Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 4 5 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of Human 6 7 Services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 74,476,245.00. 8 9 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 10 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in 11 the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Human 12 Services which is comprised of special source funds collected by 13 or otherwise available to the department for the support of the

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14 various divisions of the department, for the purpose of defraying 15 the expenses of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024.....\$ 1,736,609,583.00. 16 17 SECTION 3. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall 18 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 19 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the 20 Department of Human Services that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules 21 22 or regulations that implement state or federal law.

23 **SECTION 4.** With the funds appropriated in this act, the 24 following positions are authorized:

25 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

28 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 29 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 30 Services for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2024 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 31 32 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 budget by the Mississippi 33 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 34 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 35 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 36 37 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 38

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39 Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed the data provided by the 40 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2024 41 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 42 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 43 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

44 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 45 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 46 47 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 48 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 49 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 50 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 51 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 52 appropriated level.

53 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 54 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 55 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 56 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

57 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 58 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating 59 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 60 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation

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64 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 65 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 66 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

67 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 68 Department of Human Services shall maintain complete accounting 69 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 70 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 71 72 2023. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 73 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be submitted to 74 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 75 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 76 during the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request process.

77 SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 herein to 78 the Department of Human Services, One Million Dollars 79 (\$1,000,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of Health, 80 Child Care Licensure Program from the Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate special fund. These funds are to be 81 82 transferred to the Board of Health no later than July 31, 2023. 83 The Department of Health shall make a complete accounting to the 84 Department of Human Services detailing the uses of these funds in 85 accordance with federal and state regulations.

86 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that 87 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 88 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

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89 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 90 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 91 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 92 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 93 made without competitive bids.

94 SECTION 8. The Department of Human Services is authorized to 95 expend available funds on technology or equipment upgrades or 96 replacements when it will generate savings through efficiency or 97 when the savings generated from such upgrades or replacements 98 exceed expenditures thereof.

99 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 100 of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 101 utilities for state furnished housing for any employees. Such 102 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 103 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 104 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 105 with legislative intent. Such state furnished housing shall 106 include single-family and multi-family residences but shall not 107 include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities 108 shall be prohibited.

109 SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 110 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 111 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 112 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 113 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

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214 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 215 Committee for Fiscal Year 2025.

216 SECTION 11. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 217 Department of Human Services, Division of Child Support 218 Enforcement, make a concentrated effort to increase collections of 219 past due child support payments. On or before January 1, 2024, 220 the Executive Director of the Department of Human Services shall 221 submit a report to the Legislative Budget Office detailing 222 year-to-date performance measures in the Child Support Enforcement 223 Program compared with the prior year.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Human Services shall have the authority to spend such additional funds as it shall receive from the federal government in incentives or the federal match on those incentives for the purpose of child support enforcement.

SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be transferred to the Juvenile Facility Monitoring Unit at the Department of Public Safety no later than July 31, 2023.

SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated herein, to the Department of Human Services One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), is provided for the support of the Home Delivered Meals Program and any additional funds that may be appropriated to this program.

237 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds provided in Section 1, herein to 238 the Department of Human Services, an amount not to exceed One

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Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided to fund the Senior Olympics Program.

SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Governor's Office, Division of Medicaid and the Department of Human Services shall continue to work together to implement Section 43-12-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, known as the "Medicaid and Human Services Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".

246 **SECTION 17.** As a condition of receiving and expending any 247 funds appropriated under this act, the Department of Human 248 Services:

(a) Shall use a competitive procurement process for entering into all TANF subgrant agreements with non-state entities when the federal government does not direct to whom the funds must be subgranted;

(b) Upon awarding of a grant to any subgrantee of the department, shall require the subgrantee to submit a monthly report to the department that contains, but is not limited to, all of the following:

257 (i) A listing of all costs incurred by the subgrantee258 during the previous month;

(ii) A listing of all clients served by the subgrantee, with an explanation of which services were provided to the clients;

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(iii) A listing of all lower-tier subgrantees, who must be approved by the department before the execution of any such agreement by the prime subgrantee; and

265 (iv) Any other data required by the department to 266 provide sufficient evidence of budgetary compliance;

267 (c) Shall not advance funds to a subgrantee for more than268 sixty (60) days; and

(d) Shall reimburse a subgrantee for expenses only after the required documentation is provided and is approved by the department.

SECTION 18. It is the intent of the Legislature, that within the funds available, the Department of Human Services may provide any qualifying grants of CARES Act or American Rescue Act funding in an amount not to exceed One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) to the three (3) regional food banks that serve Mississippi, including Feed the Gulf Coast, Mid-South Food Bank, and Mississippi Food Network.

279 SECTION 19. With the funds appropriated herein, the 280 Department of Human Services is authorized to make payment to 281 certain vendors for expenses incurred during 2021 as follows:

In addition, this reappropriation shall not 305 change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized. 306 **SECTION 21.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 307 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 308 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 309 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. **SECTION 22.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2023, except for Section 19 which shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage of this act and through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2023.
