## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill No. 787

**BY: Committee** 

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- SECTION 1. Section 73-36-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 15 amended as follows:
- 16 73-36-33. (1) The board shall have the power, after notice
- 17 and hearing, to suspend or revoke the license of any registrant
- 18 who (a) is found guilty by the board of fraud or gross negligence
- 19 in the practice of professional forestry; (b) fails to comply with
- 20 board rules and regulations; (c) is found guilty by the board of
- 21 unprofessional or unethical conduct; or (d) has had his license
- 22 suspended or revoked for cause in another jurisdiction.



- 23 Any person may prefer charges of fraud or gross 24 negligence in connection with any forestry practice against any 25 registrant. Such charges shall be in writing, shall be sworn to by the person making them, and shall be filed with the secretary 26 27 of the board. All charges shall be heard by the board pursuant to 28 its rules and regulations without undue delay.
- 29 Any applicant whose license is suspended or revoked by 30 the board may apply for a review of the proceedings with reference 31 to such suspension or revocation by appealing to the Chancery 32 Court of the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, 33 provided a notice of appeal is filed by such applicant with the 34 clerk of said court within sixty (60) days from entry of an order 35 by the board suspending or revoking his license, provided said 36 applicant files with said notice of appeal a bond to be approved 37 by the court assuring the prompt payment of any and all costs of 38 said appeal, said amount to be fixed by the court. Upon the 39 filing of such notice of appeal and posting of such bond, the clerk of the said court shall notify the secretary of the board 40 41 thereof and the record of the proceedings involved shall be 42 prepared by the secretary and forwarded to the court within a 43 period of sixty (60) days from such notice by the clerk. 44 court shall thereupon review the proceedings on the record presented and may hear such additional testimony as to the court 45 46 may appear material and dispose of the appeal in termtime or in vacation, and the court may sustain or dismiss the appeal, or 47

- 48 modify or vacate the order complained of, but in case the order is
- 49 modified or vacated, the court may also, in its discretion, remand
- 50 the matter to the board for such further proceedings not
- 51 inconsistent with the court's order as, in the opinion of the
- 52 court, justice may require. The decision of the chancery court
- 53 may be appealed as other cases to the Supreme Court.
- 54 (4) The board is authorized to secure, by contract, the
- 55 services of an investigator when deemed necessary by the board to
- 56 properly consider any charge then before it. The board may, at
- 57 its discretion, establish a program of routine inspections.
- 58 (5) In addition to the reasons specified in subsection (1)
- 59 of this section, the board shall be authorized to suspend the
- 60 license of any licensee for being out of compliance with an order
- 61 for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153, or for failure of
- 62 the licensee to satisfy a judgment against such licensee, and/or
- 63 the company or business for which the licensee provided services,
- 64 provided that such judgement was rendered in connection to the
- 65 practice of forestry. The procedure for suspension of a license
- 66 for being out of compliance with an order for support, and the
- 67 procedure for the reissuance or reinstatement of a license
- 68 suspended for that purpose, and the payment of any fees for the
- 69 reissuance or reinstatement of a license suspended for that
- 70 purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as
- 71 the case may be. Actions taken by the board in suspending a
- 72 license when required by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 are not

- 73 actions from which an appeal may be taken under this section.
- 74 appeal of a license suspension that is required by Section
- 75 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 shall be taken in accordance with the
- 76 appeal procedure specified in Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as
- 77 the case may be, rather than the procedure specified in this
- 78 section. If there is any conflict between any provision of
- 79 Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter,
- the provisions of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may 80
- 81 be, shall control.
- 82 SECTION 2. Section 73-36-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 83 brought forward as follows:
- 84 This chapter may be cited as the "Foresters
- Registration Law of 1977." 85
- 86 SECTION 3. Section 73-36-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- brought forward as follows: 87
- 88 73-36-3. As used in this chapter the following words and
- 89 phrases shall include the meanings ascribed in this section unless
- the context clearly requires a different meaning: 90
- 91 The term "person" means a natural person. (a)
- 92 The term "forester" means a person who, by reason (b)
- 93 of his knowledge of the natural sciences, mathematics, economics
- 94 and the principles of forestry, and by his demonstrated skills
- acquired through professional forestry education as set forth in 95
- 96 Section 73-36-21, is qualified to engage in the practice of



- 97 forestry and who also has been duly registered and holds a current
- 98 valid license issued by the board.
- 99 (c) The term "registered forester" means a person who
- 100 has been registered and licensed pursuant to this chapter.
- 101 (d) The term "practice of forestry" means any
- 102 professional forestry service including, but not limited to,
- 103 consultation, investigation, evaluation, valuation, planning,
- 104 recommending silvicultural or harvesting practices or responsible
- 105 supervision of any forestry activities in connection with any
- 106 public or private lands wherein the public welfare and property
- 107 are concerned or involved when such professional services require
- 108 the application of forestry principles, knowledge and data.
- 109 (e) The term "board" means the State Board of
- 110 Registration for Foresters.
- SECTION 4. Section 73-36-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 112 brought forward as follows:
- 113 73-36-5. In order to benefit and protect the public and the
- 114 forest resources, no person in either public or private capacity
- 115 shall practice or offer to practice forestry, unless he shall
- 116 first have submitted evidence that he is qualified so to practice
- and shall be registered by the board or unless he is specifically
- 118 exempted from registration under this chapter. It is unlawful for
- 119 any person to practice or offer to practice forestry in this
- 120 state, as defined by this chapter, or to use in connection with
- 121 his name or otherwise assume, use or advertise any title or



- 122 description tending to convey the impression that he is a
- 123 forester, unless the person has been duly registered or is exempt
- 124 from registration under this chapter.
- 125 This chapter shall not be construed to prevent or to affect:
- 126 (a) The conduct of business and support services
- 127 including: tree planting, timber stand improvement, pesticide
- 128 application, pest control, site preparation, heavy equipment
- 129 operation, prescribed fire application, timber buying, logging
- 130 contracting, timber cruising, timber marking and the application
- 131 of best management practices.
- (b) The application of forestry principles and
- 133 procedures on any timberlands, woodlands or forest in which the
- 134 person, firm, partnership or corporation owns the timberlands,
- 135 woodlands or forest; or persons, firms, partnerships and
- 136 corporations having the right to manage and administer forestlands
- in any legal manner.
- 138 (c) The work of an employee or a subordinate of any
- 139 forester holding a license under this chapter; if that work is
- 140 done under the direction, supervision and responsibility of a
- 141 person holding a license under this chapter.
- 142 (d) The practice of forestry by officers and employees
- 143 of the United States government on federally-owned lands.
- 144 (e) The practice of forestry by officers and employees
- 145 of the State of Mississippi on state-owned lands.



- (f) Employees of the federal government, state
- 147 government and educational institutions of the State of
- 148 Mississippi who, in the exercise of their assigned duties, conduct
- 149 forestry education programs.
- 150 (g) Persons who hold valid licenses prior to July 1,
- 151 1989.
- SECTION 5. Section 73-36-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 153 brought forward as follows:
- 154 73-36-7. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be
- 155 construed as preventing any person, firm, partnership or
- 156 corporation from practicing forestry or managing woodlands,
- 157 forests or trees on any land, provided such acts are not performed
- 158 or offered to the public for compensation, unless otherwise
- 159 exempted in Section 73-36-5.
- SECTION 6. Section 73-36-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 161 brought forward as follows:
- 162 73-36-9. There is hereby created the State Board of
- 163 Registration for Foresters of the State of Mississippi for the
- 164 purposes of safeguarding forests by regulating the practice of
- 165 forestry and requiring that persons practicing or offering to
- 166 practice forestry to be registered. The board shall be composed
- 167 of seven (7) members appointed by the Governor with the advice and
- 168 consent of the Senate. One (1) member shall be appointed from
- 169 each of the six (6) forestry commission districts as constituted
- 170 on January 1, 1999, and one (1) member shall be appointed at

- 171 large. The State Forester of Mississippi shall serve as an ex
- 172 officio member of the board. Each of the members shall be a
- 173 forester within the meaning of this chapter with at least three
- 174 (3) years' experience in such field, and a resident and citizen of
- 175 the State of Mississippi at the time of his appointment. Within
- 176 thirty (30) days after July 1, 1977, the Governor shall appoint
- 177 the members, designating a term of office of one (1), two (2),
- 178 three (3), four (4) or five (5) years for each of the members as
- 179 appointed; provided, however, two (2) members shall serve a term
- 180 of one (1) year and two (2) shall serve a term of four (4) years.
- 181 As the terms of office of the members so appointed expire,
- 182 successors shall be appointed for terms of five (5) years. Any
- 183 vacancy occurring in the membership of the board shall be filled
- 184 by the Governor for the unexpired term. The Governor shall have
- 185 the right, upon the approval of a majority of the board, to remove
- 186 any members of the board for inefficiency, neglect of duty or
- 187 dishonorable conduct.
- SECTION 7. Section 73-36-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 189 brought forward as follows:
- 190 73-36-11. No person shall be appointed a member of the board
- 191 unless the person at the time appointed has held a license as a
- 192 registered forester for at least five (5) years.
- 193 **SECTION 8.** Section 73-36-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 194 brought forward as follows:



- 195 73-36-13. Each year the board shall elect one (1) of its 196 members as chairman, one (1) as vice chairman, and one (1) as 197 secretary, and each shall perform the usual duties of such 198 The board may adopt an official seal. Four (4) members offices. 199 of the board shall constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of 200 those present at any meeting shall be necessary for the adoption 201 of any order proposed or the disposition of other business coming 202 before the board.
- 203 **SECTION 9.** Section 73-36-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 204 brought forward as follows:
- 73-36-15. The board shall hold at least two (2) regular
  meetings during each year and such other meetings as the chairman
  may find necessary. Notice of the time and place of the meetings
  of the board shall be mailed to each of the members of the board
  at least five (5) days before the meeting and, in addition, shall
  be posted as provided by the rules and regulations of the board at
  least five (5) days prior to the meeting.
- SECTION 10. Section 73-36-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is brought forward as follows:
- 73-36-17. Each member of the board shall receive per diem
  compensation as authorized by Section 25-3-69, and shall be
  reimbursed for such other expenses at the same rate and under the
  same conditions as provided for public officers and employees in
  Section 25-3-41. The board shall pay for all expenses incurred by
  the board, including clerical help as may be needed, if itemized

- 220 statements of the expenses are first approved by order of the
- 221 board entered on its minutes. The board shall not expend in any
- 222 fiscal year more monies than the amount of fees collected. All
- 223 fees shall be paid to the secretary of the board and the secretary
- 224 shall deposit all monies received under this chapter in the State
- 225 Treasury. All such monies shall be kept in a special fund in the
- 226 State Treasury known as the "State Board of Registered Foresters
- 227 Fund" and shall be used for the administration of this chapter.
- 228 The funds shall not lapse at the end of each year. All
- 229 expenditures from the fund shall be by requisition to the
- 230 Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration
- 231 and signed by the board chairman. The secretary of the board
- 232 shall be under a surety bond in the penal sum of Five Thousand
- 233 Dollars (\$5,000.00) with a surety company authorized to do
- 234 business in this state, the bond to be conditioned for the
- 235 faithful performance of his duties, and the fee shall be paid by
- 236 the board.
- 237 **SECTION 11.** Section 73-36-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 238 brought forward as follows:
- 239 73-36-19. (1) The State Board of Registration for Foresters
- 240 shall have the following powers and duties:
- 241 (a) To adopt rules and regulations governing the
- 242 holding of its meetings, hearings, applications for licenses and
- 243 any and all other duties provided by this chapter.



- 244 (b) To establish and promulgate standards of practice 245 and a code of ethics for registered foresters and provide for the 246 enforcement thereof.
- 247 (c) To establish minimum requirements for professional continuing education.
- 249 (d) To prepare a biennial roster showing the names,
  250 business addresses and such other information as the board may
  251 deem necessary of all foresters registered under this chapter, and
  252 to provide copies to the registered foresters and the public. A
  253 copy of the roster shall be filed with the Secretary of State of
  254 the State of Mississippi on or before April 1 in the year such
  255 roster is prepared.
- 256 (e) To issue, suspend or revoke licenses and to take 257 all actions necessary.
  - (2) At any hearing before the board, any member may administer oaths to witnesses appearing before the board. If any person shall refuse to testify or to produce any books, papers or documents, the board may present its petition to any court of competent jurisdiction within the state setting forth the facts, and then the court, in a proper case, may issue its subpoena to the person requiring his attendance before the court and to testify or to produce such books, papers and documents as may be deemed necessary and pertinent thereto. Any person failing or refusing to obey the subpoena of the court may be proceeded



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- against in the same manner as for refusal to obey any other subpoena of the court.
- 270 The board shall keep a record of its proceedings and a 271 register of all applications for registration. The register shall 272 show the name, age and residence of each applicant, the date of 273 the application and the board's action on the application and any 274 other information as may be deemed necessary by the board. 275 board shall submit an annual report to the Governor and a report 276 to the regular session of the Legislature. The report to the 277 Legislature shall include a financial statement of the 278 transactions of the board during the year.
- 279 **SECTION 12.** Section 73-36-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 280 brought forward as follows:
- 281 (1) Any person who has graduated with a 282 bachelor's degree or higher degree from a university or college of 283 forestry in a curriculum in forestry acceptable to the board and 284 found by the board to be substantially equivalent to curricula in 285 schools of forestry accredited by the Society of American 286 Foresters shall be eligible for registration as a registered 287 forester, and a license shall be issued upon application and payment of the required fee, if the person files an application 288 289 for registration with the board and successfully passes a written 290 and/or oral examination.
- 291 (2) The board may review and investigate the denial of any 292 license, upon appeal by the denied applicant, and the board may

- 293 issue a license to an applicant who met the requirements for such
- 294 license at the time of application.
- 295 **SECTION 13.** Section 73-36-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 296 brought forward as follows:
- 297 73-36-23. Applications for registration shall be made on
- 298 forms prescribed and furnished by the board. The initial
- 299 registration fee for a license as a registered forester shall be
- 300 fixed by the board, but shall not exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
- 301 If the board denies the issuance of a license to any applicant,
- 302 the fee deposited shall be retained by the board as an application
- 303 fee.
- Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 305 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 306 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 307 **SECTION 14.** Section 73-36-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 308 brought forward as follows:
- 309 73-36-25. When written examinations are required, they shall
- 310 be held at such time and place as the board shall determine. The
- 311 methods of procedure shall be prescribed by the board. A
- 312 candidate failing an examination may apply for reexamination at
- 313 the expiration of six (6) months and shall be entitled to one (1)
- 314 reexamination without payment of an additional fee. Subsequent
- 315 examinations may be granted upon payment of a fee to be determined
- 316 by the board, but not in excess of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).



- 317 **SECTION 15.** Section 73-36-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 318 brought forward as follows:
- 319 73-36-27. The board shall issue a properly authenticated, 320 serially numbered license upon payment of the registration fee to
- 321 any applicant who in the opinion of the board has satisfactorily
- 322 met all the requirements of this chapter and the rules and
- 323 regulations of the board duly adopted under this chapter. The
- 324 issuance of a license by the board shall be evidence that the
- 325 person named therein is entitled to all the rights and privileges
- 326 of a registered forester while the license remains unrevoked or
- 327 unexpired.
- 328 **SECTION 16.** Section 73-36-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 329 brought forward as follows:
- 330 73-36-29. Except as provided in Section 33-1-39, all
- 331 licenses issued under the provisions of this chapter shall expire
- 332 after December 31 of odd numbered years and shall become invalid
- 333 after that date unless renewed. The secretary of the board shall
- 334 mail a notice to every person registered under this chapter
- 335 notifying the person of the date of the expiration of his license
- 336 and the amount of fee required for its renewal for two (2) years.
- 337 The notice shall be mailed to the latest known address, according
- 338 to the board's records, at least one (1) month in advance of the
- 339 date of the expiration of the license. The board shall from time
- 340 to time fix the fee for renewal of licenses, provided the fee
- 341 shall not exceed the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for

- two (2) years' renewal. Any registrant failing to renew his
  license and applying for a license shall be required to pay a fee
  as set by the board not to exceed twice the total amount of the
  license fees had his license been continued in effect, and also to
  comply with such other reasonable requirements as may be
  established by rules and regulations of the board.
- 348 **SECTION 17.** Section 73-36-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 349 brought forward as follows:
- 350 73-36-31. A person not a resident of and having no 351 established place of business in Mississippi, or who has recently 352 become a resident, may use the title of registered forester in 353 Mississippi, provided: (a) such person is legally licensed as a registered forester in his own state or county and has submitted 354 355 evidence to the board that he is so licensed and that the 356 requirements for registration are at least substantially 357 equivalent to the requirements of this chapter; and (b) the state 358 or county in which he is so licensed observes these same rules of 359 reciprocity in regard to persons licensed under this chapter. 360 Each person seeking the privileges of reciprocity granted under 361 this chapter shall submit his application to the board and must 362 receive a card or certificate from the board before exercising 363 such privileges. The fee for obtaining a license through 364 reciprocity shall be the same as charged a Mississippi licensee. 365 The issuance of a license by reciprocity to a military-trained 366 applicant, military spouse or person who establishes residence in

- 367 this state shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1 or 73-50-2, as applicable.
- 369 **SECTION 18.** Section 73-36-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 370 brought forward as follows:
- 371 73-36-35. Any person who practices or offers to practice the 372 profession of forestry in this state without being registered in 373 accordance with this chapter, or any person who uses in connection 374 with his name, or otherwise assumes, uses or advertises any title 375 or description tending to convey the impression that he is a 376 registered forester without being registered in accordance with 377 this chapter, or any person who presents or attempts to use as his 378 own the license of another, or any person who gives any false or 379 forged evidence of any kind to the board or any member in 380 obtaining a license, or any person who attempts to use an expired 381 or revoked license, or any person, firm, partnership or 382 corporation who violates any of the provisions of this chapter and 383 has not been issued an administrative fine by the board for the 384 violation is quilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall 385 be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each 386 violation. The board, or any person or persons as may be 387 designated by the board to act in its stead, is empowered to 388 prefer charges for any violations of this chapter in any court of 389 competent jurisdiction. It shall be the duty of all duly 390 constituted officers of the law of this state to enforce the provisions of this chapter and to prosecute any persons, firms, 391

- partnerships or corporations violating same. Except as otherwise authorized in Section 7-5-39, the Attorney General of the state or his designated assistant shall act as legal advisor of the board and render such assistance as may be necessary in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.
- 397 **SECTION 19.** Section 73-36-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 398 brought forward as follows:
- 399 73-36-36. In addition to the penalties provided under 400 Section 73-36-33 and Section 73-36-35, any person, found by the 401 board to be in violation of this chapter or any rule or regulation 402 of the board, shall be subject to an administrative fine of not 403 more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation. 404 The person shall be given at least ten (10) days' written notice 405 and an opportunity for a hearing before the board. 406 administrative fine is not paid within ninety (90) days after the 407 date of the board's order, the order shall become a judgment and 408 may be filed and executed. Any person aggrieved of the board's 409 order may appeal the order to the Circuit Court of Hinds County 410 within thirty (30) days after the date of the order of the board 411 is issued. Appeal shall be on the record made before the board. 412 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from
