HOUSE BILL NO. 1057

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM ANNUAL AWARD UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI EMINENT SCHOLARS GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-106-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 37-106-31. (1) There is created a Mississippi Eminent
- 8 Scholars Grant Program, to be administered by the Mississippi
- 9 Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board established
- 10 under Section 37-106-9. The board shall set the dates that will
- 11 serve as the deadlines for applying for an award under this
- 12 section and award scholarships to each Mississippi student who:
- 13 (a) (i) Is recognized by the merit or achievement
- 14 programs of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation or the
- 15 National Achievement Scholarship as a semifinalist or finalist,
- 16 and has obtained a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5
- 17 calculated on a 4.0 scale in high school subjects acceptable for
- 18 credit toward a diploma, after seven (7) semesters certified by

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- 20 the application, and graduation from high school verified by the
- 21 institution before disbursement of award; or
- (ii) Has scored twenty-nine (29) on the American
- 23 College Testing Program or its equivalent and has obtained a
- 24 minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 calculated on a 4.0
- 25 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high school
- 26 counselor or other authorized school official on the application
- 27 and graduation from high school verified by the institution before
- 28 disbursement of award, or the equivalent in high school subjects
- 29 acceptable for credit toward a diploma; or
- 30 (iii) Has attended a home education program during
- 31 grade levels 9 through 12 and has scored twenty-nine (29) on the
- 32 American College Testing Program or its equivalent.
- 33 (b) Meets the general requirements for student
- 34 eligibility, except as otherwise provided in this section.
- 35 (c) Files, before the deadline, an application for an
- 36 award during his last year in high school, or before the
- 37 expiration of the third school year succeeding the year of his
- 38 high school graduation.
- 39 (d) Attends, on a full-time basis, any state
- 40 institution of higher learning or public community or junior
- 41 college, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit
- 42 two-year or four-year college or university located in the State
- 43 of Mississippi approved by the board.

44	(e) Enrolls as a "first-time in college" student in
45	Mississippi. Postsecondary academic credit earned prior to or
46	during the summer immediately subsequent to receiving a high
47	school diploma, or while dually enrolled in secondary and
48	postsecondary educational institutions, or while enrolled in the
49	early admission program of a postsecondary institution shall not
50	be considered when determining if a student is enrolling for the
51	first time. However, any student who earns postsecondary academic
52	credit at an institution of higher learning located outside the
53	state shall meet the requirements on grade point average and
54	maximum credit hours set forth in subsection (2)(b) of this
55	section.

- (f) Is a resident of the State of Mississippi.
- 57 (2) Except for students who earn credits at (a) 58 institutions of higher learning located outside the state, 59 students who apply for awards but do not accept their initial 60 awards may apply to receive awards during subsequent application periods occurring before the expiration of the third school year 61 62 succeeding the year of their high school graduation. The 63 eligibility of these applicants shall be determined in the same 64 manner as first-time applicants.
 - (b) Students who receive initial awards and who later do not accept renewal awards may apply to receive awards during subsequent application periods occurring before the expiration of the third school year succeeding the year of their high school

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- 69 graduation. Reinstatement applications will be accepted from
- 70 these students according to dates set by the Mississippi
- 71 Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board. The
- 72 eligibility of these applicants shall be determined in the same
- 73 manner as first-time applicants, except that these students shall
- 74 be required to have maintained the equivalent of a 3.5 cumulative
- 75 grade point average on a 4.0 scale for all college work attempted,
- 76 and if the student attended an out-of-state institution, to have
- 77 completed no more than thirty-six (36) credit hours. The board
- 78 shall not make awards to reinstatement applicants who submit
- 79 applications that are received after the deadline set by the
- 80 Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board.
- 81 (c) The board shall create a renewal application for
- 82 each student who received the award for one or more terms during
- 83 the immediately preceding academic year.
- 84 (3) (a) The annual award to a student shall be up to \star \star
- 85 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for tuition and fees. Payment
- 86 of the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant shall be made payable to
- 87 the recipient and the educational institution and mailed directly
- 88 to the institution, to be applied first to tuition.
- 89 (b) Within six (6) weeks of the end of regular
- 90 registration, inclusive of a drop-add period, institutions shall
- 91 certify to the board the eligibility status of each awarded
- 92 student. The eligibility status of each student to receive a
- 93 disbursement shall be determined by each institution as of this

- 94 date. Institutions shall not be required to reevaluate a
- 95 student's eligibility status after this date for purposes of
- amending eligibility determinations previously made. However, an 96
- institution shall be requested to make refunds for students who 97
- 98 receive award disbursements and terminate enrollment for any
- 99 reason during the academic term when an institution's refund
- 100 policies permit a student to receive a refund under the
- 101 circumstances.
- 102 Institutions shall certify to the board the amount (C)
- 103 of funds disbursed to each student and shall remit to the board
- 104 any undisbursed advances within sixty (60) days of the end of
- 105 regular registration.

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- 106 A recipient shall maintain the equivalent of a 3.5
- 107 cumulative grade point average on a 4.0 scale, or shall maintain
- an approved equivalent student progress evaluation plan, on at 108
- 109 least twelve (12) hours per quarter, trimester or semester in
- 110 order to be eligible for a continuation of the award. No student
- may receive a Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant for more than the 111
- 112 equivalent semesters or quarters required to complete one (1)
- 113 degree or certificate program per institution. The award may be
- 114 renewed annually upon certification of eligibility by the eligible
- 115 institutions that the recipient meets the necessary
- qualifications. If any recipient transfers from one university, 116
- 117 community college or junior college to another, his award will be
- transferable, provided he is otherwise eligible for the award. If 118

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- 120 granted an exception for cause by the administering board, the
- 121 student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi Eminent Scholars
- 122 Grant during the following semester or trimester or term of the
- 123 regular academic year.
- 124 (5) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any
- 125 institution participating in the Mississippi Eminent Scholars
- 126 Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an institution's
- 127 eligibility to receive future monies under the program if it finds
- 128 that the institution has not complied with the provisions of this
- 129 section.
- 130 (6) For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean,
- 131 but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in
- 132 eligible institutions approved by the board.
- 133 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 134 and after July 1, 2024.
