HOUSE BILL NO. 999

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 13-5-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXEMPT ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND THEIR SPOUSES FROM JURY DUTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 13-5-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 13-5-25. (1) (a) Every citizen over sixty-five (65) years
- 8 of age, and everyone who has served as a grand juror or as a petit
- 9 juror in the trial of a litigated case within two (2) years, shall
- 10 be exempt from service if the juror claims the privilege. No
- 11 qualified juror shall be excluded because of any such reasons, but
- 12 the same shall be a personal privilege to be claimed by any person
- 13 selected for jury duty. Any citizen over sixty-five (65) years of
- 14 age may claim this personal privilege outside of open court by
- 15 providing the clerk of court with information that allows the
- 16 clerk to determine the validity of the claim.
- 17 (b) Every elected member of the Mississippi House of
- 18 Representatives and every elected member of the Senate, and his or

19	her	spouse	shall	be	exempt	from	service	if	the	iuror	claims	the

- 20 privilege. Any elected member of the Mississippi House of
- 21 Representatives and/or the Senate or his or her spouse, as
- 22 applicable, may claim this personal privilege outside of open
- 23 court by providing the clerk of court with information that allows
- 24 the clerk to determine the validity of the claim.
- 25 (2) Provided, however, that no person who has served as a
- 26 grand juror or as a petit juror in a trial of a litigated case in
- 27 one (1) court may claim the exemption in any other court where the
- 28 juror may be called to serve.
- 29 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 30 and after July 1, 2024.
