HOUSE BILL NO. 1049

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE THE CAP ON THE ANNUAL SUPPLEMENT, WHICH IS NOT TO EXCEED \$10,000.00, THAT BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS MAY PAY TO SHERIFFS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- 9 (2) through (12) of this section, the salaries of sheriffs of the
- 10 various counties are fixed as full compensation for their
- 11 services.
- 12 The annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the
- 13 total population of his county according to the latest federal
- 14 decennial census in the following categories and for the following
- 15 amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary
- 16 authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon
- 17 the population of the county according to the most recent federal
- 18 decennial census:

- 19 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 20 one hundred thousand (100,000), a salary of One Hundred Four
- 21 Thousand Dollars (\$104,000.00).
- 22 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- 23 forty-four thousand (44,000) and not more than one hundred
- thousand (100,000), a salary of Ninety-five Thousand Dollars
- 25 (\$95,000.00).
- 26 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- 27 thirty thousand (30,000) and not more than forty-four thousand
- 28 (44,000), a salary of Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00).
- 29 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- 30 twelve thousand five hundred (12,500) and not more than thirty
- 31 thousand (30,000), a salary of Eighty-five Thousand Dollars
- 32 (\$85,000.00).
- 33 (e) For counties with a total population of not more
- 34 than twelve thousand five hundred (12,500), a salary of Eighty
- 35 Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00).
- 36 (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 37 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County, in
- 38 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 39 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 40 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 41 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 42 county for the following reasons:

43	(a)	The	Mississippi	Department	of	Corrections	operates
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- 44 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 45 (b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 46 and maintains a community work center within the county;
- 47 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the
- 48 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 50 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 51 (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
- 52 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- 53 Leflore County Courthouse;
- 54 (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
- 55 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
- 56 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 57 patients from within the county;
- 58 (g) The increased activity of the Child Support
- 59 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 60 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 61 sheriff; and
- (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 63 place in Leflore County have been placed under the direction and
- 64 control of the sheriff.
- 65 (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, in its
- 67 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the

- 68 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 69 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 70 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 71 county for the following reasons:
- 72 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 73 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 74 the county;
- 75 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained
- 76 within the county at Whitfield;
- 77 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
- 78 the care and treatment of persons with an intellectual disability,
- 79 is located within the county;
- 80 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 81 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;
- 82 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained
- 83 within the county;
- 84 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 85 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 86 the county;
- 87 (q) The Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers International
- 88 Airport is located within the county;
- 89 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 90 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 91 and

92	(i)	The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
93	the nearly one	hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
94	has the duty to	o investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
95	of any misdemea	anor or felony committed upon any state property

- 96 located in Rankin County.
- 97 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 98 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
- 99 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- 100 equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 101 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 102 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its
- 103 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 104 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),
- 105 payable beginning April 1, 1997.
- 106 (6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 107 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
- 108 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
- 109 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature
- 110 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
- 111 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 112 (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any
- 113 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one
- 114 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 115 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;

- 118 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in
- 119 geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875)
- 120 square miles;
- (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial
- 122 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;
- (e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four
- 124 (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges
- 125 in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting
- 126 as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for
- 127 all;
- 128 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the
- 129 judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for
- 130 the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the
- 131 county;
- 132 (q) The state's only urban university, Jackson State
- 133 University, is located within the county;
- 134 (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 135 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
- 136 hospital, is located within the county;
- 137 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's
- 138 largest sports arena, is located within the county;
- 139 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the
- 140 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;

- 151 (n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
- 152 houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
- 153 Hinds County jail system; and
- 154 (o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly
- 155 asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and
- 156 Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of
- 157 Art and Jackson City Auditorium.
- 158 (7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 159 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in
- 160 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 161 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 162 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 163 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 164 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts

165	for the privat	e incarceration of	state inmates	at a private
166	correctional f	acility within the	county.	

- In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 167 (8) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 168 169 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 170 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 171 172 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 173 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 174 175 correctional facility within the county.
- (9) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 183 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates 184 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within 185 the county;
- 186 (b) In 1996, additional facilities to house another one
 187 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were
 188 constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
 189 the county; and

- 193 (10) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
 194 this section, the board of supervisors of any county, in its
 195 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
 196 county * * *. The amount of the supplement shall be spread on the
 197 minutes of the board. The annual supplement authorized in this
 198 subsection shall not be in addition to the annual supplements
 199 authorized in subsections (2) through (9).
- 200 (11) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1)
 201 and the supplements authorized in subsections (2) through (10),
 202 the board of supervisors of any county, in its discretion, may pay
 203 an annual supplement in an amount not to exceed Five Thousand
 204 Dollars (\$5,000.00) to the sheriff of any county in which a
 205 juvenile detention center is located. The amount of the
 206 supplement shall be spread on the minutes of the board.
- (12) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of this section and any supplements authorized in subsections (2) through (11) of this section, a sheriff may receive the premium pay provided for in Section 45-2-41 as part of the sheriff's compensation.
- 212 (13) (a) The salaries provided in this section shall be
 213 payable monthly on the first day of each calendar month by
 214 chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county;

- 215 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and
- 216 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be
- 217 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If
- 218 a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments
- 219 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or
- 220 legal holiday.
- (b) At least Ten Dollars (\$10.00) from each fee
- 222 collected and deposited into the county's general fund under the
- 223 provisions of paragraphs (a), (c) and (g) of subsection (1) of
- 224 Section 25-7-19 shall be used for the sheriffs' salaries
- 225 authorized in Section 25-3-25; as such Ten Dollar (\$10.00) amount
- 226 was authorized during the 2007 Regular Session in Chapter 331,
- 227 Laws of 2007, for the purpose of providing additional monies to
- 228 the counties for sheriffs' salaries.
- 229 (14) (a) All sheriffs, each year, shall attend twenty (20)
- 230 hours of continuing education courses in law enforcement. Such
- 231 courses shall be approved by the Mississippi Board on Law
- 232 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training. Such education
- 233 courses may be provided by an accredited law enforcement academy
- 234 or by the Mississippi Sheriffs' Association.
- 235 (b) The Mississippi Board on Law Enforcement Officer
- 236 Standards and Training shall reimburse each county for the
- 237 expenses incurred by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs for attendance
- 238 at any approved training programs as required by this subsection.

239 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 240 and after July 1, 2024.
