HOUSE BILL NO. 1058

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM ANNUAL AWARDS UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI 3 RESIDENT TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED 4 PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi 8 9 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or 10 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors, to be 11 administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, * * *which 12 shall set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under 13 this section. The board shall establish such rules and 14 regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry out the 15 purposes and intent of this section. 16

17 (2) The board shall approve grants to full-time freshmen,18 sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi residents who meet the

19 general requirements for student eligibility as provided in 20 subsection (4) of this section.

21 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be (3) 22 for Mississippi resident students from any Mississippi family 23 whose prior year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum 24 allowed to qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid. Those Mississippi students qualifying 25 for less than the full Pell Grant award shall receive a 26 27 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual 28 29 student. The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, 30 books, materials and fees, not to exceed *** * *** Two Thousand Five 31 Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for junior and senior students 32 attending state institutions of higher learning in Mississippi or four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit 33 34 colleges and universities in Mississippi, and * * * One Thousand 35 Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for freshmen and sophomores attending state institutions of higher learning or public 36 37 community or junior colleges in Mississippi, or regionally 38 accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or four-year 39 colleges in Mississippi * * *. An award will be prorated per 40 term, semester or quarter of the academic year for costs of 41 attendance, calculated according to the formula specified in 42 subsection (8) of this section.

44 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
45 consist of the following:

46 (a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
47 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
48 for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.

(b) Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution of higher learning or public community or junior college located in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit two-year or four-year college or university located in Mississippi and approved by the board.

(c) Completion of a secondary education as follows:
(i) Graduation from high school, as verified by
the institution before disbursement of <u>the</u> award, with a minimum
grade point average of 2.5 calculated on a 4.0 scale after seven
(7) semesters, as certified by the high school counselor or other
authorized school official on the application; or

60 (ii) Attendance at a home education program during 61 grade levels 9 through 12; or

62 (iii) Satisfactory completion of the High School63 Equivalency Diploma; or

64 (iv) Successful completion of the International65 Baccalaureate Program.

(d) A minimum score of fifteen (15) on the ACT test
except that any student entering a vocational or technical program

(e) Any student currently enrolled in any qualified institution shall have to only meet the same requirements as students who are applying for a renewal award.

75 By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance (5) 76 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and 77 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 78 79 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 80 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be 81 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 82 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 83 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars 84 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 85 86 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully obtained. 87

88 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition
89 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester,
90 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a
91 student shall:

93 or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
94 Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.

95 Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than (b) 96 two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive 97 academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the administering board; examples of cause may include student 98 99 participation in a cooperative program, internship program or 100 foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous 101 enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the 102 administering board, the student is ineligible to receive the 103 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following 104 semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year.

105 (c) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 106 2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or 107 trimester or term.

108 (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free 109 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of 110 Certification as designed by the administering board to determine 111 his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance 112 Grant.

(8) (a) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum
amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the
difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited

Cost of attendance is the 120 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance 121 for room and meals and books and materials.

(b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to be applied first to tuition.

126 (9) In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 127 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 128 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 129 following requirements:

(a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.

(b) The institution is required to make refunds to the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for

141 the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the 142 institution in such instance.

(c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
of the academic year, no refund will be required for that term.
However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
semester or quarter of the regular academic year.

149 The board may conduct its own annual audits of any (d) 150 institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 151 Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an 152 institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the 153 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the 154 provisions of this section. In determining a student's initial 155 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be 156 counted against the student.

(10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or
quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one
(1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.

161 (11) No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars 162 Grant, as provided in Section 37-106-31, shall be eligible to 163 receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant 164 to this section unless he is eligible for such award after the 165 Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the

For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in eligible institutions approved by the board.
