HOUSE BILL NO. 1825 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 2 MAINTENANCE OF THE MISSISSIPPI LIBRARY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL 3 YEAR 2025. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General 6 7 Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Mississippi Library Commission and for carrying out the 8 provisions of Section 39-3-107, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the 9 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025 10\$ 11,126,235.00. 11 12 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 13 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in 14 the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Library Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by 15 16 or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year 17 18 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025.....

20 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
21 this act, the following positions are authorized:

22 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

23 Permanent: 4824 Time-Limited: 1

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 25 26 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 27 Services for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2025 funds 28 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 29 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 budget by the Mississippi 30 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 31 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 32 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 33 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 34 2025 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2024 35 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 36 37 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 38 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 39 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 40 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 41 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

42 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 43 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current

It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2025 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2025 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 51 52 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 53 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 55 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 59 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

68 SECTION 4. Funds to be distributed to eligible public 69 library systems under the Personnel Incentive Grants Program shall 70 be paid quarterly in advance on or before September 30, December 71 31, March 31 and June 30.

72 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 73 Mississippi Library Commission shall maintain complete accounting 74 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 75 76 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 77 2024. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 78 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2026 shall be submitted to 79 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 80 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2025 budget request process. 81

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Four Hundred Ninety-three Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-seven Dollars (\$493,847.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

87 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 88 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 89 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 90 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 91 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

117 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 118 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 119 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 120 Committee for Fiscal Year 2026.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that no less than One Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,350,000.00) shall be expended for the Magnolia Database.

124 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Three 125 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) or so much thereof as 126 may be necessary, is derived from the Education Enhancement Fund 127 pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 128 1972, for MAGNOLIA.

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated herein, Four Million Five Hundred Eighty-four Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-nine Dollars (\$4,584,389.00) is provided for the cost of health insurance for all full-time library staff members in each public library in Mississippi.

134 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that 135 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 136 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 137 138 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 139 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 140 141 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

149 **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 150 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 151 152 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 153 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 154 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 155 SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from 156 and after July 1, 2024.
