HOUSE BILL NO. 1619

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-3-31 AND 5-1-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE 2 OF 1972, TO MAKE NONSUBSTANTIVE CHANGES TO THE SALARY SCHEDULES OF 3 CERTAIN STATEWIDE OFFICIALS; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 5-1-51, 5-1-41, 5-1-45, 5-1-46 AND 5-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH 4 PROVIDES FOR THE COMPENSATION OF LEGISLATORS, FOR PURPOSES OF 5 6 AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 8 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 9 10 * * * 11 25-3-31. (1) The annual salaries of the following elected state and district officers are fixed as follows: 12 Governor.....\$ 160,000.00 13 Attorney General..... 150,000.00 14 15 Secretary of State..... 120,000.00 16 Commissioner of Insurance..... 150,000.00

32 SECTION 2. Section 5-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 33 amended as follows:

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5-1-43. (1) The salary of the Lieutenant Governor and of the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be Eighty-five Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00) annually, and they shall receive for attending each extraordinary or called session the same compensation and mileage as is provided for members of the Legislature.

(2) On the first day of each month, the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall receive in twelve (12) equal monthly installments the compensation provided for pursuant to subsection (1) of this section.

47 The mileage and one-third (1/3) of the salary for a 5-1-51. regular session shall be paid at the beginning of the session. 48 49 After thirty (30) days of the session have expired, another 50 one-third (1/3) of the salary shall be paid. The remaining one-third (1/3) of the salary shall be paid (a) on the last Friday 51 before the ninetieth day of a ninety-day session, or (b) on the 52 53 earlier of the last day the Legislature is convened or the last 54 Friday before the one-hundred-twenty-fifth day of a 55 one-hundred-twenty-five-day session, as the case may be.

56 SECTION 4. Section 5-1-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 57 brought forward as follows:

58 5-1-41. Beginning with the 1986 Regular Session of the Legislature of the State of Mississippi, each Senator and 59 60 Representative of the Legislature shall receive as compensation at 61 each regular session the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the mileage allowance provided by Section 25-3-41, for each 62 63 mile of the distance by the most direct route usually traveled in 64 coming to and returning from the place where the Legislature sits. 65 Beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative shall 66 receive for attending each extraordinary session or called session the sum of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per day and mileage at 67 68 the same rate as per regular session. In addition to the above, beginning on April 16, 1997, each Senator and Representative and 69

78 SECTION 5. Section 5-1-45, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
79 brought forward as follows:

5-1-45. Beginning on June 4, 1997, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall receive an annual salary in an amount equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The salary provided for the President Pro Tempore under this section shall be in addition to the compensation and expense allowance established for members of the Legislature under Section 5-1-41.

86 SECTION 6. Section 5-1-46, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
87 brought forward as follows:

5-1-46. Beginning on June 4, 1997, the Speaker Pro Tempore of the House of Representatives shall receive an annual salary in an amount equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The salary provided for the Speaker Pro Tempore under this section shall be in addition to the compensation and expense allowance established for members of the Legislature under Section 5-1-41.

5 - 1 - 47. (1) 96 In addition to the regular salary and mileage 97 provided by law, an expense allowance equal to the maximum daily 98 expense rate allowable to employees of the federal government for 99 travel in the high rate geographical area of Jackson, Mississippi, 100 as may be established by federal regulations for each legislative 101 day in actual attendance at a session shall be paid to the 102 Lieutenant Governor and members of the Senate and House of 103 Representatives, together with an additional mileage allowance as provided by Section 25-3-41, for each mile of the distance by the 104 105 most direct route usually traveled in coming to and returning from 106 the place where the Legislature is in session, which expense 107 allowance and additional mileage allowance shall be paid at the end of each seven-day period while the Legislature is in session. 108

(2) In addition to the mileage allowance provided for in subsection (1) of this section, an expense allowance equal to the maximum daily expense rate allowable to employees of the federal government for travel in the high rate geographical area of Jackson, Mississippi, as may be established by federal regulations, per day, shall be paid to:

(a) The Lieutenant Governor and members of the Senate,
upon the approval of the Senate Rules Committee, for attending to
legislative duties on any of the following days that the Senate
does not convene in session on that day: (i) any day between

125 Members of the House of Representatives, upon the (b) 126 approval of the House Management Committee, for attending to 127 legislative duties on any of the following days that the House does not convene in session on that day: (i) any day between 128 129 legislative regular or extraordinary sessions, or (ii) any day of 130 a legislative regular session that has been extended beyond the 131 number of calendar days specified in Section 36, Mississippi 132 Constitution of 1890, when that day falls after the ninetieth or one-hundred-twenty-fifth day of the session, as the case may be, 133 134 or (iii) any day during a legislative extraordinary session.

135 The expense allowance and additional mileage allowance (3)provided by this section for the Lieutenant Governor and members 136 137 of the Senate shall be paid from the appropriate legislative fund 138 of the Senate as provided by law, and the expense allowance and 139 additional mileage allowance for members of the House of 140 Representatives shall be paid from the appropriate legislative fund of the House of Representatives as provided by law, upon 141 warrants drawn for such purpose in the manner provided by law. 142

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143 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 144 and after July 1, 2024.
