HOUSE BILL NO. 1776 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 2 THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ARCHIVES AND HISTORY, FOR THE 3 FISCAL YEAR 2025. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 7 Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Department of Archives and History for the fiscal 8 9 year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 12,580,718.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in 12 the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Archives and 13 14 History which is comprised of special source funds collected by or 15 otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of 16 defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025..... 17\$ 26,678,000.00. 18

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19 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 20 this act, the following positions are authorized:

21 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

22 Permanent: 155

23 Time-Limited: 10

24 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 25 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 26 27 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 28 29 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 30 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 31 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 32 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 33 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 34 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that 35 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 36 37 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 38 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 39 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 40 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to

If 46 the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the 47 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 48 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 49 essential for the agency.

50 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 51 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 52 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 53 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 54 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 55 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 56 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 57 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 58 appropriated level.

59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 61 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 62 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

67 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 68 Department of Archives and History shall maintain complete

No. 1776 *** OFFICIAL ~** 24/HR31/A475SG PAGE 3 69 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 70 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 71 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 72 Year 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 73 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be 74 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 75 76 provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.

77 SECTION 5. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 78 Mississippi Department of Archives and History shall charge the 79 maximum amount allowable for services rendered, consistent with 80 the cost of providing such services. The funds derived from these 81 charges shall be deposited into a special fund account in the 82 State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of 83 Archives and History.

84 SECTION 6. It is the intent of the Legislature that no part 85 of the funds herein appropriated shall be required to be used for 86 the payment of rent for the museum and public space in the State 87 Historical Museum, Old Capitol Restoration.

88 SECTION 7. Of the funds provided in Section 2, Two Million 89 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) is provided to the Department of Archives 90 and History from the Mississippi Landmark Grant Fund in accordance 91 with Section 39-5-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, to help support 92 the preservation of Mississippi Landmark Properties.

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93 SECTION 8. Of the funds provided under the provisions of 94 this act, One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the purpose of capital development and maintenance of Beauvoir 95 Shrine, the last home of Jefferson Davis, the only President of 96 the Confederate States of America, subject to approval by the 97 98 Department of Archives and History. The expenditure of funds 99 available in this section shall be subject to prior approval by 100 the Department of Archives and History.

101 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 102 103 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 104 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 105 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 106 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 107 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 108 made without competitive bids.

109 SECTION 10. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 110 111 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 112 Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of Archives and 113 History for the purpose of supporting the Statewide Oral History 114 Project for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending 115 June 30, 2025.....\$ 50,000.00. 116 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

117 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with

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Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

123 SECTION 12. Of the funds provided in Section 2, Seven 124 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) is provided from 125 Special Funds in the State Treasury to the credit of the State 126 Treasury fund created in Section 27-19-56.69(8), Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of paying the costs of repair and 127 renovation of the New Capitol, the Old Capitol, the Governor's 128 129 Mansion, and the War Memorial Building, in accordance with rules 130 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in 131 a manner consistent with the escalation of funds.

132 **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 133 of Section 2, Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00), or so much 134 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 135 136 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as 137 determined by the Treasurer's Office. This appropriation is made 138 to provide the funds necessary to authorize the expenditure of 139 funds for the Vicksburg Military Park Interpretive Center. As a 140 condition of expending these funds, the department shall enter into a memorandum of agreement or similar document with the U.S. 141 Government National Park Services reflecting a plan for building 142

145 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or so much 146 147 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury 148 to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as 149 150 determined by the Treasurer's Office. This appropriation is made 151 to provide the funds necessary to authorize the expenditure of 152 funds for the Crigler Park project.

153 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00), or so much 154 155 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury 156 to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 157 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as 158 determined by the Treasurer's Office. This appropriation is made 159 to provide the funds necessary to authorize the expenditure of 160 funds for Grand Village in Natchez.

SECTION 16. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of Archives and History for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in HB 1612, 2023 Regular Session to defray expenses of the Department of

185 sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out 186 of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the 187 Mississippi Historic Site Preservation Fund, for the purpose of 188 making grants to nonprofit organizations in accordance with 189 Section 39-5-22, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year 190 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025...... 191\$ 500,000.00.

Of the funds provided in Section 2, the 193 following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit 194 195 of the Mississippi Community Heritage Preservation Grant Fund, for 196 the purpose of grant assistance to Historic County Courthouses, 197 School Buildings and Other Historic Buildings as in Section 39-5-145, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning 198 July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....\$ 199 5,000,000.00. 200 SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Sixteen Thousand Dollars (\$16,000.00), or so much thereof as may be 201 202 necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury 203 to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Senate Bill 204 2001, 1st Extraordinary Session of 2024, and allocated in a manner 205 as determined by the Treasurer's Office and Sixteen Thousand 206 Dollars (\$16,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, 207 shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the 208 credit of the Project Atlas Fund, as created in House Bill 1, 2nd 209 Extraordinary Session of 2024, and allocated in a manner as 210 determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for 211 expediting services needed for Project Poppy and Project Atlas.

SECTION 20. The Mississippi Department of Archives and History is authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or contribution from any individual, public, or private organization, or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational costs of the department. Such grants, donations or contributions

221 SECTION 21. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 222 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 223 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 224 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 225 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 226 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 227 SECTION 22. This act shall take effect and be in force from 228 and after July 1, 2024.
