## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1449

- AN ACT TO CREATE A STUDY COMMITTEE TO DETERMINE THE
  FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING AND ADMINISTERING A UNIVERSAL

  BUUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP ACCOUNTS (ESA) PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS IN
  KINDERGARTEN THROUGH GRADE 12, FOR PURPOSES OF PROVIDING FINANCIAL
  SUPPORT FOR ELIGIBLE EXPENSES RELATED TO EDUCATIONAL SERVICES,
  INSTRUCTION AND NEEDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMPOSITION OF THE STUDY
  COMMITTEE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is created a study committee to
- 10 determine the feasibility of establishing and administering a
- 11 universal educational scholarship accounts (ESA) program for
- 12 students in kindergarten through Grade 12, for purposes of
- 13 providing financial support for eligible expenses related to
- 14 educational services, instruction and needs.
- The committee shall, at a minimum, study and report to the
- 16 2025 Regular Session of the Legislature the following:
- 17 (a) The viability of an ESA system that is inclusive of
- 18 all students;

19 (	b)	The	costs	for	imple	ementation	of	a	universal	ESA
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- 20 program based on initial enrollment and projected enrollment of
- 21 students into the program;
- 22 (c) The impact of a universal ESA program on the
- 23 existing adequate education program funding or any newly developed
- 24 equitable funding formula; and
- 25 (d) Any potential constitutional or legal implications
- 26 created by the establishment of a universal ESA program.
- 27 (2) The Study Committee shall be composed of the following
- 28 seven (7) members:
- 29 (a) Two (2) members appointed by the Speaker of the
- 30 House, one (1) of whom shall be the Chairman of the House
- 31 Education Committee;
- 32 (b) Two (2) members appointed by the Lieutenant
- 33 Governor, one (1) of whom shall be the Chairman of the Senate
- 34 Education Committee; and
- 35 (c) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor from
- 36 the state at large, as follows:
- 37 (i) One (1) of whom shall be a superintendent of a
- 38 public school district;
- 39 (ii) One (1) of whom shall be a representative of
- 40 a private school under the governing authority of the Mississippi
- 41 Association of Independent Schools; and
- 42 (iii) One (1) of whom shall be a representative of

43 the state's business community.

- 44 (3) Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after
- 45 the effective date of this act. The committee shall hold its
- 46 first meeting before August 1, 2024, with the date, time and
- 47 location of the meeting to be designated by the Governor. At that
- 48 first meeting, the committee shall elect an individual to serve as
- 49 chairman of the study committee. A majority of the members of the
- 50 committee shall constitute a quorum. In the adoption of the
- 51 rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority
- of the members shall be required. All members shall be notified
- 53 in writing of all meetings, such notices shall be mailed at least
- 54 five (5) days before the date on which a meeting is to be held.
- 55 (4) Members of the task force shall receive no compensation
- 56 for their service on the task force, but may receive reimbursement
- 57 for mileage and actual expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41,
- 58 Mississippi Code of 1972, to the extent that funds are available
- 59 for that purpose.
- 60 (5) To effectuate the purposes of this section, any
- 61 department, division, board, bureau, committee or agency of the
- 62 state or any political subdivision thereof, shall, at the request
- 63 of any member of the committee, provide such facilities,
- 64 assistance, information and data as will enable the committee to
- 65 properly carry out its duties.
- 66 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2024.
