HOUSE BILL NO. 1248

AN ACT TO BE KNOWN AS THE "TIM TEBOW ACT"; TO DEFINE CERTAIN TERMS; TO AUTHORIZE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN A HOMESCHOOL TO PARTICIPATE IN PUBLIC SCHOOL INTERSCHOLASTIC EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES; TO PRESCRIBE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A STUDENT ENROLLED 5 IN A HOMESCHOOL TO PARTICIPATE IN INTERSCHOLASTIC EXTRACURRICULAR 6 ACTIVITIES; TO PROHIBIT DISCRIMINATION AGAINST HOMESCHOOL STUDENT 7 SELECTION OR PARTICIPATION IN SUCH ACTIVITIES; TO PROVIDE THAT PARTICIPATION IN AN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY IS A PRIVILEGE AND 8 9 NOT A RIGHT; TO AUTHORIZE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO APPLY TO THE STATE 10 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO COVER THE COST 11 OF HOMESCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN EXTRACURRICULAR 12 ACTIVITIES; TO REQUIRE HOMESCHOOL STUDENTS TO PAY THE SAME 13 PARTICIPATION OR ACTIVITY FEES AS PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS; TO CREATE THE HOMESCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY FUND WITHIN THE 14 15 STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS 16 TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR HOMESCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN 17 EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 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- 27 any school-authorized sport or activity sanctioned by the

- 29 (c) "Appropriate documentation" means:
- 30 (i) The results of a nationally recognized
- 31 standardized test or its equivalent as determined by the State
- 32 Department of Education;
- 33 (ii) A portfolio of the student's school work from
- 34 the previous year demonstrating the student's proficiency
- 35 appropriate for the student's grade level, as determined in the
- 36 discretion of the school principal or counselor; or
- 37 (iii) If the student was enrolled in a public,
- 38 private, parochial or charter school during the preceding school
- 39 year, records evidencing the student's eligibility based on the
- 40 student's academic success at that school.
- 41 (3) (a) A student enrolled in a homeschool is eligible to
- 42 participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities
- 43 sponsored or engaged in by the public school to which the student
- 44 would be assigned according to the attendance policies adopted by
- 45 the school board of the local school district. A homeschool
- 46 student who leaves a public school during the school year is
- 47 subject to the transfer protocols that apply to transfers from one
- 48 (1) public school to another public school. A student who is
- 49 eligible under this section and selected to participate in an
- 50 extracurricular activity must:

51	(i) Pay any participation or activity fee in an
52	amount equal to the fee charged to public school students;
53	(ii) Adhere to the same standards of behavior,
54	responsibility, performance and code of conduct as other
55	participants in the extracurricular activity;
56	(iii) Adhere to the same academic standards as
57	other participants, with those standards confirmed by appropriate
58	documentation provided by the student to the public school
59	providing the extracurricular activity in which the student
60	participates. A parent or other person acting in place of a
61	parent to a homeschool student participating in the
62	extracurricular activity periodically must provide, in accordance
63	with the school's grading calendar, verification to the school
64	indicating that the student is receiving a passing grade in each
65	course or subject being taught;
66	(iv) Register with the school the student's intent
67	to participate in the extracurricular activity as a representative
68	of the school before the beginning date of the semester during
69	which the extracurricular activity in which the student wishes to
70	participate is offered; and
71	(v) Comply with the same physical examination,
72	immunization, insurance, age and semester eligibility requirements
73	as other students participating in the extracurricular activity.

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- 76 extracurricular activities is the responsibility of the parent,
- 77 guardian or student. The student may use the same transportation
- 78 as other students so long as additional expenses are not incurred
- 79 by the school district.
- 80 (c) In selecting the members of an interscholastic
- 81 extracurricular team, a public school may not discriminate against
- 82 a student being educated in a homeschool who is eligible to
- 83 participate in an interscholastic extracurricular activity under
- 84 this section.
- 85 (4) Participation in an interscholastic extracurricular
- 86 activity is a privilege and not a right. This act may not be
- 87 interpreted to create a cause of action on behalf of a student
- 88 against a public school or public school district official or
- 89 against an interscholastic extracurricular activities association.
- 90 (5) With respect to a homeschool student's education
- 91 program, this section may not be construed to permit an agency of
- 92 the state, a public school district or any other governmental body
- 93 to exercise control, regulatory authority or supervision over a
- 94 homeschool student or parent or person acting in place of a parent
- 95 to a homeschool student beyond that which is required to
- 96 participate in league activity.
- 97 (6) (a) A school district may apply to the State Department
- 98 of Education for additional funding to cover the cost of any
- 99 homeschool students participating in extracurricular activities.

- 103 (c) The application must include the number of
 104 homeschool students participating in extracurricular activities in
 105 the prior school year, the activities in which the homeschool
 106 students participated, and such other information that is required
 107 by the department.
- 108 There is established a special fund within the (7) (a) 109 State Department of Education to be known as the "Homeschool 110 Extracurricular Activity Fund." A school district may apply for 111 and receive funds under this subsection in the amount of Two 112 Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$2,250.00) for each homeschool student who participated in extracurricular activities in the 113 114 prior school year. The State Department of Education shall make 115 distributions from the Homeschool Extracurricular Activity Fund. 116 If at any time the fund is exhausted, disbursements must be made by the department from any other available funds that may be used, 117 118 in the determination of the department, for such purposes.
- 119 (b) This subsection may not be construed to require a 120 school district to request funding.
- (c) The State Department of Education shall report disbursements made pursuant to this subsection to the Office of the State Auditor, on a form created by the Office of the State Auditor, on July 1, 2025, and every two (2) years thereafter.
