- 3 WHEREAS, the Second Amendment of the United States
- 4 Constitution reads "A well regulated Militia, being necessary to
- 5 the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and
- 6 bear Arms, shall not be infringed."; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in District of
- 8 Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), affirmed an individual's
- 9 right to possess firearms, unconnected with service in a militia,
- 10 for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the
- 11 home; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in McDonald v.
- 13 Chicago, 561 U.S. 742 (2010), affirmed that the right of an
- 14 individual to "keep and bear arms," as protected under the Second
- 15 Amendment, is incorporated by the Due Process Clause of the

- 16 Fourteenth Amendment against the states; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in United States v.
- 18 Miller, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), opined that firearms that are part of

19 ordinary military equipment, or with use that could contribute to 20 the common defense are protected by the Second Amendment; and WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 12, of the Constitution of the 21 State of Mississippi provides "The right of every citizen to keep 22 23 and bear arms in defense of his home, person, or property, or in 24 aid of the civil power when thereto legally summoned, shall not be called in question, but the Legislature may regulate or forbid 25 26 carrying concealed weapons."; and 27 WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi reads "That all men are by nature equally 28 29 free and independent and have certain inherent rights, of which, 30 when they enter into the state of society, they cannot, by any 31 compact, deprive or divest their posterity; namely, the enjoyment of life and liberty, with the means of acquiring and possessing 32 33 property, and pursuing and obtaining happiness and safety."; and 34 WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 14 of the Constitution of the 35 State of Mississippi reads "No person shall be deprived of life, liberty, or property except by due process of law."; and 36 37 WHEREAS, certain legislation which has or may be introduced 38 in the United States Congress could have the effect of infringing 39 on the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, as quaranteed by the Second Amendment to the United States 40 Constitution and Article 3, Section 12 of the Constitution of the 41

State of Mississippi; and

45	infringing the rights of the citizens of the State of Mississippi
46	to keep and bear arms; and
47	WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express its deep
48	commitment to the rights of all citizens of Mississippi to keep
49	and bear arms; and
50	WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express opposition to any
51	law that would unconstitutionally restrict the rights of the
52	citizens of Mississippi to keep and bear arms; and
53	WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to express its intent to
54	stand as a Sanctuary State for Second Amendment rights and to
55	oppose, within the limits of the Constitution of the United States
56	and the Constitution of the State of Mississippi, any efforts to
57	unconstitutionally restrict such rights, and to use such legal
58	means at its disposal to protect the rights of the citizens of
59	Mississippi to keep and bear arms, including through legal action,
60	the power to appropriate public funds, the right to petition for
61	redress of grievances, and the power to direct the law enforcement
62	and employees of the State of Mississippi to not enforce any

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature hereby expresses
- 69 its intent to uphold the Second Amendment rights of the citizens
- 70 of Mississippi.
- 71 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature hereby expresses
- 72 its intent that public funds of the state not be used to restrict
- 73 the Second Amendment rights of the citizens of Mississippi, or to
- 74 aid federal agencies in the restriction of those rights.
- 75 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Legislature hereby declares
- 76 its intent to oppose any infringement on the right of law-abiding
- 77 citizens to keep and bear arms using such legal means as may be
- 78 expedient, including, without limitation, court action.
- 79 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
- 80 furnished to the members of the Capitol Press Corps.
