HOUSE BILL NO. 37

- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-23-33, 73-23-35 AND 73-23-59,
- 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT FOR A REFERRAL
- 3 BY A PHYSICIAN OR OTHER PRACTITIONER BEFORE A PHYSICAL THERAPIST
- MAY PROVIDE PHYSICAL THERAPY SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 73-23-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 73-23-33. As used in this chapter, unless the context or
- 9 subject matter otherwise requires:
- 10 "Physical therapy" or "physiotherapy," which terms
- are deemed identical and interchangeable, means the art and 11
- 12 science of a health specialty concerned with the prevention of
- 13 disability, and the physical rehabilitation for congenital or
- 14 acquired physical or mental disabilities, resulting from or
- secondary to injury or disease. The "practice of physical 15
- therapy" means the practice of the health specialty and 16
- 17 encompasses physical therapy evaluation, treatment planning,
- treatment administration, instruction and consultative services, 18
- 19 including:

20	(i) Performing and interpreting tests and
21	measurements as an aid to physical therapy treatment, for the
22	purpose of correcting or alleviating any physical condition and to
23	prevent the development of any physical or mental disability
24	within the scope of physical therapy; and the performance of
25	neuromuscular-skeletal tests and measurements as an aid in
26	diagnosis, evaluation or determination of the existence of and the
27	extent of any body malfunction;
28	(ii) Planning initial and subsequent treatment
29	programs, on the basis of test findings; and
30	(iii) Administering treatment by therapeutic
31	exercise, neurodevelopmental procedures, therapeutic massage,
32	mechanical devices and therapeutic agents which employ the
33	physical, chemical and other properties of air, water, heat, cold,
34	electricity, sound and radiant energy for the purpose of
35	correcting or alleviating any physical condition or preventing the
36	development of any physical or mental disability. The use of
37	roentgen rays and radium for any purpose, and the use of
38	electricity for surgical purposes including cauterization, are not
39	part of physical therapy * * *.
40	(b) "Physical therapist" means a person licensed in
41	this state to practice physical therapy as defined in this
42	chapter, and whose license is in good standing, or a person who

holds the privilege to practice * * *.

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"Physical therapist assistant" means a health care
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    worker who assists a physical therapist in the provision of
    physical therapy under the direct, on-site supervision of the
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    physical therapist. The physical therapist assistant may perform
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    physical therapy procedures and related tasks that have been
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    selected and delegated by the supervising physical therapist, but
    shall not perform the following physical therapy activities: * * *
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    physical therapy initial evaluation and reevaluation;
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    identification, determination or modification of plans of care
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    (including goals and treatment programs); final discharge
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    assessment/evaluation or establishment of the discharge plan; or
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    therapeutic techniques beyond the skill and knowledge of the
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    physical therapist assistant * * *.
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               ( * * *d) "Board" means the State Board of Physical
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    Therapy established in Section 73-23-41 * * *.
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               ( * * *∈)
                        "Direct, on-site supervision" means
    face-to-face oversight by a licensed physical therapist or
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    physical therapist who holds the privilege to practice at regular
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    intervals, as prescribed in regulations adopted by the board, of
    the services provided to a patient by a licensed physical
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    therapist assistant or physical therapist assistant who holds the
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    privilege to practice * * *.
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               ( * * *f) "Direct supervision" means face-to-face
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oversight at regular intervals of a physical therapist issued a

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- 69 temporary license under Section 73-23-53(1) by a licensed physical
- 70 therapist. Such direct supervision shall be in accordance with
- 71 the regulations adopted by the board; however, a licensed physical
- 72 therapist shall be authorized to have direct supervision over not
- 73 more than four (4) physical therapist assistants at one time.
- 74 (* * *q) "Privilege to practice" means the
- 75 authorization to practice as a physical therapist in this state or
- 76 work as a physical therapist assistant in this state under the
- 77 Physical Therapy Licensure Compact provided for in Section
- 78 73-23-101.
- 79 (***h) "Licensee" means a person who has been issued
- 80 a license to practice physical therapy or work as a physical
- 81 therapy assistant in the state or who holds the privilege to
- 82 practice physical therapy or work as a physical therapy assistant
- 83 in the state.
- SECTION 2. Section 73-23-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 85 amended as follows:
- 73-23-35. (1) A person, corporation, association or
- 87 business entity shall not use in connection with that person's or
- 88 party's name or the name or activity of the business the words
- 89 "physical therapy," "physical therapist," "physiotherapy,"
- 90 "physiotherapist," "registered physical therapist," "doctor of
- 91 physical therapy, " "physical therapist assistant," the letters
- 92 "PT," "DPT," "LPT," "RPT," "PTA," "LPTA," and/or any other words,
- 93 abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying directly or

indirectly that physical therapy is provided or supplied unless such services are provided by or under the direction of a physical therapist or physical therapist assistant, as the case may be, with a valid and current license issued pursuant to this chapter or with the privilege to practice. It shall be unlawful to employ an unlicensed physical therapist or physical therapist assistant

to provide physical therapy services.

101 The board shall aid the state's attorneys of the various 102 counties in the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and the prosecution of any violations thereof. In addition to the 103 104 criminal penalties provided by this chapter, the civil remedy of 105 injunction shall be available to restrain and enjoin violations of 106 any provisions of this chapter without proof of actual damages 107 sustained by any person. For purposes of this chapter, the board, in seeking an injunction, need only show that the defendant 108 109 violated subsection (1) of this section to establish irreparable 110 injury or a likelihood of a continuation of the violation. (* * *3) Nothing in this section shall restrict the 111 112 Division of Medicaid from setting rules and regulations regarding 113 the coverage of physical therapy services and nothing in this 114 section shall amend or change the Division of Medicaid's schedule 115 of benefits, exclusions and/or limitations related to physical 116 therapy services as determined by state or federal regulations and 117 state and federal law.

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118	SECTION 3.	Section	73-23-59,	Mississippi	Code	of	1972,	is

- 119 amended as follows:
- 120 73-23-59. (1) Licensees subject to this chapter shall
- 121 conduct their activities, services and practice in accordance with
- 122 this chapter and any rules promulgated pursuant hereto. The
- 123 board, upon satisfactory proof and in accordance with the
- 124 provisions of this chapter and the regulations of the board, may
- 125 suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew any license
- 126 hereunder, or revoke or suspend any privilege to practice,
- 127 censure or reprimand any licensee, restrict or limit a license,
- 128 and take any other action in relation to a license or privilege to
- 129 practice as the board may deem proper under the circumstances upon
- 130 any of the following grounds:
- 131 (a) Negligence in the practice or performance of
- 132 professional services or activities;
- 133 (b) Engaging in dishonorable, unethical or
- 134 unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud
- 135 or harm the public in the course of professional services or
- 136 activities;
- 137 (c) Perpetrating or cooperating in fraud or material
- 138 deception in obtaining or renewing a license or attempting the
- 139 same or obtaining a privilege to practice;
- 140 (d) Being convicted of any crime which has a
- 141 substantial relationship to the licensee's activities and services

- (e) Having been convicted of or pled guilty to a felony
- in the courts of this state or any other state, territory or
- 146 country. Conviction, as used in this paragraph, shall include a
- 147 deferred conviction, deferred prosecution, deferred sentence,
- 148 finding or verdict of guilt, an admission of guilty, or a plea of
- 149 nolo contendere;
- 150 (f) Engaging in or permitting the performance of
- 151 unacceptable services personally or by others working under the
- 152 licensee's supervision due to the licensee's deliberate or
- 153 negligent act or acts or failure to act, regardless of whether
- 154 actual damage or damages to the public is established;
- 155 (q) Continued practice although the licensee has become
- 156 unfit to practice as a physical therapist or physical therapist
- 157 assistant due to: (i) failure to keep abreast of current
- 158 professional theory or practice; or (ii) physical or mental
- 159 disability; the entry of an order or judgment by a court of
- 160 competent jurisdiction that a licensee is in need of mental
- 161 treatment or is incompetent shall constitute mental disability; or
- 162 (iii) addiction or severe dependency upon alcohol or other drugs
- 163 which may endanger the public by impairing the licensee's ability
- 164 to practice;
- 165 (h) Having disciplinary action taken against the
- 166 licensee's license in another state;

- 169 national origin;
- 170 (j) Engaging in lewd conduct in connection with
- 171 professional services or activities;
- (k) Engaging in false or misleading advertising;
- 173 (1) Contracting, assisting or permitting unlicensed
- 174 persons to perform services for which a license is required under
- 175 this chapter or privilege to practice is required under Section
- 176 73-23-101;
- 177 (m) Violation of any probation requirements placed on a
- 178 license or privilege to practice by the board;
- (n) Revealing confidential information except as may be
- 180 required by law;
- 181 (o) Failing to inform clients of the fact that the
- 182 client no longer needs the services or professional assistance of
- 183 the licensee;
- (p) Charging excessive or unreasonable fees or engaging
- 185 in unreasonable collection practices;
- 186 (q) For treating or attempting to treat ailments or
- 187 other health conditions of human beings other than by physical
- 188 therapy as authorized by this chapter;
- 189 (r) * * * For acting as a physical therapist assistant
- 190 other than under the direct, on-site supervision of a licensed
- 191 physical therapist;

- 195 (t) Failing to complete continuing competence 196 requirements as established by board rule;
- 197 (u) Failing to supervise physical therapist assistants 198 in accordance with this chapter and/or board rules;
- (v) Engaging in sexual misconduct. For the purpose of this paragraph, sexual misconduct includes, but is not necessarily limited to:
- 202 (i) Engaging in or soliciting sexual
 203 relationships, whether consensual or nonconsensual, while a
 204 physical therapist or physical therapist assistant/patient
 205 relationship exists.
- (ii) Making sexual advances, requesting sexual
 favors or engaging in other verbal conduct or physical contact of
 a sexual nature with patients or clients.
- 209 (iii) Intentionally viewing a completely or 210 partially disrobed patient in the course of treatment if the 211 viewing is not related to patient diagnosis or treatment under 212 current practice standards;
- 213 (w) The erroneous issuance of a license or privilege to 214 practice to any person;
- 215 (x) Violations of any provisions of this chapter, board 216 rules or regulations or a written order or directive of the board;

217	(y) Failing to maintain adequate patient records. For
218	the purposes of this paragraph, "adequate patient records" means
219	legible records that contain at minimum sufficient information to
220	identify the patient, an evaluation of objective findings, a
221	diagnosis, a plan of care, a treatment record and a discharge
222	plan;

- (z) Failing to report to the board any unprofessional, incompetent or illegal acts that appear to be in violation of this law or any rules established by the board.
- 226 (2) The board may order a licensee to submit to a reasonable 227 physical or mental examination if the licensee's physical or 228 mental capacity to practice safely is at issue in a disciplinary 229 proceeding.
- 230 (3) Failure to comply with a board order to submit to a
 231 physical or mental examination shall render a licensee subject to
 232 the summary suspension procedures described in Section 73-23-64.
- 233 In addition to the reasons specified in subsection (1) (4)234 of this section, the board shall be authorized to suspend the 235 license or privilege to practice of any licensee for being out of 236 compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153. The procedure for suspension of a license or privilege 237 238 to practice for being out of compliance with an order for support, 239 and the procedure for the reissuance or reinstatement of a license 240 or privilege to practice suspended for that purpose, and the payment of any fees for the reissuance or reinstatement of a 241

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- 243 be governed by Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be.
- 244 If there is any conflict between any provision of Section
- 245 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any provision of this chapter, the
- 246 provisions of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163, as the case may be,
- 247 shall control.
- 248 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 249 and after July 1, 2024.
