1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2025.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the Mississippi Public Service Commission for the
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
10	\$ 4,918,797.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Public Service
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025
18	\$ 464,494.00.

20	Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized:

24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
26	Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds
27	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
28	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi
29	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal
30	services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board shall
31	publish. In accordance with applicable laws, if an agency
32	determines that its personal services amount is insufficient, the
33	agency must contact the State Personnel Board. Any adjustment to
34	the personal services amount must be approved by the State

If the State Personnel Board 45 determines that an agency has used provided vacancy funds for any 46 of the mechanisms previously listed, the State Personnel Board 47 48 shall not process any additional salary actions for the agency in 49 the current fiscal year, except for new hires determined by the 50 State Personnel Board to be essential for the agency. It is the 51 Legislature's intention that no employee salary falls below the 52 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel 53
- 54 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 55 56 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 57 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do 58 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 59 the agency's projected cost for Fiscal Year 2025 exceeds the 60 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 61 62 essential for the agency.
- 63 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 64 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 65 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 66 67 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 68

72	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
73	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
74	salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are

76	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
77	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
78	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
79	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
80	SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
81	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
82	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
83	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
84	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
85	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

135	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the	
136	Public Service Commission shall maintain complete accounting and	
137	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds	
138	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the	
139	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year	
140	2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the	
141	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to	
142	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of	

143 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 144 during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Public Service Commission shall compile the amount of time that is expended on each regulated entity during Fiscal Year 2024. before August 1, 2024, the Public Service Commission shall report these findings to the House of Representatives' Public Utilities Committee.

The money herein appropriated shall be paid by SECTION 9. the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 10. 165 This act shall take effect and be in force from 166 and after July 1, 2024, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2024.
