HOUSE BILL NO. 122

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 3-3-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE STATE HOLIDAYS TO REMOVE CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL DAY AS A 3 LEGAL HOLIDAY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 3-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 3-3-7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) 7 8 of this section, the following are declared to be legal 9 holidays * * *: (a) The first day of January, designated as New Year's 10 11 Day; 12 The third Monday of January, designated as Robert (b) E. Lee's birthday and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday; 13 14 (c) The third Monday of February, designated as George 15 Washington's birthday; * * * 16 17 The last Monday of May, designated as both National (d) Memorial Day and Jefferson Davis' birthday; 18 G1/2 H. 19 (e) The fourth day of July, designated as Independence
20 Day;

21 (f) The first Monday of September, designated as Labor
22 Day;

23 (g) The eleventh day of November, designated as
24 Armistice or Veterans' Day;

25 (h) The day fixed by proclamation by the Governor of 26 Mississippi as a day of Thanksgiving, which shall be fixed to 27 correspond to the date proclaimed by the President of the United 28 States, designated as Thanksgiving Day; and

29 (i) The twenty-fifth day of December, designated as
30 Christmas Day.

31 * * * <u>If any legal</u> holiday * * * falls on <u>a</u> Sunday, then the 32 next following day shall be a legal holiday.

33 In lieu of any one (1) legal holiday provided for in (2)34 subsection (1) of this section, with the exception of the third 35 Monday in January, designated as Robert E. Lee's and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday and the eleventh day of November, 36 37 designated as Armistice or Veterans' Day, the governing 38 authorities of any municipality or county may declare, by order 39 spread upon its minutes, Mardi Gras Day or any one (1) other day 40 during the year, to be a legal holiday.

41 (3) August 16 is declared to be Elvis Aaron Presley Day in
42 recognition and appreciation of Elvis Aaron Presley's many
43 contributions, international recognition and the rich legacy left

44 to us by Elvis Aaron Presley. This day shall be a day of 45 recognition and observation and shall not be recognized as a legal 46 holiday.

May 8 is declared to be Hernando de Soto Day in 47 (4) 48 recognition, observation and commemoration of Hernando de Soto, 49 who led the first and most imposing expedition ever made by 50 Europeans into the wilds of North America and the State of 51 Mississippi, and in further recognition of the Spanish explorer's 52 187-day journey from the Tombigbee River basin on our state's eastern boundary, westward to the place of discovery of the 53 Mississippi River on May 8, 1541. This day shall be a day of 54 55 commemoration, recognition and observation of Hernando de Soto and 56 European exploration and shall not be recognized as a legal 57 holiday.

Armistice * * * or Veterans' Day shall be observed by 58 (5) 59 appropriate exercises in all the public schools in the State of 60 Mississippi. The superintendent of schools of each public school district is authorized to provide for the appearance of uniformed 61 62 military personnel, uniformed veterans or the families of fallen 63 military personnel/veterans at such public school exercises in 64 honor of Armistice or Veterans' Day. The superintendent of 65 schools is also authorized to permit the school band and its 66 director(s) at any public school in the district to perform at 67 Armistice or Veterans' Day exercises in the school district upon the request of public officials or veterans associations without 68

69 loss of any program credit by participating students and without 70 loss of leave by participating school personnel.

71 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 72 and after July 1, 2024.
