COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO**

House Bill No. 1089

**Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting
in lieu thereof the following:**

42 **SECTION 1.** Section 27-104-371, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
43 amended as follows:
44 27-104-371. (1) A special fund, to be designated as the
45 "2022 Local Improvements Projects Fund," is created within the
46 State Treasury. The fund shall be maintained by the State
47 Treasurer as a separate and special fund, separate and apart from
48 the General Fund of the state. Unexpended amounts remaining in
49 the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the
50 State General Fund, and any interest earned or investment earnings
51 on amounts in the fund shall be deposited into such fund.



52 (2) Monies deposited into the fund shall be disbursed by the
53 Department of Finance and Administration as follows:

55 purpose of providing a grant to the Scott Ford House, Inc., to

1161 **SECTION 3.** Section 57-1-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1162 amended as follows:

1163 57-1-16. (1) As used in this section:

1164 (a) "Extraordinary economic development opportunity"
1165 means a new or expanded business or industry which maintains a
1166 strong financial condition and minimal credit risk and creates
1167 substantial employment, particularly in areas of high
1168 unemployment. The term "extraordinary economic development
1169 opportunity" does not include any medical cannabis establishment
1170 as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.



1171 (b) "Local economic development entities" means state
1172 institutions of higher learning or public or private nonprofit
1173 local economic development entities including, but not limited to,
1174 chambers of commerce, local authorities, commissions or other
1175 entities created by local and private legislation or districts
1176 created pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1177 (c) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1178 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1179 special fund to be designated as the ACE Fund, which shall consist
1180 of money from any public or private source designated for deposit
1181 into such fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the
1182 end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund,
1183 and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited
1184 to the credit of the fund. The purpose of the fund shall be to
1185 assist in maximizing extraordinary economic development
1186 opportunities related to any new or expanded business or industry
1187 or to assist a local unit of government as authorized in
1188 subsection (5) of this section. Such funds may be used to make
1189 grants to local economic development entities to assist any new or
1190 expanding business or industry that meets the criteria provided in
1191 this section when such assistance aids the consummation of a
1192 project within the State of Mississippi, including any federal
1193 Indian reservation located within the geographical boundary of
1194 Mississippi, or to make grants to a local unit of government as
1195 authorized in subsection (5) of this section.



1196 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1197 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1198 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1199 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1200 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1201 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1202 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.
1203 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1204 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1205 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1206 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1207 requirements.

1208 (3) The MDA shall establish a grant program to make grants
1209 from the ACE Fund created under this section. Local economic
1210 development entities may apply to the MDA for a grant under this
1211 section in the manner provided for in subsection (4) of this
1212 section. Local units of government may apply to the MDA for a
1213 grant under this section in the manner provided in subsection (5)
1214 of this section.

1215 (4) (a) Any business or industry desiring assistance from a
1216 local economic development entity under this section shall submit
1217 an application to the local economic development entity which
1218 shall include, at a minimum:



1219 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1220 the definition of an extraordinary economic development
1221 opportunity;

1222 (ii) A demonstration that the business or industry
1223 is at an economic disadvantage by locating the new or expanded
1224 project in the county;

1225 (iii) A description, including the cost, of the
1226 requested assistance;

1227 (iv) A description of the purpose for which the
1228 assistance is requested;

1229 (v) A two-year business plan;

1230 (vi) Financial statements or tax returns for the
1231 three (3) years immediately prior to the application;

1232 (vii) Credit reports on all persons or entities
1233 with a twenty percent (20%) or greater interest in the business or
1234 industry; and

1235 (viii) Any other information required by the MDA.

1236 (b) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1237 entered into requiring that:

1238 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1239 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1240 and

1241 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1242 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1243 MDA shall be repaid.



1244 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business or
1245 industry, the local economic development entity may apply to the
1246 MDA for assistance under this section. Such application must
1247 contain evidence that the business or industry meets the
1248 definition of an extraordinary economic development opportunity, a
1249 demonstration that the business or industry is at an economic
1250 disadvantage by locating the new or expanded project in the
1251 county, a description, including the cost, of the requested
1252 assistance, and a statement of what efforts have been made or are
1253 being made by the business or industry for securing or qualifying
1254 for other local, state, federal or private funds for the project.

1255 (d) The MDA shall have sole discretion in the awarding
1256 of ACE funds, provided that the business or industry and the local
1257 economic development entity have met the statutory requirements of
1258 this section. However, in making grants under this section, the
1259 MDA shall attempt to provide for an equitable distribution of such
1260 grants among each of the congressional districts of this state in
1261 order to promote economic development across the entire state.

1262 (5) (a) The MDA may make grants to local units of
1263 government to assist the local unit of government in purchasing
1264 real property for the benefit of an existing industry that commits
1265 to maintain a minimum of one thousand three hundred (1,300) jobs
1266 for a minimum of ten (10) years after the date the grant is made.
1267 The MDA shall not make grants under this subsection to assist



1268 local units of government for the benefit of any medical cannabis
1269 establishment as defined in the Mississippi Medical Cannabis Act.

1270 (b) Any local unit of government seeking a grant
1271 authorized under this subsection shall apply to MDA. The
1272 application shall contain such information as the MDA may require.

1273 (c) The MDA shall require that binding commitments be
1274 entered into requiring that:

1275 (i) The minimum requirements of this subsection
1276 and such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be
1277 met; and

1278 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1279 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1280 MDA shall be repaid.

1281 (6) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1282 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1283 the implementation of this section. However, before the
1284 implementation of any such rules and regulations, they shall be
1285 submitted to a committee consisting of five (5) members of the
1286 Senate Finance Committee and five (5) members of the House of
1287 Representatives Ways and Means Committee, appointed by the
1288 respective committee chairmen.

1289 **SECTION 4.** Section 57-1-701, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1290 amended as follows:



1291 57-1-701. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1292 following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in
1293 this subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

1294 (a) "Eligible entity" means any (i) county, (ii)
1295 municipality or (iii) public or private nonprofit local economic
1296 development entity including, but not limited to, local
1297 authorities, commissions, or other entities created by local and
1298 private legislation or pursuant to Section 19-5-99.

1299 (b) "Optioned property" means industrial property that
1300 is subject to a real estate option to purchase contract entered
1301 into between an eligible entity and a real estate owner, where
1302 such option shall be for a minimum of three (3) years and the
1303 option price shall not exceed the appraised fair market value of
1304 the real estate.

1305 (c) "Eligible expenditures" means:

1306 (i) Fees for architects, engineers, environmental
1307 consultants, attorneys, and such other advisors, consultants and
1308 agents that MDA determines are necessary to complete site due
1309 diligence associated with site development improvements located on
1310 industrial property that is publicly owned or is optioned
1311 property;

1312 (ii) Contributions toward site development
1313 improvements, as approved by MDA, located on industrial property
1314 that is publicly owned;



1315 (iii) Contributions toward public infrastructure
1316 improvements directly serving industrial property that is publicly
1317 owned or is optioned property; and/or

1318 (iv) Contributions toward acquisition of publicly
1319 owned real property used for economic development purposes by an
1320 eligible entity, where the acquisition price shall not exceed the
1321 appraised fair market value of the property.

1322 (d) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1323 (e) "Site development improvements" means site
1324 clearing, grading, and environmental mitigation; improvements to
1325 drainage systems; easement and right-of-way acquisition; sewer
1326 systems; transportation directly affecting the site, including
1327 roads, bridges or rail; bulkheads; taxiways and parking ramps;
1328 land reclamation; water supply (storage, treatment and
1329 distribution); telecommunications systems, including fiber optic;
1330 natural gas distribution systems; aesthetic improvements; the
1331 dredging of channels and basins; or other improvements as approved
1332 by MDA.

1333 (2) (a) There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
1334 special fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Site Development
1335 Grant Fund," which shall consist of funds made available by the
1336 Legislature in any manner and funds from any other source
1337 designated for deposit into such fund. Unexpended amounts
1338 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1339 into the State General Fund, and any investment earnings or



1340 interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the
1341 credit of the fund. Monies in the fund shall be used to make
1342 grants to assist eligible entities as provided in this section.

1343 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from proceeds
1344 of bonds issued under Section 2 of Chapter 390, Laws of 2017,
1345 Section 5 of Chapter 412, Laws of 2018, Section 1 of Chapter 421,
1346 Laws of 2019, Section 4 of Chapter 492, Laws of 2020, or Section 8
1347 of Chapter 480, Laws of 2021 or provided by the Legislature, may
1348 be used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs
1349 incurred by MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan
1350 and financial incentive programs administered by MDA. An
1351 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1352 sought shall be maintained by MDA. Reimbursement of reasonable
1353 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1354 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1355 Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection shall satisfy
1356 any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1357 (3) (a) MDA shall establish a program to make grants to
1358 eligible entities to match local or other funds associated with
1359 improving the marketability of publicly owned industrial property
1360 for industrial economic development purposes and other property
1361 improvements as approved by MDA. An eligible entity may apply to
1362 MDA for a grant under this program in the manner provided for in
1363 this section. An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1364 section must provide matching funds in an amount determined by



1365 MDA. Matching funds may be provided in the form of cash and/or
1366 in-kind services as determined by MDA.

1367 (b) An eligible entity desiring assistance under this
1368 section must submit an application to MDA. The application must
1369 include:

1370 (i) A description of the eligible expenditures for
1371 which assistance is requested;

1372 (ii) The amount of assistance requested;

1373 (iii) The amount and type of matching funds to be
1374 provided by the eligible entity; and

1375 (iv) Any other information required by MDA.

1376 (c) Upon request by MDA, an eligible entity shall
1377 provide MDA with access to all studies, reports, documents and/or
1378 plans developed as a result of or related to an eligible entity
1379 receiving assistance under this section.

1380 (4) MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
1381 administer the program established under this section, and the
1382 department shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance
1383 with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for
1384 the implementation of this section.

1385 (5) MDA shall file an annual report with the Governor, the
1386 Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of
1387 Representatives not later than December 1 of each year, describing
1388 all assistance provided under this section.



1389 **SECTION 5.** Section 57-61-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1390 amended as follows:

1391 57-61-21. (1) There is hereby created a special fund in the
1392 State Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Business Investment
1393 Fund dedicated to the purpose of providing grants and/or loans to
1394 municipalities for the purpose of providing for improvements
1395 authorized by this chapter. All monies received by the board to
1396 carry out the purposes of this chapter, by legislative
1397 appropriation, issuance of bonds or otherwise, shall be deposited
1398 into the Mississippi Business Investment Fund. Expenditures
1399 authorized herein shall be paid by the State Treasurer upon
1400 warrants drawn from the Mississippi Business Investment Fund, and
1401 the State Auditor, or his successor to such duties, shall issue
1402 warrants upon requisitions signed by the Chairman or Executive
1403 Director of the Mississippi * * * Development Authority.

1404 (2) Any monies repaid to the state from loans funded through
1405 the Mississippi Business Investment Fund shall be deposited into
1406 the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking Fund, which is hereby
1407 created in the State Treasury. Funds required in excess of the
1408 amounts available in the Mississippi Business Investment Sinking
1409 Fund to retire bonds issued pursuant to this chapter shall be
1410 appropriated from the State General Fund.

1411 (3) Monies in the fund which are derived from the proceeds
1412 of general obligation bonds or provided by the Legislature may be
1413 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred



1414 by the MDA for the administration of the various grant, loan and
1415 financial incentive programs administered by the MDA. An
1416 accounting of actual costs incurred for which reimbursement is
1417 sought shall be maintained by the MDA. Reimbursement of
1418 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1419 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1420 provided by the Legislature.

1421 **SECTION 6.** Section 57-61-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1422 amended as follows:

1423 57-61-25. (1) The seller is authorized to borrow, on the
1424 credit of the state upon receipt of a resolution from the
1425 Mississippi Development Authority requesting the same, monies not
1426 exceeding the aggregate sum of Three Hundred Ninety-seven Million
1427 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$397,500,000.00), not including
1428 monies borrowed to refund outstanding bonds, notes or replacement
1429 notes, as may be necessary to carry out the purposes of this
1430 chapter. The rate of interest on any such bonds or notes which
1431 are not subject to taxation shall not exceed the rates set forth
1432 in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, for general
1433 obligation bonds.

1434 (2) As evidence of indebtedness authorized in this chapter,
1435 general or limited obligation bonds of the state shall be issued,
1436 from time to time, to provide monies necessary to carry out the
1437 purposes of this chapter for such total amounts, in such form, in
1438 such denominations payable in such currencies (either domestic or



1439 foreign, or both) and subject to such terms and conditions of
1440 issue, redemption and maturity, rate of interest and time of
1441 payment of interest as the seller directs, except that such bonds
1442 shall mature or otherwise be retired in annual installments
1443 beginning not more than five (5) years from date thereof and
1444 extending not more than thirty (30) years from date thereof.

1445 (3) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1446 chapter shall be signed by the chairman of the seller, or by his
1447 facsimile signature, and the official seal of the seller shall be
1448 affixed thereto, attested by the secretary of the seller.

1449 (4) All bonds and notes issued under authority of this
1450 chapter may be general or limited obligations of the state, and
1451 the full faith and credit of the State of Mississippi as to
1452 general obligation bonds, or the revenues derived from projects
1453 assisted as to limited obligation bonds, are hereby pledged for
1454 the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and
1455 notes.

1456 (5) Such bonds and notes and the income therefrom shall be
1457 exempt from all taxation in the State of Mississippi.

1458 (6) The bonds may be issued as coupon bonds or registered as
1459 to both principal and interest, as the seller may determine. If
1460 interest coupons are attached, they shall contain the facsimile
1461 signature of the chairman and secretary of the seller.

1462 (7) The seller is authorized to provide, by resolution, for
1463 the issuance of refunding bonds for the purpose of refunding any



1464 debt issued under the provisions of this chapter and then
1465 outstanding, either by voluntary exchange with the holders of the
1466 outstanding debt or to provide funds to redeem and the costs of
1467 issuance and retirement of the debt, at maturity or at any call
1468 date. The issuance of the refunding bonds, the maturities and
1469 other details thereof, the rights of the holders thereof and the
1470 duties of the issuing officials in respect to the same shall be
1471 governed by the provisions of this section, insofar as they may be
1472 applicable.

1473 (8) As to bonds issued hereunder and designated as taxable
1474 bonds by the seller, any immunity of the state to taxation by the
1475 United States government of interest on bonds or notes issued by
1476 the state is hereby waived.

1477 (9) The proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1478 April 9, 2002, and any monies provided by the Legislature may be
1479 used to reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred
1480 by the Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of
1481 the various grant, loan and financial incentive programs
1482 administered by the authority. An accounting of actual costs
1483 incurred for which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by
1484 the Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of
1485 reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three
1486 percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies
1487 provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements under this subsection
1488 shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.



1489 **SECTION 7.** Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1490 amended as follows:

1491 65-4-15. (1) There is hereby established a special fund in
1492 the State Treasury to be known as the "Economic Development
1493 Highway Fund" which shall consist of such monies as the
1494 Legislature shall appropriate thereto or such other monies as the
1495 Legislature may designate to be deposited therein. Any monies to
1496 the credit of such fund may be expended by the Mississippi
1497 Department of Transportation or political subdivision, as
1498 appropriate, upon approval of requisitions therefor by the
1499 Mississippi Development Authority for any expenses incurred by the
1500 Transportation Department or political subdivision in constructing
1501 and improving highways and highway segments which have been
1502 approved by the Mississippi Development Authority under the
1503 provisions of this chapter. From and after July 1, 2004, no
1504 monies to the credit of the fund may be expended for the
1505 construction and improvement of highways for high economic benefit
1506 projects that are being developed for the primary purpose of
1507 conducting retail sales unless the Mississippi Development
1508 Authority has received an application for the project prior to
1509 July 1, 2004; however, the primary purpose is not conducting
1510 retail sales if the project is a mixed-use development for which
1511 retail space is no more than twenty percent (20%) of the square
1512 footage of the development. With regard to a high economic
1513 benefit project as defined in Section 65-4-5(1)(c)(xiii) for which



1514 the Mississippi Development Authority approved and allocated
1515 monies in the fund before January 1, 2016, for constructing or
1516 improving a highway or highway segment related to the high
1517 economic benefit project, the Mississippi Development Authority
1518 may reallocate such monies from the original highway or highway
1519 segment purpose and allocate the funds for constructing or
1520 improving another highway or highway segment provided that such
1521 highway or highway segment is located within three (3) miles of
1522 the high economic benefit project for which the Mississippi
1523 Development Authority originally allocated and approved the
1524 monies. The Office of State Aid Road Construction shall be
1525 entitled to reimbursement from monies in the fund, upon approval
1526 by the Mississippi Development Authority of requisitions therefor
1527 by the State Aid Engineer, for the actual expenses incurred by the
1528 office in administering and providing engineering services to
1529 political subdivisions. Monies remaining unexpended to the credit
1530 of such special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1531 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on the
1532 investment of monies in the special fund shall be deposited to the
1533 credit of the fund.

1534 (2) Monies in the Economic Development Highway Fund which
1535 are derived from proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter after
1536 July 1, 2003, or provided by the Legislature may be used to
1537 reimburse reasonable actual and necessary costs incurred by the
1538 Mississippi Development Authority for the administration of the



1539 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1540 by the authority. An accounting of actual costs incurred for
1541 which reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the
1542 Mississippi Development Authority. Reimbursement of reasonable
1543 actual and necessary costs shall not exceed three percent (3%) of
1544 the proceeds of bonds issued or the monies provided by the
1545 Legislature. Reimbursements to the Mississippi Development
1546 Authority under this subsection shall satisfy any applicable
1547 federal tax law requirements.

1548 **SECTION 8.** Section 57-1-221, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1549 amended as follows:

1550 57-1-221. (1) As used in this section:

1551 (a) "Approved business enterprise" means any project
1552 that:

1553 (i) Locates or expands in this state, including
1554 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1555 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of two hundred fifty
1556 (250) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the
1557 state of a minimum of Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) in
1558 Tier 1 or Tier 2 counties;

1559 (ii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1560 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1561 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one hundred fifty
1562 (150) new, full-time jobs with a total capital investment in the



1563 state of a minimum of Fifteen Million Dollars (\$15,000,000.00) in
1564 areas federally designated as low-income census tracts;

1565 (iii) Locates or expands in this state, including
1566 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1567 boundary of this state, and creates a minimum of one thousand
1568 (1,000) new, full-time jobs;

1569 (iv) Is a manufacturer of high-end kitchen
1570 appliances having at least four hundred (400) employees working at
1571 its Mississippi facilities on January 1, 2015, and with a capital
1572 investment of at least Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) made
1573 after July 1, 2014, through four (4) years after July 1, 2015,
1574 that expands in this state, including any federal Indian
1575 reservation located within the geographical boundary of this
1576 state, and retains a minimum of four hundred (400) jobs; or

1577 (v) Locates or expands in this state, including
1578 any federal Indian reservation located within the geographical
1579 boundary of this state, with significant regional impact as
1580 determined by MDA.

1581 (b) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1582 (c) "Facility related to the project" means and
1583 includes any of the following, as they may pertain to the project:

1584 (i) Facilities to provide potable and industrial
1585 water supply systems, sewage and waste disposal systems and water,
1586 natural gas and electric transmission systems to the site of the
1587 project;



1588 (ii) Building facilities and equipment necessary
1589 to operate the facility;
1590 (iii) Rail lines;
1591 (iv) Airports, airfields, air terminals and port
1592 facilities;
1593 (v) Highways, streets and other roadways; and
1594 (vi) Fire protection facilities, equipment and
1595 elevated water tanks.

1596 (d) "Project" means any industrial, commercial,
1597 research and development, warehousing, distribution,
1598 transportation, processing, mining, United States government or
1599 tourism enterprise together with all real property required for
1600 construction, maintenance and operation of the enterprise that is
1601 approved by the MDA. The term "project" does not include any
1602 medical cannabis establishment as defined in the Mississippi
1603 Medical Cannabis Act.

1604 (2) (a) There is created a special fund in the State
1605 Treasury to be known as the Mississippi Industry Incentive
1606 Financing Revolving Fund which shall consist of monies from any
1607 source designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1608 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1609 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1610 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Except as
1611 otherwise provided, monies in the fund shall be disbursed by the
1612 Mississippi Development Authority for the purposes authorized in



1613 subsection (3) of this section. The Mississippi Development
1614 Authority shall allocate and disburse Thirty Million Dollars
1615 (\$30,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Mississippi State
1616 University for the construction, furnishing and equipping of a
1617 high-performance computing data center that is home to federally
1618 designated centers of computing excellence. The disbursement of
1619 such funds shall not be subject to any requirements of this
1620 section relating to grants and loans made by the Mississippi
1621 Development Authority under this section. The Mississippi
1622 Development Authority shall allocate and disburse Three Million
1623 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) from the fund as a grant to Delta Health
1624 System for capital costs related to hospital systems expansion.
1625 The disbursement of such funds shall not be subject to any
1626 requirements of this section relating to grants and loans made by
1627 the Mississippi Development Authority under this section. The
1628 Mississippi Development Authority shall disburse such funds to
1629 Delta Health System not later than thirty (30) days after April
1630 22, 2021.

1631 (b) Monies in the fund that are derived from the
1632 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1633 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and
1634 necessary costs incurred by the MDA for the administration of the
1635 various grant, loan and financial incentive programs administered
1636 by the MDA. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1637 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained by the MDA.



1638 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs shall not
1639 exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of bonds issued or the
1640 monies provided by the Legislature. Reimbursements made under
1641 this subsection shall satisfy any applicable federal tax law
1642 requirements.

1643 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants or
1644 loans from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1645 Fund to local governments, including, but not limited to,
1646 counties, municipalities, industrial development authorities and
1647 economic development districts, and approved business enterprises
1648 to construct or otherwise provide facilities related to the
1649 project. Local governments are authorized to accept grants and
1650 enter into loans authorized under the program, and to sell, lease
1651 or otherwise dispose of a project or any property related to the
1652 project in whole or in part.

1653 (4) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any
1654 business enterprise or local government desiring a grant or loan
1655 under this section shall submit an application to the MDA which
1656 shall include, at a minimum:

1657 (i) Evidence that the business or industry meets
1658 the definition of an approved business enterprise;

1659 (ii) A description, including the cost, of the
1660 requested assistance;

1661 (iii) A description of the purpose for which the
1662 assistance is requested; and



1663 (iv) Any other information required by the MDA.
1664 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the
1665 MDA shall require that binding commitments be entered into
1666 requiring that:
1667 (i) The minimum requirements of this section and
1668 such other requirements as the MDA considers proper shall be met;
1669 and
1670 (ii) If such requirements are not met, all or a
1671 portion of the funds provided by this section as determined by the
1672 MDA shall be repaid.
1673 (c) Upon receipt of the application from a business
1674 enterprise or local government for a grant or loan under this
1675 section, the MDA shall determine whether the enterprise meets the
1676 definition of an approved business enterprise and determine
1677 whether to provide the assistance requested in the form of a grant
1678 or a loan.
1679 (d) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) (a)
1680 of this section, the MDA shall have sole discretion in providing
1681 grants or loans under this section. The terms of a grant or loan
1682 provided under this section and the manner of repayment of any
1683 loan shall be within the discretion of the MDA. Repayments of
1684 loans made under this section shall be deposited to the credit of
1685 the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving Fund until
1686 the uncommitted balance in the fund reaches Fifty Million Dollars
1687 (\$50,000,000.00). Once the uncommitted balance in the fund



1688 reaches Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00), repayments of
1689 loans under this section shall be deposited to the credit of Fund
1690 No. 3951 in the State Treasury to pay debt service on bonds until
1691 such time as the uncommitted balance in the fund falls below Fifty
1692 Million Dollars (\$50,000,000.00).

1693 (e) The MDA shall notify the Chairman of the Senate
1694 Finance Committee and the Chairman of the House Ways and Means
1695 Committee of the approval of any grant or loan application thirty
1696 (30) days prior to the disbursement of any monies for the loan or
1697 grant from the Mississippi Industry Incentive Financing Revolving
1698 Fund. The notification shall identify the applicant and the
1699 purposes for which the loan or grant is made.

1700 (5) (a) Contracts, by local governments, including, but not
1701 limited to, design and construction contracts, for the
1702 acquisition, purchase, construction or installation of a project
1703 shall be exempt from the provisions of Section 31-7-13 if:

1704 (i) The MDA finds and records such finding on its
1705 minutes, that because of availability or the particular nature of
1706 a project, it would not be in the public interest or would less
1707 effectively achieve the purposes of this section to enter into
1708 such contracts on the basis of Section 31-7-13; and

1709 (ii) The approved business enterprise that is
1710 involved in the project concurs in such finding.

1711 (b) When the requirements of paragraph (a) of this
1712 subsection are met:



1713 (i) The requirements of Section 31-7-13 shall not
1714 apply to such contracts; and

1715 (ii) The contracts may be entered into on the
1716 basis of negotiation.

1717 (6) It is the policy of the MDA and the MDA is authorized to
1718 accommodate and support any enterprise that receives a loan under
1719 this section for a project defined in Section 17-25-23 that wishes
1720 to have a program of diversity in contracting, and/or that wishes
1721 to do business with or cause its prime contractor to do business
1722 with Mississippi companies, including those companies that are
1723 small business concerns owned and controlled by socially and
1724 economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and
1725 economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning
1726 ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act
1727 (15 USCS 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations
1728 promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed
1729 to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the
1730 purposes of this subsection.

1731 (7) The MDA shall promulgate rules and regulations, in
1732 accordance with the Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, for
1733 the implementation of this section.

1734 **SECTION 9.** Section 57-1-601, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
1735 amended as follows:



1736 57-1-601. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
1737 following words shall have the following meanings ascribed in this
1738 section, unless the context clearly otherwise requires:

1739 (a) "MDA" means the Mississippi Development Authority.

1740 (b) "Municipality" means any municipality with a
1741 population of less than fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the
1742 latest federal decennial census at the time the municipality
1743 submits an application to the MDA under this section.

1744 (c) "Revitalization zone" means an area in the
1745 municipality officially designated by ordinance or resolution of
1746 the governing authorities of the municipality as a revitalization
1747 zone and approved and certified by the MDA as meeting the
1748 requirements of this section.

1749 (2) (a) There is created in the State Treasury a special
1750 fund to be designated as the "Mississippi Main Street Investment
1751 Grant Fund" which shall consist of funds from any source
1752 designated for deposit into the fund. Unexpended amounts
1753 remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse
1754 into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in
1755 the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. Monies in
1756 the fund shall be used by the MDA for the purposes authorized in
1757 subsection (3) of this section.

1758 (b) Monies in the fund which are derived from the
1759 proceeds of general obligation bonds or provided by the
1760 Legislature may be used to reimburse reasonable actual and



1761 necessary costs incurred by the MDA in providing grants under this
1762 section through the use of proceeds of such general obligation
1763 bonds. An accounting of actual costs incurred for which
1764 reimbursement is sought shall be maintained for the program.
1765 Reimbursement of reasonable actual and necessary costs for
1766 assistance shall not exceed three percent (3%) of the proceeds of
1767 bonds issued for such assistance or the monies provided by the
1768 Legislature. Reimbursements made under this subsection shall
1769 satisfy any applicable federal tax law requirements.

1770 (3) The MDA shall establish a program to make grants to a
1771 municipality to assist with maintaining and improving the
1772 viability of revitalization zones. The proceeds of a grant made
1773 to a municipality under this section may be used for maintaining
1774 and/or improving the viability of a revitalization zone through
1775 means deemed appropriate by the governing authorities of a
1776 municipality, including, but not limited to, making loans, grants
1777 and/or other forms of assistance to any person or public or
1778 private association or other entity for use for infrastructure
1779 projects, improvements to properties, signage and other purposes
1780 related to maintaining and/or improving the viability of the
1781 revitalization zone.

1782 (4) (a) If a municipality desires a grant under this
1783 section, the municipality shall submit an application to the MDA
1784 seeking (i) approval and certification of the proposed



1785 revitalization zone and (ii) a grant for the purposes authorized
1786 in this section. The application shall include, at a minimum:

1787 1. The name of the proposed revitalization
1788 zone, together with the words, "revitalization zone";

1789 2. A description of the revitalization zone
1790 by metes and bounds;

1791 3. A map showing the parcels of real property
1792 included in the revitalization zone and the present use of such
1793 parcels;

1794 4. A master plan for the revitalization zone
1795 that has been approved by sixty percent (60%) of the property
1796 owners within the zone at the time the municipality submits the
1797 application; and

1798 5. Any other information required by the MDA.
1799 The governing authorities of a municipality may designate the
1800 boundaries of a proposed revitalization zone by adoption of an
1801 ordinance or resolution that is spread upon its minutes and
1802 describes the boundaries of the zone.

1803 (b) The MDA shall review the application to confirm
1804 that the revitalization zone meets the requirements of this
1805 section. A revitalization zone may embrace two (2) or more
1806 separate parcels of real property, and such property may be
1807 publicly and/or privately owned. Each revitalization zone shall
1808 be of such size and form as to include all properties that, in the
1809 determination of the municipality and the MDA, constitute an



1810 integral part of the revitalization zone. If the MDA determines
1811 that the boundaries of the proposed revitalization zone exceed the
1812 area that is reasonably deemed to be integral to the
1813 revitalization zone, the MDA may reduce the boundaries of the
1814 proposed area. Upon the approval and selection of a municipal
1815 revitalization zone project, the MDA shall certify the
1816 revitalization zone.

1817 (5) The MDA shall have all powers necessary to implement and
1818 administer the program established under this section, and the MDA
1819 shall promulgate rules and regulations, in accordance with the
1820 Mississippi Administrative Procedures Law, necessary for the
1821 implementation of this section.

1822 **SECTION 10.** Section 9, Chapter 98, Laws of 2022,
1823 appropriation to the Workers' Compensation Commission, is amended
1824 as follows:

1825 Section 9. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
1826 Section 2 of this act, Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00),
1827 or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State
1828 Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in
1829 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a
1830 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. This
1831 appropriation is made for the purpose of * * * infrastructure
1832 improvements to the commission's building, including, but not
1833 limited to, ADA compliance.



1834 **SECTION 11.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
1835 and after its passage.
