HOUSE BILL NO. 1304

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-1-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THE COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE TO ADOPT 3 RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE GRADING, BY AN OFFICIAL INSPECTOR, OF ANY GRAIN SUBMITTED FOR SALE AT ANY ELEVATOR OR 4 5 GRAIN DEALER BY A GRAIN PRODUCER; TO REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI 6 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE TO ADOPT RULES GOVERNING 7 THE STANDARDS FOR SAMPLING AND GRADING GRAIN THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE STANDARDS FOR SAMPLING AND GRADING GRAIN DEVELOPED BY THE 8 9 UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO CERTIFY GRAIN DEALERS AND COURSES OF INSTRUCTION IN SAMPLING 10 11 AND GRADING GRAIN; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE FOR 12 INDIVIDUALS CONDUCTING COURSES IN SAMPLING AND GRADING GRAIN; AND 13 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 15 SECTION 1. Section 69-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 16 amended as follows:

17 69-1-23. (1) For purposes of this section, the following

- terms shall have the meanings ascribed in this section unless the 18
- 19 context clearly requires otherwise:
- (a) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of 20
- 21 Agriculture and Commerce.
- 22 (b) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 23 Agriculture and Commerce.

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24 (c) "Grain dealer" means any person engaged in the 25 business of buying grain from producers thereof for resale or for 26 milling or processing. A producer of grain buying grain for his 27 own use as seed or feed shall not be considered as being engaged 28 in the business of buying grain for resale or for milling or 29 processing. 30 "Person" means any person, firm, association or (d) 31 corporation. 32 (e) "Producer" means a farmer who grows grain and 33 delivers to a grain dealer. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 34 (* * *2) Commerce is hereby designated as the official inspection agency 35 within the State of Mississippi, or for a company domiciled in the 36 37 State of Mississippi, to certify to producers, shippers, and other financially interested parties the grade, quality, or condition of 38 39 grain crops. Grain crops for the purpose of this chapter shall be 40 those crops for which standards have been established under the United States Grain Standards Act; namely, wheat, oats, corn, 41 42 barley, rye, flaxseed, soybeans, grain sorghum, and mixed grains 43 and other crops for which standards may hereafter be established. 44 (* * *3) The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 45 Commerce shall have the sole authority to recommend to the United States Department of Agriculture the licensing of inspectors for 46 47 the purpose of carrying out the inspection, grading and certification of grain inspection under the United States 48

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49 Department of Agriculture Grain Standards Act, except that those 50 persons already licensed as of this date under any other authority 51 may continue to operate in their respective designated areas.

52 Within the parameters of his or her authority to (* * * 4)53 administer the provisions of subsection (5) the Commissioner of 54 Agriculture and Commerce shall adopt rules and regulations to provide that any grain producer, submitting grain for sale at any 55 56 elevator or grain dealer in the state, shall be entitled to have 57 that grain graded by an official inspector. The grain producer 58 shall be responsible for and shall pay the cost of grading such 59 sample.

60 (5) (a) The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 61 Commerce shall adopt rules governing the standards for sampling 62 and grading grain which are consistent with the standards for 63 sampling and grading grain developed by the United States 64 Department of Agriculture. 65 The department or its designee shall certify: (b) 66 (i) Grain dealers that employ grain samplers and 67 graders; and 68 (ii) Courses of instruction in the methods of 69 sampling and grading grain. 70 (C) The department or its designee shall issue a 71 certificate to a grain dealer who conducts a course of instruction 72 for sampling and grading grain that is satisfactory to the 73 department.

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74 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 75 and after July 1, 2024.
