HOUSE BILL NO. 1151

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE AN ADDITIONAL ROUND OF FIRE TRUCKS FOR COUNTIES AND 3 MUNICIPALITIES UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE 4 PROGRAM; TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT A COUNTY HAS RECEIVED 5 FUNDING FOR NO MORE THAN EIGHT ROUNDS FROM THE RURAL TRUCK 6 ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL 7 MATCHING ASSISTANCE UNDER THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 11 17-23-1. (1) There is established the Rural Fire Truck 12 Acquisition Assistance Program to be administered by the 13 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and 14 municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks. 15 There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to (2) 16 be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may 17 appropriate that amount necessary to fulfill the obligations 18 created under this section by the Department of Insurance, from 19 the State General Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be added to the remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995, 20

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21 and during the 1996 Regular Session to the Rural Fire Truck Fund. 22 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest 23 earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of 24 25 the fund. Unobligated amounts remaining in the Rural Fire Truck 26 Fund, Fund No. 3507, or in any fund created for funds appropriated 27 or otherwise made available for this program, may be used as 28 matching funds by any county with remaining eligibility as 29 provided herein. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 30 Department of Insurance continue to accept applications from the 31 counties for fire trucks as provided in subsection (3) of this 32 section.

33 (3) A county that meets the requirements provided (a) herein may receive an amount not to exceed * * * One Million One 34 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,000.00) as provided in 35 36 subparagraphs (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), 37 (ix), (x), (xi), (xii) and (xiii) of this paragraph, and such amount shall be divided as follows: an amount of not more than 38 39 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per fire truck for the first 40 six (6) trucks and not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars 41 (\$70,000.00) per fire truck for the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth 42 and eleventh trucks, and not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per fire truck for the twelfth, thirteenth, 43 fourteenth * * *, fifteenth and sixteenth truck. 44 Monies distributed under this chapter shall be expended only for the 45

(iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire
trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
for * * * <u>fourteen (14)</u> fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire
trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per
truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand

(viii) Any county that has received seven (7) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * <u>nine (9)</u> fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * <u>five (5)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Seven Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$730,000.00).

(ix) Any county that has received eight (8) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * <u>eight (8)</u> fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * <u>five (5)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Six Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$660,000.00).

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(x) Any county that has received nine (9) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * seven (7) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * five (5) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Five Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$590,000.00).

(xi) Any county that has received ten (10) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * <u>six (6)</u> fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * <u>five (5)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Five Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$520,000.00).

136 fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an
137 application for * * * <u>five (5)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety

(xiii) Any county may apply for * * * <u>five (5)</u>
fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
per truck as provided in subparagraph (xii), provided that the
county agrees to forego any previous fire truck under
subparagraphs (i) through (xi) for which the county has not
previously applied, and that the county has received approval from

147 The board of supervisors of the county shall submit (b) its request for the receipt of monies to the Department of 148 149 Insurance. A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance, 150 the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and 151 the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests 152 by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the 153 county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this 154 155 chapter.

156 (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this157 chapter:

158 A county or municipality must pledge to set (i) aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to 159 160 extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or 161 not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which 162 it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund, 163 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax 164 authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county 165 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities 166 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and 167 168 83-1-39.

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(ii) A municipality must provide adequate documentation of its contract with the county that requires the municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term "rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred (2,500) or less.

176 The Department of Insurance shall maintain an (d) 177 accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the 178 179 cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from 180 other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and 181 municipalities of the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance 182 Program and the requirements for them to become eligible to 183 participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as 184 may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this 185 chapter; and file with the Legislature a report detailing how 186 monies made available under this chapter were distributed and 187 spent during the preceding portion of the fiscal year in each 188 county and municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the 189 counties and municipalities making such purchases, and the cost of 190 each fire truck purchased.

191 (4) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to 192 be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Matching Assistance Fund," 193 which shall consist of funds appropriated by the Legislature from

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202 Subject to appropriation by the Legislature, the (5) 203 Department of Insurance may provide funds to counties and municipalities out of the Rural Fire Truck Matching Assistance 204 205 Fund in an amount exceeding the amount authorized in subsection 206 (3) of this section. However, the total amount of funds allowed 207 under this subsection combined with the funds provided in 208 subsection (3) of this section shall not exceed eighty percent 209 (80%) of the purchase price of the rural fire truck. A county or 210 municipality is eligible for such matching assistance upon meeting 211 the following criteria:

(a) The county or municipality's application is
approved for funding in accordance with the criteria in subsection
(3) (b) of this section; and

(b) The department determines that the county or municipality does not have sufficient funds available for the purchase of a rural fire truck with the funds authorized in subsection (3)(b) of this section * * *.

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220 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 221 and after July 1, 2024.

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
