## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1622

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
6	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of Human
7	Services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
8	June 30, 2024\$ 74,476,245.00.
9	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
LO	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
L1	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Human
L2	Services which is comprised of special source funds collected by
L3	or otherwise available to the department for the support of the
L 4	various divisions of the department, for the purpose of defraying
L5	the expenses of the department for the fiscal year beginning
L 6	July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024\$ 1,736,609,583.00.
L7	SECTION 3. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall
L8	be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or
L 9	necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the
20	Department of Human Services that are authorized by the
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- 21 Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules
- 22 or regulations that implement state or federal law.
- 23 **SECTION 4.** With the funds appropriated in this act, the
- 24 following positions are authorized:
- 25 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
- Permanent: Full Time..... 1,296
- 27 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 474
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 29 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
- 30 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds
- 31 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 32 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi
- 33 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 34 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
- 35 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
- 36 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
- 37 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 38 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
- 39 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the
- 40 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024
- 41 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
- 42 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
- 43 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
- 44 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 45 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 46 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State

- 47 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 48 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 49 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 50 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 51 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 52 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 54 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 55 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 56 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 58 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 59 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 60 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 62 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 63 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 64 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 65 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 66 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 67 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 68 Department of Human Services shall maintain complete accounting
- 69 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 70 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 71 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 72 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the

- 73 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to
- 74 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 75 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 76 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.
- 77 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 herein to
- 78 the Department of Human Services, One Million Dollars
- 79 (\$1,000,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Health,
- 80 Child Care Licensure Program from the Child Care Development Fund
- 81 or other appropriate special fund. These funds are to be
- 82 transferred to the Board of Health no later than July 31, 2023.
- 83 The Department of Health shall make a complete accounting to the
- 84 Department of Human Services detailing the uses of these funds in
- 85 accordance with federal and state regulations.
- 86 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 87 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 88 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 89 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 90 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 91 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 92 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 93 made without competitive bids.
- 94 **SECTION 8.** The Department of Human Services is authorized to
- 95 expend available funds on technology or equipment upgrades or
- 96 replacements when it will generate savings through efficiency or
- 97 when the savings generated from such upgrades or replacements
- 98 exceed expenditures thereof.

99	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
100	of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain
101	utilities for state furnished housing for any employees. Such
102	utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane,
103	cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined,
104	the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance
105	with legislative intent. Such state furnished housing shall
106	include single-family and multi-family residences but shall not
107	include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
108	shall be prohibited.
109	SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
110	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
111	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
112	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
113	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
114	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
115	performance measures provided below:

216	SECTION 11. It is the intent of the Legislature	e that the
217	Department of Human Services, Division of Child Suppo	ort
218	Enforcement, make a concentrated effort to increase of	collections of
219	past due child support payments. On or before Januar	ry 1, 2024,
220	the Executive Director of the Department of Human Ser	rvices shall
221	submit a report to the Legislative Budget Office deta	ailing
222	year-to-date performance measures in the Child Suppor	rt Enforcement
223	Program compared with the prior year.	
224	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislat	ture that the
225	Department of Human Services shall have the authority	y to spend
226	such additional funds as it shall receive from the fe	ederal
227	government in incentives or the federal match on thos	se incentives
228	for the purpose of child support enforcement.	

- 229 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two
- 230 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be transferred
- 231 to the Juvenile Facility Monitoring Unit at the Department of
- 232 Public Safety no later than July 31, 2023.
- 233 **SECTION 14.** Of the funds appropriated herein, to the
- 234 Department of Human Services One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00),
- 235 is provided for the support of the Home Delivered Meals Program
- 236 and any additional funds that may be appropriated to this program.
- 237 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds provided in Section 1, herein to
- 238 the Department of Human Services, an amount not to exceed One
- 239 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided to fund the
- 240 Senior Olympics Program.
- 241 **SECTION 16.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 242 Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid and the Department of
- 243 Human Services shall continue to work together to implement
- 244 Section 43-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, known as the "Medicaid
- 245 and Human Services Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".
- 246 **SECTION 17.** As a condition of receiving and expending any
- 247 funds appropriated under this act, the Department of Human
- 248 Services:
- 249 (a) Shall use a competitive procurement process for entering
- 250 into all TANF subgrant agreements with non-state entities when the
- 251 federal government does not direct to whom the funds must be
- 252 subgranted;
- 253 (b) Upon awarding of a grant to any subgrantee of the
- 254 department, shall require the subgrantee to submit a monthly

- 255 report to the department that contains, but is not limited to, all
- 256 of the following:
- 257 (i) A listing of all costs incurred by the subgrantee
- 258 during the previous month;
- 259 (ii) A listing of all clients served by the subgrantee,
- 260 with an explanation of which services were provided to the
- 261 clients:
- 262 (iii) A listing of all lower-tier subgrantees, who must
- 263 be approved by the department before the execution of any such
- 264 agreement by the prime subgrantee; and
- 265 (iv) Any other data required by the department to
- 266 provide sufficient evidence of budgetary compliance;
- 267 (c) Shall not advance funds to a subgrantee for more than
- 268 sixty (60) days; and
- 269 (d) Shall reimburse a subgrantee for expenses only after the
- 270 required documentation is provided and is approved by the
- 271 department.
- 272 **SECTION 18.** It is the intent of the Legislature, that within
- 273 the funds available, the Department of Human Services may provide
- 274 any qualifying grants of CARES Act or American Rescue Act funding
- 275 in an amount not to exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand
- 276 Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) to the three (3) regional food banks that
- 277 serve Mississippi, including Feed the Gulf Coast, Mid-South Food
- 278 Bank, and Mississippi Food Network.

279	SECTION 19. With the funds appropriated herein, the
280	Department of Human Services is authorized to make payment to
281	certain vendors for expenses incurred during 2021 as follows:

285	Southwestern Communication \$ 3,030.76
286	SECTION 20. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
287	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital
288	Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of
289	Human Services for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of
290	Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in HB 1611, 2022 Regular
291	Session to defray expenses of the Department of Human Services for
292	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending
293	June 30, 2024\$ 58,885,920.00.
294	This appropriation is made for the purpose of reauthorizing
295	the expenditure of funds as allocated herein:
296	(a) To defray the Department's computer
297	expenses\$ 4,885,920.00.
298	(b) To secure federal funding for a new
299	computer system\$ 54,000,000.00.
300	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
301	the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
302	section, shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
303	remaining as of June 30, 2023, from the amount authorized for the

previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2023, except for Section 19 which shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage of this act and through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2023.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2024.
