HOUSE BILL NO. 1124

- AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 45-2-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF
 1972, TO ESTABLISH THE FIRST RESPONDERS FUNERAL BENEFITS TRUST
 FUND IN THE STATE TREASURY; TO DEFINE THE TERM "FIRST RESPONDERS"
 AS LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, FIREFIGHTERS AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL
 TECHNICIANS; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO MAKE
 PAYMENTS FOR FUNERAL BENEFITS TO SURVIVORS OF FIRST RESPONDERS
 KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY; TO REQUIRE PAYMENTS TO BE MADE WITHIN
 THREE DAYS OF A FIRST RESPONDER'S DEATH; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT
 TO ADMINISTER THE TRUST FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 12 45-2-51, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 13 45-2-51. (1) As used in this section, the following words
- 14 and phrases have the meanings ascribed in this subsection unless
- 15 the context clearly requires otherwise:
- 16 (a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
- 17 officer, firefighter, including a volunteer firefighter, or
- 18 emergency medical technician when employed by a state board,
- 19 commission, department, division, bureau or agency, or a county,
- 20 municipality or other political subdivision of the state.

21 (b) "Emergency medical technician" means a person
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- 22 possesses a valid emergency medical technician's certificate
- 23 issued under Chapter 59, Title 41, Mississippi Code of 1972, or
- 24 who has a privilege to practice under the Emergency Medical
- 25 Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact.
- 26 (c) "Firefighter" means an individual who is trained
- 27 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
- 28 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to firefighting
- 29 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
- 30 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials
- 31 or other emergency incident.
- 32 (d) "First responders" means law enforcement officers,
- 33 firefighters and emergency medical technicians.
- 34 (e) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 35 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 36 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 37 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 38 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 39 or convicted of a crime, whether the officer is on regular duty on
- 40 full-time status, an auxiliary or reserve officer, or is serving
- 41 on a temporary or part-time status.
- 42 (f) "Trust fund" means the First Responders Funeral
- 43 Benefits Trust Fund.
- 44 (2) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 45 special fund to be known as the First Responders Funeral Benefits

- 46 Trust Fund. No later than three (3) days after the date of death
- 47 of a covered individual who is accidentally or intentionally
- 48 killed while engaged in the performance of the person's official
- 49 duties, the Department of Public Safety shall make a payment from
- 50 the trust fund in an amount equal to the actual cost of funeral
- 51 expenses, not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00), so
- 52 long as the killing is not the result of suicide.
- 53 (b) The payment required under this section must be
- 54 made to the beneficiary designated in writing by the covered
- 55 individual during the covered individual's lifetime. If no
- 56 designation was made, the payment must be made to the surviving
- 57 next of kin of the covered individual, in the following order of
- 58 priority: spouse; child or children; parent or parents; sibling
- 59 or siblings. If there is no designated beneficiary and no
- 60 surviving spouse, child, parent or sibling, the payment may be
- 61 made, in the discretion of the Commissioner of Public Safety, to
- 62 the person or persons responsible for arranging the funeral of the
- 63 covered individual.
- 64 (c) The payment made under this section is in addition
- 65 to any other payment that may be made under this chapter, workers'
- 66 compensation or pension benefits and is exempt from the claims and
- 67 demands of creditors of the covered individual.
- 68 (3) (a) The trust fund will be funded by an initial
- 69 appropriation of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00)
- 70 and will be comprised of any additional funds made available by

- 71 the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or any other 72 source.
- 73 (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the
- 74 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of
- 75 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121,
- 76 and those investments must be subject to the limitations
- 77 prescribed under Section 25-11-121.
- 78 (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at
- 79 the end of the fiscal year may not lapse into the State General
- 80 Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund must be
- 81 deposited to the credit of the trust fund.
- 82 (4) The Department of Public Safety is responsible for the
- 83 management of the fund and the disbursement of funeral benefits
- 84 authorized under this section. The department shall adopt rules
- 85 and regulations necessary to implement and standardize the payment
- 86 of funeral benefits under this section and for the general
- 87 administration of the trust fund. The rules and regulations
- 88 adopted by the department must include a procedure by which a
- 89 person entitled to benefits under this section, or a funeral
- 90 business acting on behalf of the person, may submit documentation
- 91 of the funeral expenses electronically to the department in order
- 92 to facilitate payment of the benefits as expeditiously as
- 93 possible.
- 94 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 95 and after July 1, 2024.
