- 579 Seven Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,309,725.00) from Section

- SECTION 41. Of the funds appropriated in this act, an amount
- 582 not to exceed Four Million One Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Three
- 583 Hundred One Dollars (\$4,171,301.00) is authorized to fully fund
- 584 the contract between the Department of Education and the Research
- 585 & Curriculum Unit at Mississippi State University to fund career

- SECTION 42. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 (a) to the
- 589 State Board of Education, Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00)

592 37-47-24, Mississippi Code of 1972. These funds are provided for

SECTION 43. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 (b) to the

599 secondary career and technical education instructors teaching at

600 post-secondary institutions.

SECTION 44. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Education Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of

604 Education for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of

605 Education Enhancement Fund, as authorized in House Bill 1600, 2022

606 Regular Session to provide upgrades for the Mississippi Student

Information System for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,

610 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this

611 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds

614 change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.
