1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-27-14, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE ELEMENTS AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE CRIMES 3 OF EXPOSING ANOTHER TO CONTAGIOUS DISEASES AND ENDANGERMENT BY 4 BODILY SUBSTANCE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 97-27-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 97-27-14. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to *** * *** 8 9 intentionally transmit an infectious disease to another 10 person * * *. Prior knowledge and willing consent to * * * exposure to an infectious disease is a defense to a charge brought 11 12 under this subsection. * * * In addition, taking precautions to prevent transmission, including, but not limited to, viral 13 14 suppression and the use of personal protective equipment, is a defense to a charge brought under this subsection. 15 (2) (a) A person commits the crime of endangerment by 16 17 bodily substance if the person attempts to * * * knowingly * * * transmit an infectious disease to a corrections employee, a 18

(b) As used in this subsection, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

(i) "Corrections employee" means a person who is
an employee or contracted employee of a subcontractor of a
department or agency responsible for operating a jail, prison,
correctional facility or a person who is assigned to work in a
jail, prison or correctional facility.

(ii) "Offender" means a person who is in thecustody of the Department of Corrections.

31 (iii) "Prisoner" means a person confined in a32 county or city jail.

34 (3) For purposes of this section, the term "infectious
35 disease" means a disease potentially caused by a pathogenic
36 organism which is acquired by a person and reproduces in that

imprisonment in the county jail for up to one (1) year and may be
fined One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or both.
