1380 department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance
1381 with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for
1382 the implementation of this section.

1383 (5) MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the
1384 Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of

1385 Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing
1386 all assistance provided under this section.

1387 **SECTION 5.** Section 57-61-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1388 amended as follows:

1389 57-61-21. (1) There is hereby created a special fund in the
1390 State Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Business Investment
1391 Fund dedicated to the purpose of providing grants and/or loans to
1392 municipalities for the purpose of providing for improvements
1393 authorized by this chapter. All monies received by the board to
1394 carry out the purposes of this chapter, by legislative
1395 appropriation, issuance of bonds or otherwise, shall be deposited
1396 into the Mississippi Business Investment Fund. Expenditures
1397 authorized herein shall be paid by the State Treasurer upon
1398 warrants drawn from the Mississippi Business Investment Fund, and
1399 the State Auditor, or his successor to such duties, shall issue
1400 warrants upon requisitions signed by the Chairman or Executive
1401 Director of the Mississippi * * * Development Authority.

1402 (2) Any monies repaid to the state from loans funded through
1403 the Mississippi Business Investment Fund shall be deposited into
1404 the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking Fund, which is hereby
1405 created in the State Treasury. Funds required in excess of the
1406 amounts available in the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking
1407 Fund to retire bonds issued pursuant to this chapter shall be
1408 appropriated from the State General Fund.

1409 (3) Monies in the fund which are derived from the proceeds
1410 of general obligation bonds or provided by the Legislature may be

1411 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1412 by the MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan and
1413 financial incentive programs administered by the MDA. An
1414 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1415 sought shall be maintained by the MDA. Reimbursement of
1416 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1417 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1418 provided by the Legislature.

1419 **SECTION 6.** Section 57-61-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1420 amended as follows:

1421 57-61-25. (1) The seller is authorized to borrow, on the
1422 credit of the state upon receipt of a resolution from the
1423 Mississippi Development Authority requesting the same, monies not
1424 exceeding the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Ninety-seven Million
1425 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$397,500,000.00), not including
1426 monies borrowed to refund outstanding bonds, notes or replacement
1427 notes, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this
1428 chapter. The rate of interest on any such bonds or notes which
1429 are not subject to taxation shall not exceed the rates set forth
1430 in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, for general
1431 obligation bonds.

1432 (2) As evidence of indebtedness authorized in this chapter,
1433 general or limited obligation bonds of the state shall be issued,
1434 from time to time, to provide monies necessary to carry out the
1435 purposes of this chapter for such total amounts, in such form, in
1436 such denominations payable in such currencies (either domestic or

1437 foreign, or both) and subject to such terms and conditions of
1438 issue, redemption and maturity, rate of interest and time of
1439 payment of interest as the seller directs, except that such bonds
1440 shall mature or otherwise be retired in annual installments
1441 beginning not more than five (5) years from date thereof and
1442 extending not more than thirty (30) years from date thereof.

1443 (3) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1444 chapter shall be signed by the chairman of the seller, or by his
1445 facsimile signature, and the official seal of the seller shall be
1446 affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the seller.

1447 (4) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1448 chapter may be general or limited obligations of the state, and
1449 the full faith and credit of the State of Mississippi as to
1450 general obligation bonds, or the revenues derived from projects
1451 assisted as to limited obligation bonds, are hereby pledged for
1452 the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and
1453 notes.

1454 (5) Such bonds and notes and the income therefrom shall be
1455 exempt from all taxation in the State of Mississippi.

1456 (6) The bonds may be issued as coupon bonds or registered as
1457 to both principal and interest, as the seller may determine. If
1458 interest coupons are attached, they shall contain the facsimile
1459 signature of the chairman and secretary of the seller.

1460 (7) The seller is authorized to provide, by resolution, for
1461 the issuance of refunding bonds for the purpose of refunding any
1462 debt issued under the provisions of this chapter and then

1463 outstanding, either by voluntary exchange with the holders of the
1464 outstanding debt or to provide funds to redeem and the costs of
1465 issuance and retirement of the debt, at maturity or at any call
1466 date. The issuance of the refunding bonds, the maturities and
1467 other details thereof, the rights of the holders thereof and the
1468 duties of the issuing officials in respect to the same shall be
1469 governed by the provisions of this section, insofar as they may be
1470 applicable.

1471 (8) As to bonds issued hereunder and designated as taxable
1472 bonds by the seller, any immunity of the state to taxation by the
1473 United States government of interest on bonds or notes issued by
1474 the state is hereby waived.

1475 (9) The proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1476 April 9, 2002, and any monies provided by the Legislature may be
1477 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1478 by the Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of
1479 the various grant, loan and financial incentive programs
1480 administered by the authority. An accounting of actual costs
1481 incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by
1482 the Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of
1483 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1484 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1485 provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection
1486 shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1487 **SECTION 7.** Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1488 amended as follows:

1489 65-4-15. (1) There is hereby established a special fund in
1490 the State Treasury to be known as the "Economic Development
1491 Highway Fund" which shall consist of such monies as the
1492 Legislature shall appropriate thereto or such other monies as the
1493 Legislature may designate to be deposited therein. Any monies to
1494 the credit of such fund may be expended by the Mississippi
1495 Department of Transportation or political subdivision, as
1496 appropriate, upon approval of requisitions therefor by the
1497 Mississippi Development Authority for any expenses incurred by the
1498 Transportation Department or political subdivision in constructing
1499 and improving highways and highway segments which have been
1500 approved by the Mississippi Development Authority under the
1501 provisions of this chapter. From and after July 1, 2004, no
1502 monies to the credit of the fund may be expended for the
1503 construction and improvement of highways for high economic benefit
1504 projects that are being developed for the primary purpose of
1505 conducting retail sales unless the Mississippi Development
1506 Authority has received an application for the project prior to
1507 July 1, 2004; however, the primary purpose is not conducting
1508 retail sales if the project is a mixed-use development for which
1509 retail space is no more than twenty percent (20%) of the square
1510 footage of the development. With regard to a high economic
1511 benefit project as defined in Section 65-4-5(1)(c)(xiii) for which
1512 the Mississippi Development Authority approved and allocated
1513 monies in the fund before January 1, 2016, for constructing or
1514 improving a highway or highway segment related to the high

1515 economic benefit project, the Mississippi Development Authority
1516 may reallocate such monies from the original highway or highway
1517 segment purpose and allocate the funds for constructing or
1518 improving another highway or highway segment provided that such
1519 highway or highway segment is located within three (3) miles of
1520 the high economic benefit project for which the Mississippi
1521 Development Authority originally allocated and approved the
1522 monies. The Office of State Aid Road Construction shall be
1523 entitled to reimbursement from monies in the fund, upon approval
1524 by the Mississippi Development Authority of requisitions therefor
1525 by the State Aid Engineer, for the actual expenses incurred by the
1526 office in administering and providing engineering services to
1527 political subdivisions. Monies remaining unexpended to the credit
1528 of such special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1529 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on the
1530 investment of monies in the special fund shall be deposited to the
1531 credit of the fund.

1532 (2) Monies in the Economic Development Highway Fund which
1533 are derived from proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1534 July 1, 2003, or provided by the Legislature may be used to
1535 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
1536 Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of the
1537 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1538 by the authority. An accounting of actual costs incurred for
1539 which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the
1540 Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of reasonable

1541 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1542 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1543 Legislature. Reimbursements to the Mississippi Development
1544 Authority under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
1545 federal tax law requirements.

1546 **SECTION 8.** Section 57-1-221, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1547 amended as follows:

1548 57-1-221. (1) As used in this section:

1549 (a) "Approved business enterprise" means any project
1550 that:

1551 (i) Locates or expands in this state, including
1552 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1553 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of two hundred fifty
1554 (250) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1555 state of a minimum of Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) in
1556 Tier 1 or Tier 2 counties;

1557 (ii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1558 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1559 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one hundred fifty
1560 (150) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1561 state of a minimum of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) in
1562 areas federally designated as low-income census tracts;

1563 (iii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1564 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1565 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one thousand
1566 (1,000) new, full-time jobs;

1567 (iv) Is a manufacturer of high-end kitchen
1568 appliances having at least four hundred (400) employees working at
1569 its Mississippi facilities on January 1, 2015, and with a capital
1570 investment of at least Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) made
1571 after July 1, 2014, through four (4) years after July 1, 2015,
1572 that expands in this state, including any federal Indian
1573 reservation located within the geographical boundary of this
1574 state, and retains a minimum of four hundred (400) jobs; or

1575 (v) Locates or expands in this state, including
1576 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1577 boundary of this state, with significant regional impact as
1578 determined by MDA.

1579 (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1580 (c) "Facility related to the project" means and
1581 includes any of the following, as they may pertain to the project:

1582 (i) Facilities to provide potable and industrial
1583 water supply systems, sewage and waste disposal systems and water,
1584 natural gas and electric transmission systems to the site of the
1585 project;

1586 (ii) Building facilities and equipment necessary
1587 to operate the facility;

1588 (iii) Rail lines;

1589 (iv) Airports, airfields, air terminals and port
1590 facilities;

1591 (v) Highways, streets and other roadways; and

1592 (vi) Fire protection facilities, equipment and
1593 elevated water tanks.

1594 (d) "Project" means any industrial, commercial,
1595 research and development, warehousing, distribution,
1596 transportation, processing, mining, United States government or
1597 tourism enterprise together with all real property required for
1598 construction, maintenance and operation of the enterprise that is
1599 approved by the MDA. The term "project" does not include any
1600 medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi
1601 Medical Cannabis Act.

1602 (2) (a) There is created a special fund in the State
1603 Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Industry Incentive
1604 Financing Revolving Fund which shall consist of monies from any
1605 source designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1606 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1607 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1608 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Except as
1609 otherwise provided, monies in the fund shall be disbursed by the
1610 Mississippi Development Authority for the purposes authorized in
1611 subsection (3) of this section. The Mississippi Development
1612 Authority shall allocate and disburse Thirty Million Dollars
1613 (\$30,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Mississippi State
1614 University for the construction, furnishing and equipping of a
1615 high-performance computing data center that is home to federally
1616 designated centers of computing excellence. The disbursement of
1617 such funds shall not be subject to any requirements of this

1618 section relating to grants and loans made by the Mississippi
1619 Development Authority under this section. The Mississippi
1620 Development Authority shall allocate and disburse Three Million
1621 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Delta Health
1622 System for capital costs related to hospital systems expansion.
1623 The disbursement of such funds shall not be subject to any
1624 requirements of this section relating to grants and loans made by
1625 the Mississippi Development Authority under this section. The
1626 Mississippi Development Authority shall disburse such funds to
1627 Delta Health System not later than thirty (30) days after April
1628 22, 2021.

1629 (b) Monies in the fund that are derived from the
1630 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1631 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1632 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1633 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1634 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1635 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1636 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1637 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1638 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1639 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1640 requirements.

1641 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants or
1642 loans from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1643 Fund to local governments, including, but not limited to,

1644 counties, municipalities, industrial development authorities and
1645 economic development districts, and approved business enterprises
1646 to construct or otherwise provide facilities related to the
1647 project. Local governments are authorized to accept grants and
1648 enter into loans authorized under the program, and to sell, lease
1649 or otherwise dispose of a project or any property related to the
1650 project in whole or in part.

1651 (4) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any
1652 business enterprise or local government desiring a grant or loan
1653 under this section shall submit an application to the MDA which
1654 shall include, at a minimum:

1655 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1656 the definition of an approved business enterprise;

1657 (ii) A description, including the cost, of the
1658 requested assistance;

1659 (iii) A description of the purpose for which the
1660 assistance is requested; and

1661 (iv) Any other information required by the MDA.

1662 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the
1663 MDA shall require that binding commitments be entered into
1664 requiring that:

1665 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1666 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1667 and

1668 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1669 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1670 MDA shall be repaid.

1671 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business
1672 enterprise or local government for a grant or loan under this
1673 section, the MDA shall determine whether the enterprise meets the
1674 definition of an approved business enterprise and determine
1675 whether to provide the assistance requested in the form of a grant
1676 or a loan.

1677 (d) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) (a)
1678 of this section, the MDA shall have sole discretion in providing
1679 grants or loans under this section. The terms of a grant or loan
1680 provided under this section and the manner of repayment of any
1681 loan shall be within the discretion of the MDA. Repayments of
1682 loans made under this section shall be deposited to the credit of
1683 the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund until
1684 the uncommitted balance in the fund reaches Fifty Million Dollars
1685 (\$50,000,000.00). Once the uncommitted balance in the fund
1686 reaches Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), repayments of
1687 loans under this section shall be deposited to the credit of Fund
1688 No. 3951 in the State Treasury to pay debt service on bonds until
1689 such time as the uncommitted balance in the fund falls below Fifty
1690 Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00).

1691 (e) The MDA shall notify the Chairman of the Senate
1692 Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means
1693 Committee of the approval of any grant or loan application thirty

1694 (30) days prior to the disbursement of any monies for the loan or
1695 grant from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1696 Fund. The notification shall identify the applicant and the
1697 purposes for which the loan or grant is made.

1698 (5) (a) Contracts, by local governments, including, but not
1699 limited to, design and construction contracts, for the
1700 acquisition, purchase, construction or installation of a project
1701 shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 31-7-13 if:

1702 (i) The MDA finds and records such finding on its
1703 minutes, that because of availability or the particular nature of
1704 a project, it would not be in the public interest or would less
1705 effectively achieve the purposes of this section to enter into
1706 such contracts on the basis of Section 31-7-13; and

1707 (ii) The approved business enterprise that is
1708 involved in the project concurs in such finding.

1709 (b) When the requirements of paragraph (a) of this
1710 subsection are met:

1711 (i) The requirements of Section 31-7-13 shall not
1712 apply to such contracts; and

1713 (ii) The contracts may be entered into on the
1714 basis of negotiation.

1715 (6) It is the policy of the MDA and the MDA is authorized to
1716 accommodate and support any enterprise that receives a loan under
1717 this section for a project defined in Section 17-25-23 that wishes
1718 to have a program of diversity in contracting, and/or that wishes
1719 to do business with or cause its prime contractor to do business

1720 with Mississippi companies, including those companies that are
1721 small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and
1722 economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and
1723 economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning
1724 ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act
1725 (15 USCS 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations
1726 promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed
1727 to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the
1728 purposes of this subsection.

1729 (7) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1730 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1731 the implementation of this section.

1732 **SECTION 9.** Section 57-1-601, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1733 amended as follows:

1734 57-1-601. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1735 following words shall have the following meanings ascribed in this
1736 section, unless the context clearly otherwise requires:

1737 (a) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1738 (b) "Municipality" means any municipality with a
1739 population of less than fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the
1740 latest federal decennial census at the time the municipality
1741 submits an application to the MDA under this section.

1742 (c) "Revitalization zone" means an area in the
1743 municipality officially designated by ordinance or resolution of
1744 the governing authorities of the municipality as a revitalization

1745 zone and approved and certified by the MDA as meeting the
1746 requirements of this section.

1747 (2) (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special
1748 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Main Street Investment
1749 Grant Fund" which shall consist of funds from any source
1750 designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1751 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1752 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1753 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in
1754 the fund shall be used by the MDA for the purposes authorized in
1755 subsection (3) of this section.

1756 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1757 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1758 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1759 necessary costs incurred by the MDA in providing grants under this
1760 section through the use of proceeds of such general obligation
1761 bonds. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1762 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained for the program.
1763 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs for
1764 assistance shall not exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of
1765 bonds issued for such assistance or the monies provided by the
1766 Legislature. Reimbursements made under this subsection shall
1767 satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1768 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants to a
1769 municipality to assist with maintaining and improving the
1770 viability of revitalization zones. The proceeds of a grant made

1771 to a municipality under this section may be used for maintaining
1772 and/or improving the viability of a revitalization zone through
1773 means deemed appropriate by the governing authorities of a
1774 municipality, including, but not limited to, making loans, grants
1775 and/or other forms of assistance to any person or public or
1776 private association or other entity for use for infrastructure
1777 projects, improvements to properties, signage and other purposes
1778 related to maintaining and/or improving the viability of the
1779 revitalization zone.

1780 (4) (a) If a municipality desires a grant under this
1781 section, the municipality shall submit an application to the MDA
1782 seeking (i) approval and certification of the proposed
1783 revitalization zone and (ii) a grant for the purposes authorized
1784 in this section. The application shall include, at a minimum:

1785 1. The name of the proposed revitalization
1786 zone, together with the words, "revitalization zone";

1787 2. A description of the revitalization zone
1788 by metes and bounds;

1789 3. A map showing the parcels of real property
1790 included in the revitalization zone and the present use of such
1791 parcels;

1792 4. A master plan for the revitalization zone
1793 that has been approved by sixty percent (60%) of the property
1794 owners within the zone at the time the municipality submits the
1795 application; and

1796 5. Any other information required by the MDA.
1797 The governing authorities of a municipality may designate the
1798 boundaries of a proposed revitalization zone by adoption of an
1799 ordinance or resolution that is spread upon its minutes and
1800 describes the boundaries of the zone.

1801 (b) The MDA shall review the application to confirm
1802 that the revitalization zone meets the requirements of this
1803 section. A revitalization zone may embrace two (2) or more
1804 separate parcels of real property, and such property may be
1805 publicly and/or privately owned. Each revitalization zone shall
1806 be of such size and form as to include all properties that, in the
1807 determination of the municipality and the MDA, constitute an
1808 integral part of the revitalization zone. If the MDA determines
1809 that the boundaries of the proposed revitalization zone exceed the
1810 area that is reasonably deemed to be integral to the
1811 revitalization zone, the MDA may reduce the boundaries of the
1812 proposed area. Upon the approval and selection of a municipal
1813 revitalization zone project, the MDA shall certify the
1814 revitalization zone.

1815 (5) The MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
1816 administer the program established under this section, and the MDA
1817 shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the
1818 Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the
1819 implementation of this section.

1820 **SECTION 10.** Section 9, Chapter 98, Laws of 2022,
1821 appropriation to the Workers' Compensation Commission, is amended
1822 as follows:

1823 Section 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
1824 Section 2 of this act, Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00),
1825 or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State
1826 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in
1827 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a
1828 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. This
1829 appropriation is made for the purpose of * * * infrastructure
1830 improvements to the commission's building, including, but not
1831 limited to, compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

1832 **SECTION 11.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
1833 and after its passage.
