HOUSE BILL NO. 1472

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A VIOLATION RELATING TO THE RELOCATION, REMOVAL, 3 DISTURBING, ALTERING, RENAMING OR REDEDICATING OF A HISTORICAL 4 MONUMENT BY A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF 5 \$10,000.00 PER MONTH ON SUCH COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY UNTIL THE 6 VIOLATION IS FULLY CORRECTED; TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES COLLECTED 7 FROM SUCH FINES SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF ARCHIVES AND HISTORY; TO PROVIDE THAT ANY INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP 8 9 OF INDIVIDUALS THAT DISTURBS, ALTERS, OR CAUSES ANY DAMAGE TO ANY 10 STATUE, MONUMENT, MEMORIAL OR NAMEPLATE AS PROVIDED IN THIS 11 SECTION IS GUILTY OF MALICIOUS MISCHIEF AND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE 12 FOR ALL COSTS TO REPAIR AND RESTORE SUCH DAMAGED PROPERTY; AND FOR 13 RELATED PURPOSES.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 15 SECTION 1. Section 55-15-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

16 amended as follows:

17 55-15-81. (1) None of the following items, structures or areas may be relocated, removed, disturbed, altered, renamed or 18 19 rededicated: any Revolutionary War, War of 1812, Mexican-American War, War Between the States, Spanish-American War, World War I, 20 21 World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War, War in 22 Iraq * * *, Native American * * * War, or any other military 23 conflict, as well as any Native American, Civil Rights Movement,

24 firefighters, first responders, or law enforcement's statues, 25 monuments, memorials or nameplates (plaques), which have been 26 erected on public property of the state or any of its political subdivisions, such as local, municipal or county owned public 27 28 areas, and any statues, monuments, memorials, nameplates 29 (plaques), schools, streets, bridges, buildings, parks preserves, reserves or other public items, structure or areas of the state or 30 31 any of its political subdivisions, such as, local, municipal or 32 county owned public areas, which has been dedicated in memory of, 33 or named for, any historical military figure, historical military event, military organization or military unit, as well as any 34 35 historical nonmilitary figure, historical nonmilitary event, or 36 historical organization or historical group of civic-minded 37 people.

38 (2) No person may prevent the public body responsible for 39 maintaining any of the items, structures or areas described above 40 from taking proper measures and exercising proper means for the 41 protection, preservation, care, repair or restoration of those 42 items, structures or areas. The governing body may move the 43 memorial to a more suitable location if it is determined that the 44 location is more appropriate to displaying the monument.

49 facilities, the State of Mississippi shall arrange for the 50 relocation of effected items or structures to a place of equal 51 prominence and accept all related costs and liability. 52 (4) Any violation of this section by a county or 53 municipality is punishable by a fine in the amount of Ten Thousand 54 Dollars (\$10,000.00) per month on such county or municipality 55 until the violation is fully corrected. Monies collected from 56 such fines shall be distributed to the Mississippi Department of 57 Archives and History. 58 (5) Any individual or group of individuals that disturbs, 59 alters, or causes any damage to any statue, monument, memorial or 60 nameplate (plaque) as provided in this section is quilty of 61 malicious mischief under Section 97-17-67. 62 Additionally, any individual or group of individuals found 63 guilty of damaging any statue, monument, memorial, or nameplate 64 (plaque) as provided in this section shall be responsible for all 65 costs to repair and restore such damaged property. 66 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

67 and after July 1, 2024.
