## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 21

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO SECTIONS 34
AND 35, MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON
ELECTED AS A MEMBER OF THE MISSISSIPPI HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OR
THE MISSISSIPPI SENATE IS ELIGIBLE TO SUCCEED HIMSELF OR HERSELF
IN OFFICE; TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS ELECTED AS A MEMBER OF
THE HOUSE OR THE SENATE FOR THE FIRST TIME ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1,
2025, IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO SERVE AGAIN IN THE HOUSE OR THE SENATE
AFTER SERVING THREE TERMS IN THAT OFFICE.

- 9 Amend Section 34, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 10 as follows:
- "Section 34. The Mississippi House of Representatives shall
- 12 consist of members chosen every four (4) years by the qualified
- 13 electors of the several \* \* \* districts. A person elected as a
- 14 member of the House of Representatives is eligible to succeed
- 15 himself or herself in office; however, any person who is elected
- 16 as a member of the House of Representatives for the first time on
- 17 or after January 1, 2025, is not eligible to serve again in the
- 18 House of Representatives after serving three (3) full terms. Any
- 19 years served by a member elected to fill a vacancy in office for
- 20 less than two (2) years of a term shall not be included in the
- 21 three-term limitation set forth in this section."

- 22 Amend Section 35, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 23 as follows:
- "Section 35. The Mississippi Senate shall consist of members
- 25 chosen every four (4) years by the qualified electors of the
- 26 several districts. A person elected as a member of the Senate is
- 27 eligible to succeed himself or herself in office; however, any
- 28 person who is elected as a member of the Senate for the first time
- 29 on or after January 1, 2025, is not eligible to serve again in the
- 30 Senate after serving three (3) full terms. Any years served by a
- 31 member elected to fill a vacancy in office for less than two (2)
- 32 years of a term shall not be included in the three-term limitation
- 33 set forth in this section."
- 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That these proposed amendments shall
- 35 be submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors
- 36 at an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first
- 37 Monday of November 2024, as provided by Section 273 of the
- 38 Constitution and by general law, with the amendments in this
- 39 resolution being voted on as one (1) amendment.
- 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
- 41 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- 42 constitutional amendment provides that a person who is elected as
- 43 a member of the House of Representatives or the Senate is eligible
- 44 to succeed himself or herself in office; however, a person who is
- 45 elected as a member of the House of Representatives or the Senate
- 46 for the first time on or after January 1, 2025, is not eligible to

- 47 serve again in that office after serving three (3) terms in that
- 48 office."
