## HOUSE BILL NO. 1780

2 3	MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
10	\$ 15,729,963.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025 \$ 12,603,954.00.

18	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
19	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
20	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
21	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
22	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
23	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
24	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
25	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
26	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
27	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
28	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
29	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
30	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
31	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
32	this act, the following positions are authorized:

36	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
37	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
38	Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
39	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
40	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
41	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal
42	services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall

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43	publish.	Ιn	accordance	with	applicable	laws,	if	an	agency
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- 44 determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the
- 45 agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to
- 46 the personal services amount must be approved by the State
- 47 Personnel Director and the State Fiscal Officer after consultation
- 48 with the Legislative Budget Office. Any adjustment shall be
- 49 reported to the Legislative Budget Office and the House and Senate
- 50 Appropriations Chairmen. The agency's personal services
- 51 appropriation may consist of restricted funds for approved
- 52 vacancies for Fiscal Year 2025 that may not be utilized for active
- 53 Fiscal Year 2024 headcount. It shall be the agency's
- 54 responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are
- 55 used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes,
- 56 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 57 salaries for current employees. If the State Personnel Board
- 58 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any
- 59 of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board
- 60 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in
- the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the 61
- 62 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the
- 63 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the
- 64 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel
- Board. 65

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- 66 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 67 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current

- 68 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 69 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do
- 70 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 71 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the
- 72 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 73 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 74 essential for the agency.
- 75 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 76 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 77 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 78 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 79 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 80 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 81 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 82 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 83 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 85 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 86 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 87 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 89 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 90 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 91 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

92	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
93	State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
94	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
95	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
96	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
97	2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
98	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to
99	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
100	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
101	during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.
102	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
103	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
104	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
105	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
106	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
107	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
108	performance measures provided below:

130	SECTION 6. There is created in the State Treasu	ary a fund
131	designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment	Conversion
132	Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commi	ssion to

The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and services performed for volunteer fire departments by the State Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire

Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not
exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of
Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State
Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies
in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and
shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

SECTION 7. There is created in the State Treasury a fund
designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by
the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
and regeneration work.

100	The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by
167	monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.
168	Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into
169	the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
170	make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
171	and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
172	upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
173	Finance and Administration

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It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future vears.

180 Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the SECTION 8. 181 intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 182 (\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of 183 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication 184 Program during the Fiscal Year 2025.

SECTION 9. Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.

188 It is the intention of the Legislature that SECTION 10. 189 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 190

191	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
192	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
193	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
194	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
195	made without competitive bids.
196	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
197	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
198	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
199	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
200	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
201	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
202	actions contrary to this provision.
203	SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
204	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
205	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
206	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
207	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
208	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
209	SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from
210	and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2024.
