Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1636

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

23 Time-Limited:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 24 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 25 26 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi 28 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 30 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 31 32 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 33 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 34 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 35 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 36 37 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 38 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency. 39

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Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

47 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 48 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

57 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of 58 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 59 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation 60 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 61 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 62 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

63 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Marine Resources shall maintain complete accounting 64 65 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 66 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 67 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 68 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to 69 70 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 71 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 72 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.

73 SECTION 5. Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor
74 shall be furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Six
75 Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.

76 SECTION 6. In addition to all other sums heretofore 77 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 78 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 79 Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3345200000 to the 80 Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the 81 expenses of the tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 12,455,247.00. 82 83 Of the funds appropriated within this section, One Million Three Hundred Fifty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Forty-four Dollars 84 85 (\$1,357,544) shall be designated for bond repayment.

Each political subdivision receiving funds authorized in this section shall be held responsible for complying with Section 29–15–9, Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall be subject to an audit by the State Auditor and shall submit detailed reports beginning June 30, and every six (6) months thereafter for the duration of the project to the Department of Marine Resources on how funds authorized in this section were expended.

97 It is the intention of the Legislature that any political98 subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the

99 subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2023. All proposals 100 101 submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of 102 Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. 103 Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with 104 high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking 105 funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated. 106 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of

107 the Tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual 108 amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be 109 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 110 section.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 111 SECTION 7. department shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the 112 113 department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in 114 115 the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year. 116 117 The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay 118 reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects.

119 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 120 Department of Marine Resources has the authorization to move 121 tidelands funds between approved projects upon request from entity 122 and proper completion of Form TTF-6 documentation.

123 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature for the 124 Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Environmental H. B. 1636 PAGE 5 125 Quality to continue with any agency partnerships, including grant 126 agreements, that provide environmental projects to restore 127 Mississippi's natural resources in the wake of the Deepwater 128 Horizon Oil Spill.

129 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that 130 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 131 132 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 133 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 134 135 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 136 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Fortyseven Million Six Hundred Forty-one Thousand Two Hundred Seventyfour Dollars (\$47,641,274.00) is provided for the funding of the following Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) projects for FY 2024:

It is the intent of the Legislature that the 254 Department of Marine Resources shall have the authority to expend H. B. 1636 PAGE 10

funds in an amount not to exceed Seventeen Million Dollars (\$17,000,000.00) from funds for the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) that may become available to the agency in fiscal year 2024 in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

261 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 262 of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 263 utilities for state furnished housing for any employees. Such 264 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 265 266 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 267 with legislative intent. Such state furnished housing shall 268 include single-family and multi-family residences but shall not 269 include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities 270 shall be prohibited.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

278 SECTION 15. With the funds appropriated herein, the 279 Department of Marine Resources is authorized to make payment for 280 expenses incurred during Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021 as follows: H. B. 1636

287 **SECTION 16.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 288 289 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 290 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 291 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 292 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 293 SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from 294 and after July 1, 2023, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2023.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
