HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 42

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMEMORATING
2 THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF MRS. HILDA MOORE TURNER.

3 WHEREAS, it is written in Ecclesiastes 3:1 that "To
4 everything there is a season and a time for every purpose under
5 the Heaven," and as such, on February 15, 2024, the immaculate
6 author and finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal
7 presence of dearly beloved, Mrs. Hilda Moore Turner, to eternal
8 rest, rendering great sorrow and loss to her family, friends and
9 community; and

10 WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi and the City of Fayette
11 lost a wonderful mother, grandmother, sister, friend and community
12 treasure with the passing of Mrs. Turner, who was born on June 1,
13 1944, in Fayette, Mississippi, to the late Luke and Regina Morgan
14 Moore; and

15 WHEREAS, being from a large family, she learned early the
16 great art of cooking and the high standards of work ethics, and at
17 the age of 15, Mrs. Turner left school and took on a full-time job



18 of housekeeping, which sharpened her skills of being a great wife
19 and mother; and

20 WHEREAS, on September 7, 1963, Mrs. Turner exchanged the vows
21 of holy matrimony with the love of her life, Mr. Percy Turner, and
22 "Rock," which was what she would affectionally call him and "Jo,"
23 his pet name for her, created a Christian home for their three
24 children, Vincent "Rick", Brenda and Tammie; and

25 WHEREAS, a woman of uncompromised faith, Mrs. Turner was
26 baptized at an early age at the Hollywood Baptist Church under the
27 leadership of the late Reverend M.J. Irving, and in 1990, she
28 united with the Pine Grove Baptist Church under the leadership of
29 her husband, the late Reverend Percy Turner, and she now enjoys
30 the eternal peace described in Luke 2:29, "Lord, now you are
31 letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word"; and

32 WHEREAS, Mrs. Turner blossomed as founder and President of
33 The Willing Workers and a member of the Mother Board, and for over
34 40 years, she served as the First Lady of Taylor Chapel, Pine
35 Grove, Smithland, Bethlehem, Gold Mount, Greenleaf and Shiloh
36 Baptist Churches; and

37 WHEREAS, because she was a very hard worker, Mrs. Turner
38 worked alongside her husband in the dry cleaners for many years,
39 then ITT Automotive, and finally Fleck, and in 1990, she became a
40 full-time homemaker and made her mark throughout the region with
41 her famous homemade pound cakes, and she cherished her time with
42 her family and gardening; and

44 for over 50 years, Reverend Dr. Percy Turner; her son, Vincent
45 Turner, her parents, three brothers and two sisters, the memory of
